JUNIOR STUDENT COUNCIL

The Junior Student Council is an organization which gives the students an opportunity to be active, participating citizens in the school community. First organized in 1930 as an experiment in student participation in the affairs of the school, it is now responsible for the entire activities program of the junior division of the high school.

The four officers and their assistants are elected to represent the entire student body. The councilors and alternate councilors represent each of the eighteen homerooms. At the weekly meetings, members of the council stand on their own feet and express their own opinions or those of the homerooms which they represent. After discussion of a school project or problem, action is taken by the council. The principal reserves the right to approve or veto any action of the council. Actions of the council are reported back to the weekly homeroom meetings.

The work of the council is carried on through a number of standing committees which make weekly reports to the council. This year they were the assembly, athletic, clubs, noon-hour, scholarship, sales tax stamps, school savings, and traffic committees.

Following are some of the activities of the council for this year: sponsoring of a noon-hour intramural volleyball and basketball series for both boys and girls; supervision of a school savings program; organization of a system of hall guards; collection and tabulation of sales tax stamps; granting of club charters; supervision of homeroom elections and planning of home room programs. The chief social event was a covered dish dinner and dance for members of the council and guests, Mr. Fishel, Mr. Steffen, and Mr. Williams. The culminating activity is "Awards Day", an assembly where certificates are given to students in recognition of meritorious service to the school. In cooperation with the Senior Council, the Junior Council sponsored the annual magazine drive and the election of a home-coming queen.

The council also serves as a "booster club" for all school projects such as a Junior Red Cross membership drive, donations to the Community Fund, a one-hundred per cent donation drive for the March of Dimes, and the very successful Spring Carnival.

The Quakers opened with a smashing victory over Uhrichsville, 45-0. Seven times the Quakers crossed the Uhrichsville goal line. The game turned into a rout as the Phila. line stopped the Tigers before they had a chance to get started. The results of this game gave promise of a great Quaker season.

Playing on their home field for the first time, the Quakers blasted the Coshocton Redskins 35-0. In this game the Phils put on a small but effective aerial attack. The Quaker line play was great, as the Redskins' deepest penetration was to the 20 yard line.

Again on their home field, the Quakers rolled to a 20-0 victory over the East Liverpool Potters. The Quaker offensive machine didn't hit its peak until the second half, when it scored 14 points. This was the third consecutive shutout for the Quakers.

Playing the second of the three river valley teams, the Quakers bowled over the Martins Ferry Purple Riders, 25-0. The Quakers scored only six points in the first half, but came back after the intermission to score nineteen more. This gave the Quakers their fourth shutout in as many games.

The New Philadelphia Quakers played their hearts out in one of their roughest games of the season, as they downed the powerful Timken Trojans by a score of 13-0. Two long runbacks on a pass interception and a punt return resulted in the Quaker touchdowns. The Trojans penetrated to the 7 yard stripe, where they were stopped cold by a brick wall of Quaker linemen.

REVIEWS



The undefeated Quakers scored their sixth straight shutout over the Cleveland West Cowboys by a score of 28-0. The Quakers completely dominated play in this game. The defensive unit made another outstanding contribution.

The mighty Quakers of New Philadelphia reached their season's peak as they drubbed the previously undefeated Big Red of Bellaire by a score of 34-0. Playing before a sell-out crowd of 12,000 fans, the Quakers put on a tremendous offensive and defensive show by outplaying Bellaire in every department. The Bellaire offense never penetrated beyond the Quaker 20 yard line.

The Quakers, playing an inspired Columbus East team in a frigid 28 degree temperature, were stymied. The East offense never penetrated any deeper than the 40 yard line; but their defense always stopped the Quakers when it looked as if they would score, once on the one-foot line. The great number of Quaker fumbles stopped every drive they started, and the game ended in a 0-0 tie.
