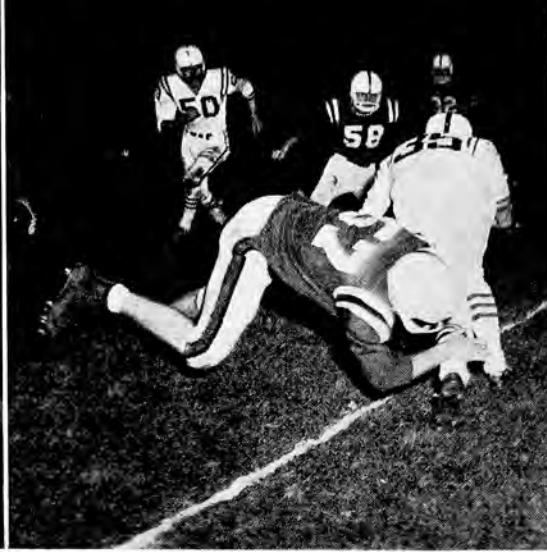

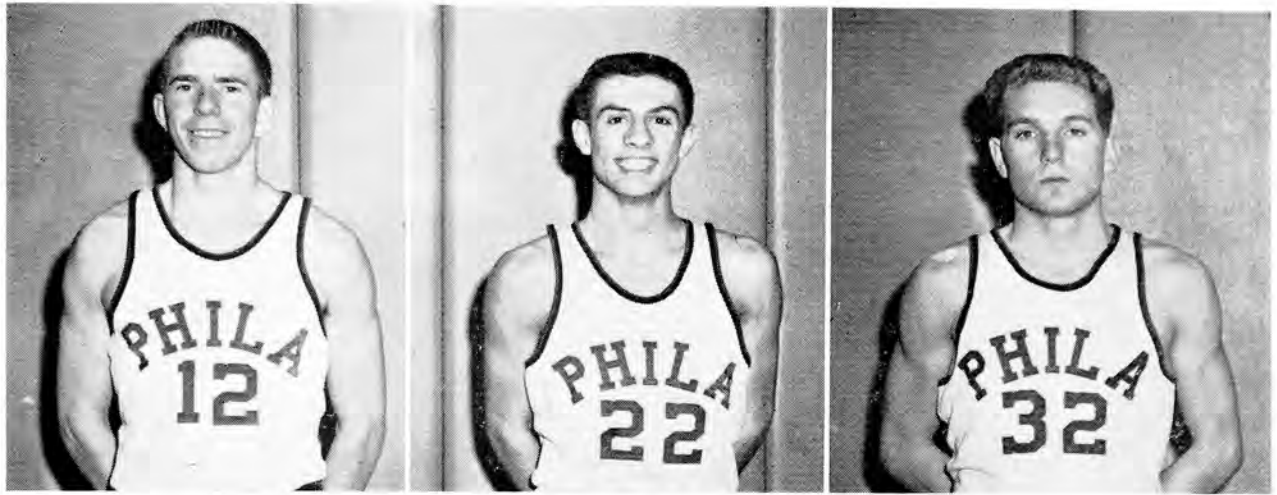

DICK TARULLI—co-captain—senior guard — a good backcourt man with great speed. Dick was always going for the ball.

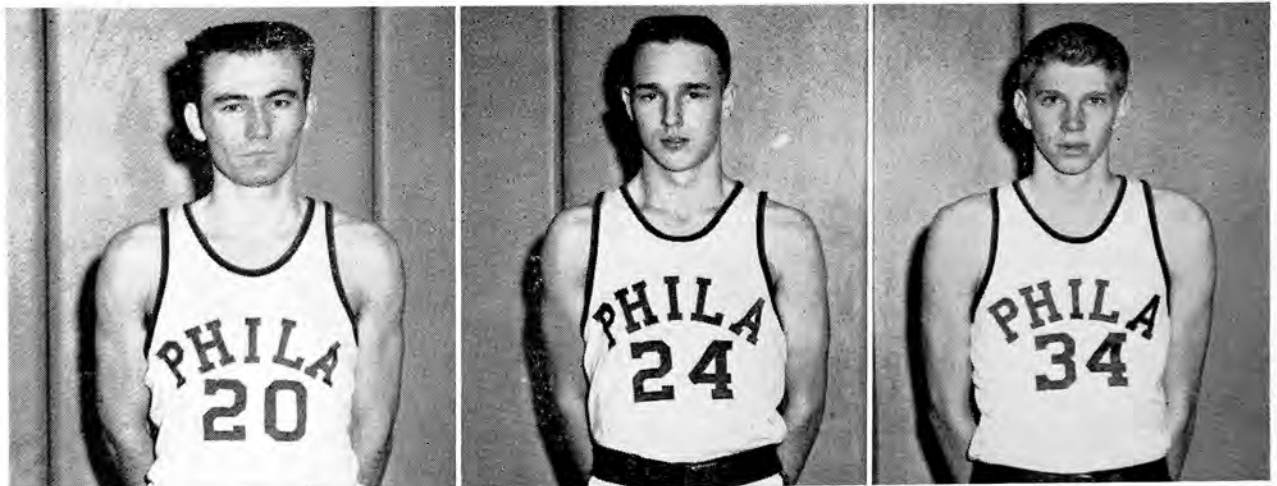
BOB EVANS—co-captain—senior forward — top rebounder with a good jump shot. He was the brains of the team. Scored 206 points for an 11.4 total.

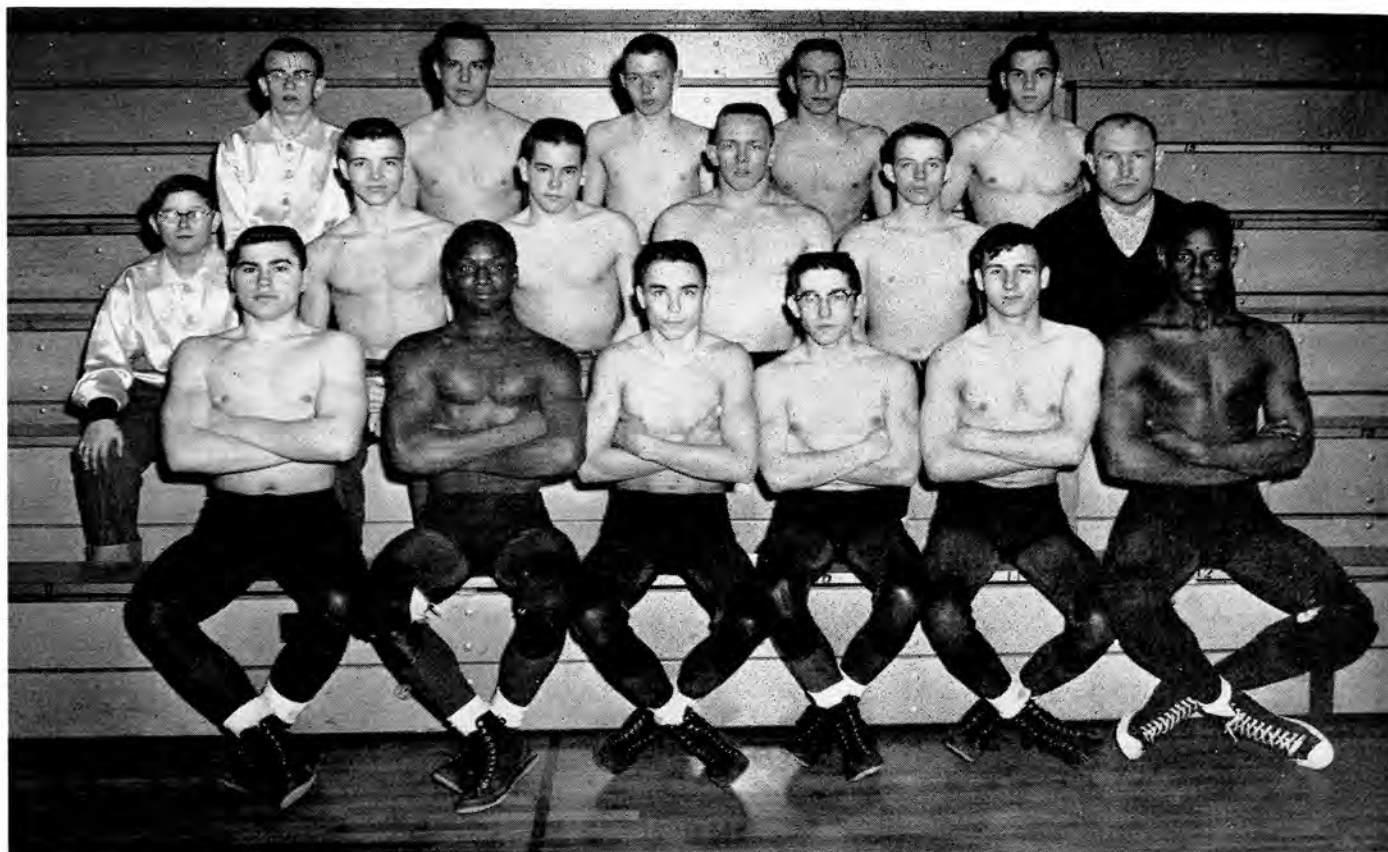
