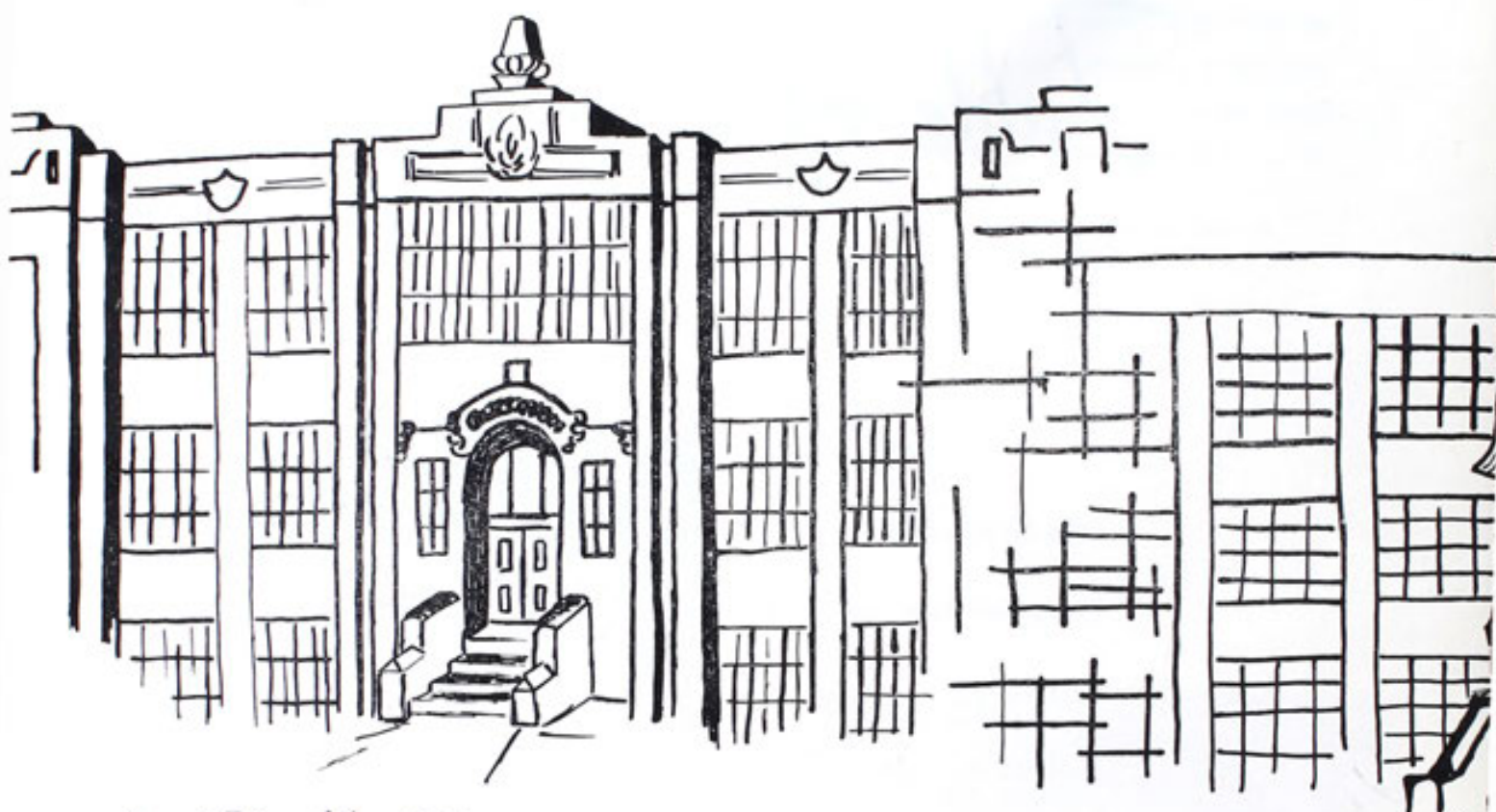

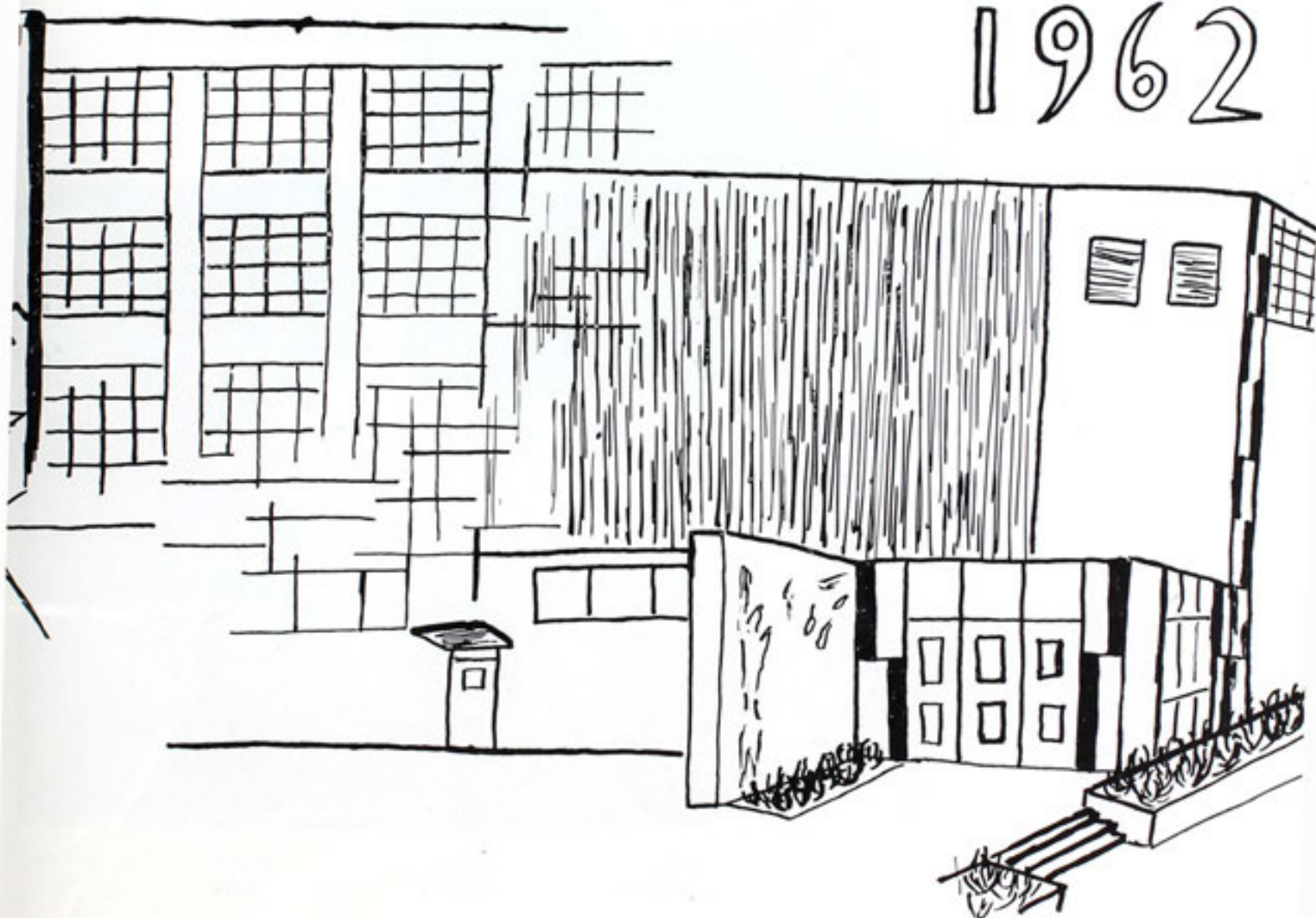
Now we must agree that the "Vision" of 1912 was good, and has been fully realized in the Delphian of 1962---the 50th volume.

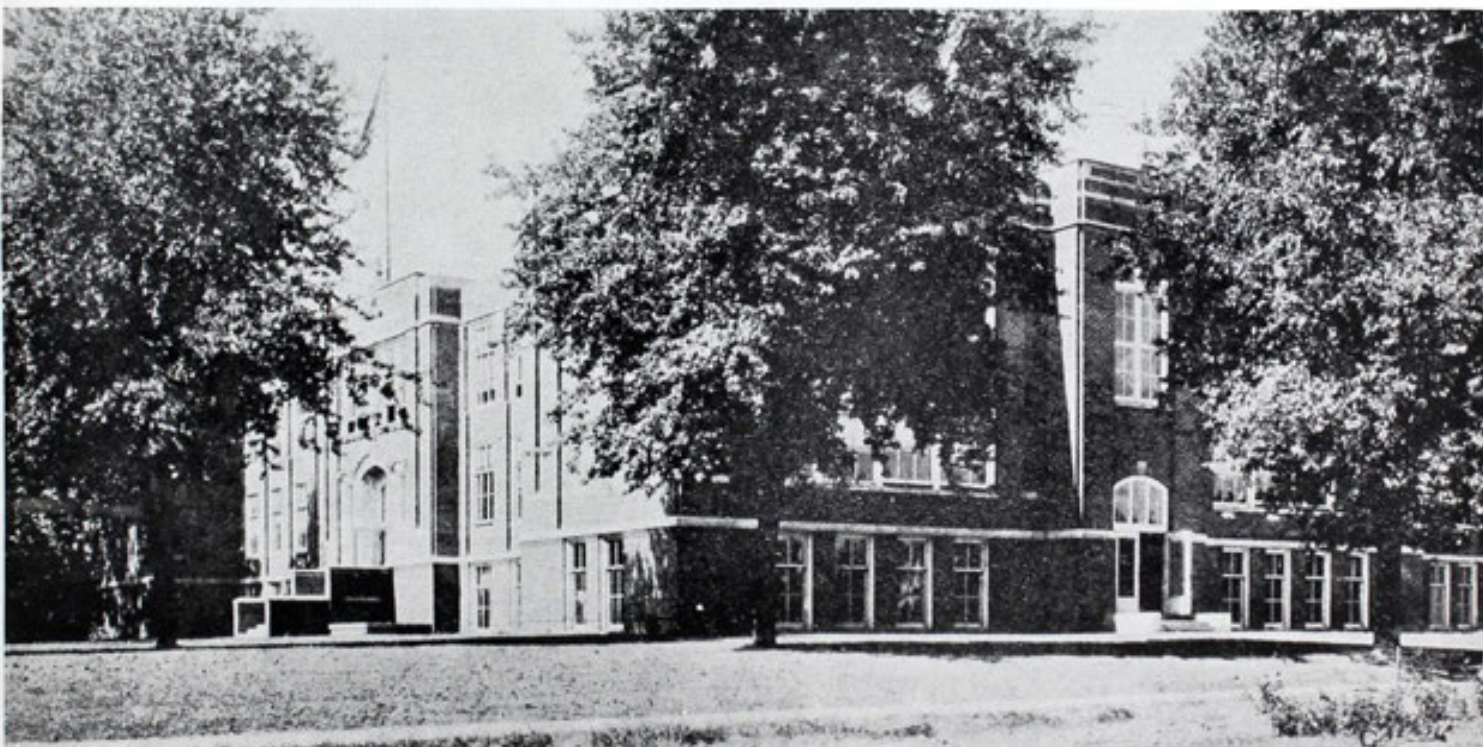

Originally known as the Corona, our first yearbook was published in the 1912-13 school year. Walter, Ritter, manager of the Buckeye Machine and Supply Co. here, was the first faculty advisor and originator of this new idea of having a high school annual. Since this idea was a completely new line of thought for a high school, the board of education refused to help in financing the yearbook. No school time was allotted to this "extra" work, and no school funds were available for its use.

After appointing his staff — Russell Exley, editor; Ralph Scott, assistant editor; Earl Winkler, business manager; Russell Wallick, assistant manager; Walter Meyer, athletics; Martha Swearingen, literary; Robert Stephenson, humorous,

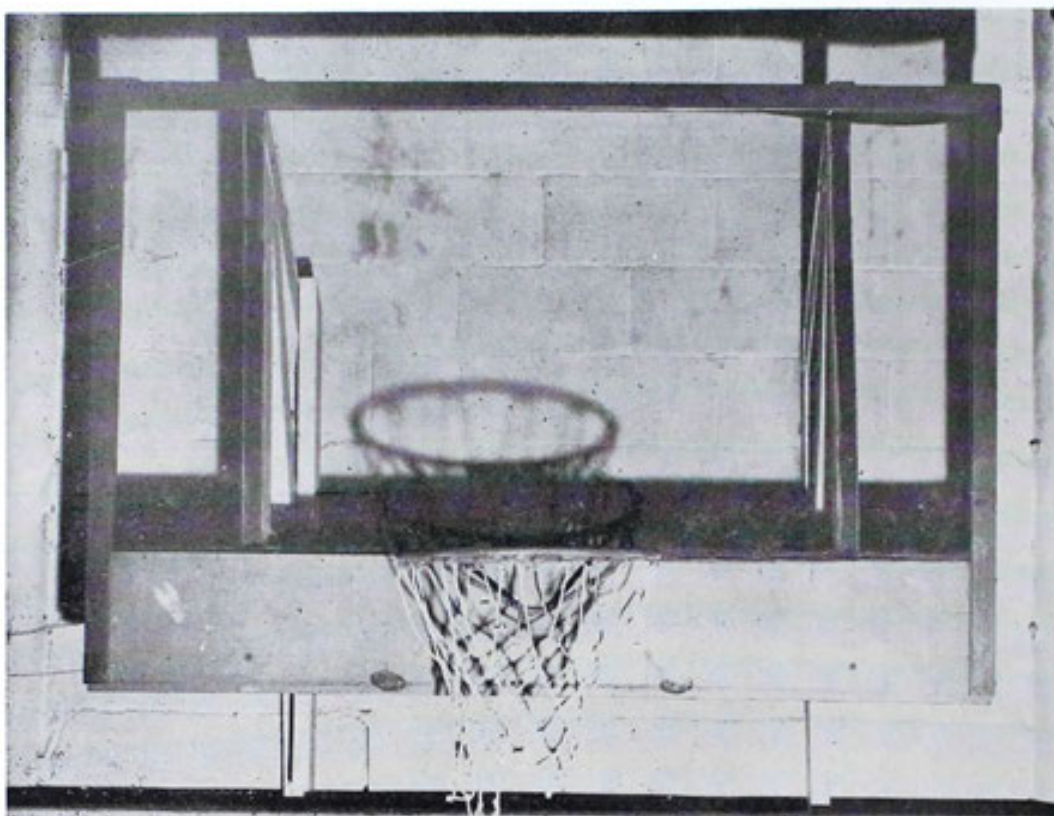
Lois Hellyer, class; and Arthur Getz, art — he began work on the publication of the yearbook. All of this work was done in the back room of Reg's Drug Store on the square (now the site of a bakery.) J. Forest Tucker and S. H. Green helped the beginners in the printing of and photography for their new yearbook. The first edition came out in a leather-back cover at a cost of .75 for advance subscribers and \$1.00 for late subscribers. Hard work and sweat went into the first publication, but it was a tremendous success for the students.

The name "Corona" was short-lived for the annual. The following year, Mr. Ritter held a contest for the student body to submit names for the yearbook. Two students, Martha Swearingen and Dave Morgan, submitted the name "Delphian", and so the yearbook, as we know it today, had its beginning.



The change in the name of the annual was not the only change in 1914. A new high school was added to the public school system, offering the students new, modern surroundings in which to pursue their education, friendships, activities, and sports. Frank L. Packard, of Columbus, Ohio, was the architect of our new addition, and George Kratt, of Lorain, Ohio, was given the contract for the construction. Officials for our new school system were Robert S. Barton, M.D., President, Charles W. Henderson, Vice-President, Adam A. Stermer, clerk, A. A. Bowers, W. C. Graff, Charles F. Limbach, Superintendent of Schools, and Frank L. Mosher, Superintendent of Buildings.

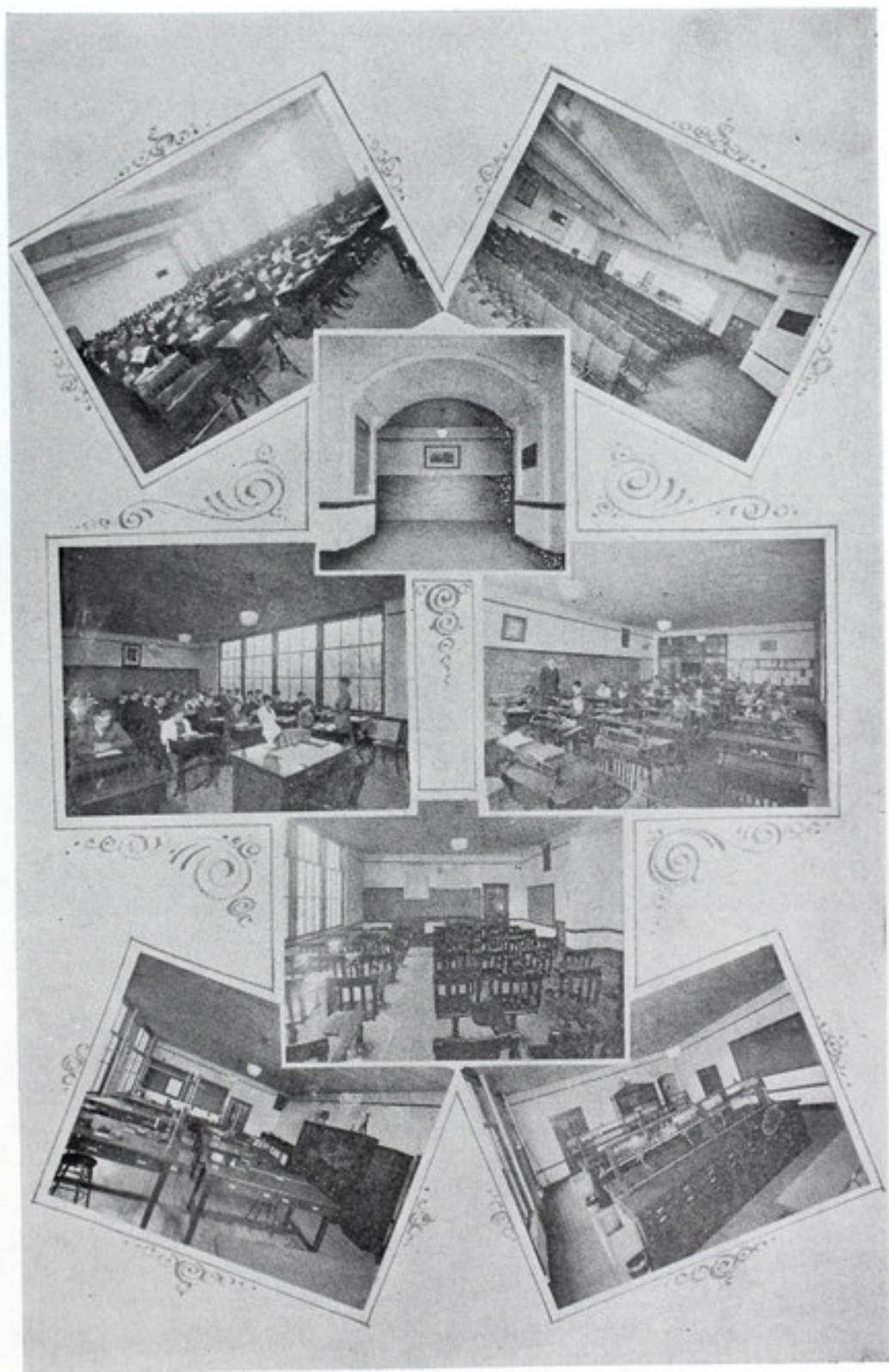




A beautiful, new auditorium was built for the assemblies of the student body, the present site of our library. The stage was located in the south end of the library where the offices are now. The library was then located in the double study hall 329, and the principal's office was in the present audio-visual office.

Since the "new" gym was limited in size and seating capacity, bleachers had to be constructed behind the backboards. To eliminate the obstruction of the basketball game, the idea of glass backboards was conceived. With the assistance of the Pittsburgh Plate Glass Company, designers of the backboards, and Frank Mosher, constructor of the frames, the idea was realized. These glass backboards were the first and only of their kind in the area.

Down through the years, time and the need for space have transformed our school into an arrangement completely different from that of our first planned, but the traditions of fellowship still remain.

In the High School a new course of study was put into operation, adding largely to the "practical" side of education. This was the first time in the history of the high school that credit was given to freshman work done in domestic science. The junior and senior girls asked to take the course, even though it was extra work.

Miss Perry, the domestic science instructor, taught the girls the value of foods, preparation of foods, balancing a meal, and cooking the special diets for the sick. They learned to care for their kitchen equipment, which in itself was an accomplishment to any girl.

Though the enrollment was less than expected, all in all, the course proved satisfying to the students. Each year, the course attracted more eager pupils, and gradually developed into the present-day Home Economics course.

# *New Philadelphia School Band*



The School Band was organized in January, 1915, by Frank R. Speck, Director of Music. At the start there were about forty boys in the organization none of whom could play a band instrument; but by the thirtieth of May of the same year they were able to play a few marches well enough to march at the head of the procession of school children in the Memorial Day Parade.

A few boys failed to make good in the band and a few left school but others have come in to take their places. At this time there are in the senior organization thirty members, while there is a junior band of recruits coming on which numbers about twenty boys.

The school band has become an established institution which is filling a big place in school and community activities.

## *Orchestra*



The High School Orchestra, numbering twenty-three members, furnished music for one or two evenings during the Exhibit of the Art and Manual Training Department; the Senior-Junior Banquet; the Class Play, and the Graduating Exercises.

There twenty-three schools's best musical talent, and the well-balanced instrumentation for full orchestra afforded opportunities in which the capabilities of each and every member was brought into prominence.





For a number of years it has been the custom of each graduating class to leave behind something that will remain as a memorial of their sojourn in High School. In order to provide a suitable home for a number of trophies players won by athletes of former years, the class of '21 presented the school with a trophy case. The case was placed in the lower hall and for some years remained a fitting tribute in recognition of what the school had done for its members.



The growth of athletics has been signified by the addition of many new trophies since 1921. These new awards are the result of hard work and fair play by the athletics of our school. New Philadelphia High School's fine traditions and high standards are shown in these beautiful cups and players. In order to show these awards, a new trophy case was built. It is located in the new gym and attracts the attention of all who enter.





The year 1896 marked the beginning of the N.P.H.S. football team. Our first game was against Canal Dover and played at the baseball field in New Philadelphia. We won 18 to 0.



In 1957 the Quakers defeated Dover again, only this time by the outstanding margin of 72 to 0, showing the advancement of athletes and our continued supremacy over our archrival.



Through the years the cheerleaders and athletics have changed very much.

The most obvious change in the cheerleaders is in their dress. Neat pleated skirts have replaced the wool slacks.



The girls' basketball team which was very popular in the 20's, has ben completely abandoned. This was the last opportunity for girls of New Phila High to participate in interscholastic athletic contests.

Basketball players of today now wear jerseys with numbers on for faster identification. The shorter, lighter uniforms make playing much easier.

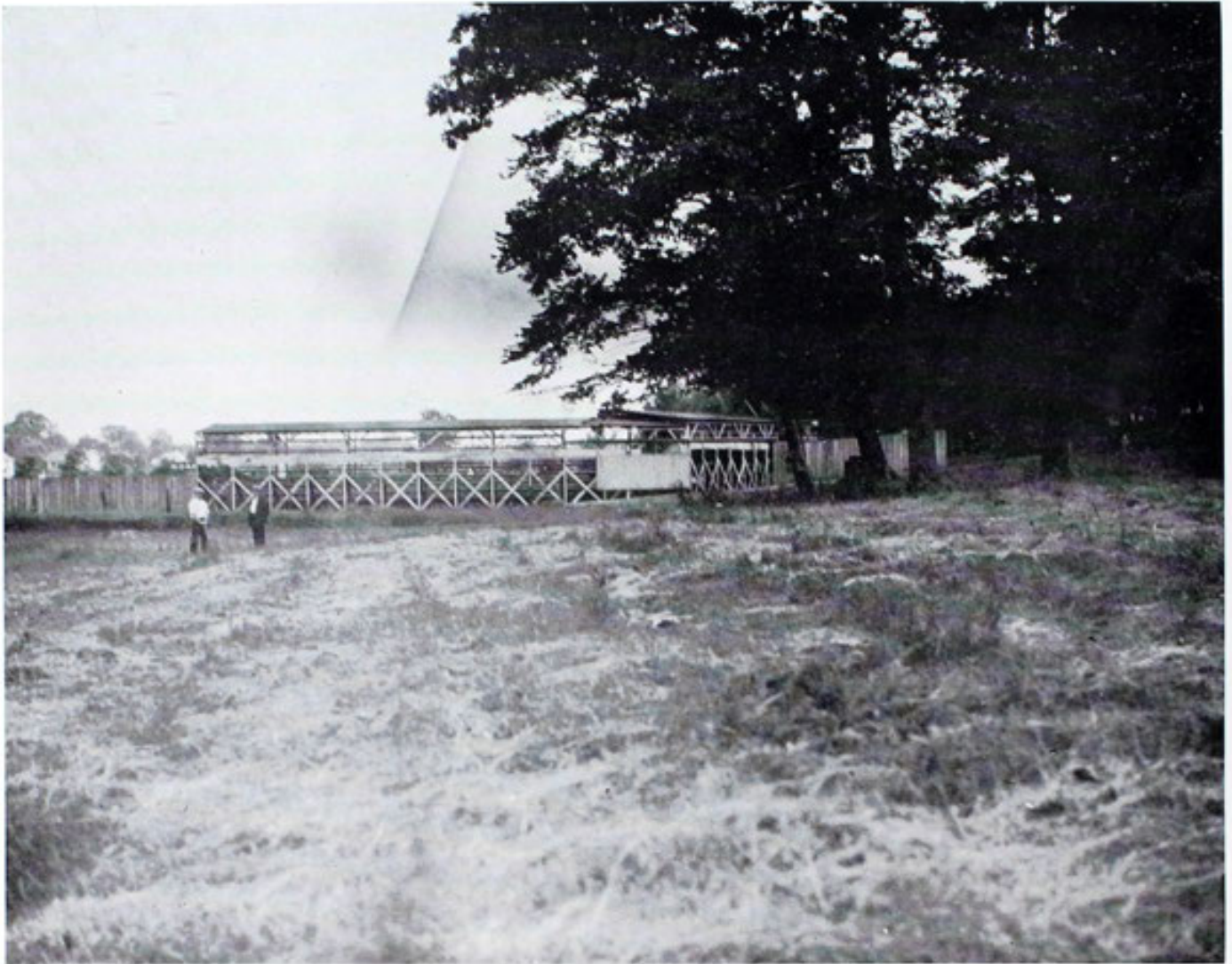






Football, our most popular sport, has also met many changes through the years. The uniforms of the players have been revised greatly, added padding has made football safer; numbers on jerseys have made identification simpler.

# The New Stadium

At the time he was faculty manager for the football team, Mr. Fishel conceived the idea for a football field. He realized this necessity when he experienced a typical baseball game on the muddy diamond at Tuscora Park and dreaded the thought of conditioning this spot for the opening football season. Mr. Fishel was determined to better conditions and exerted every effort to this purpose. The citizens of New Philadelphia backed him in the idea and in 1913 his dream came true.

Mr. Fishel presented his idea to Senator Nickles, member of the Phila park board, Nickles expressed his approval and boosted the project. As a result of several meetings, two tracts of land were chosen. The one tract of land lying parallel to North Broadway was not chosen because it did not afford enough space. Several meetings followed in which the type of field desired was discussed. It was decided that one should be constructed that would last for many years.

Many attractive and popular fields were inspected and as a result, with the exception of concrete bleachers on both sides of the field, the local field is almost an exact replica of the Parkersburg lot. Albert Rosch, local engineer, was secured to draw up plans and make blue prints of the proposed field.

It was then decided to organize an association comprised of representatives of the city's four service clubs, the Chamber of Commerce, and the Bronx Club. These groups offered much support. The tract of land which included approximately five acres was then turned over to the organization which was designated the New Philadelphia Schools Stadium Association. Fishel was named foreman of the construction. Bids for the construction of the field were then advertised for and Samuel Hensel, this city, was awarded the contract.

The work of construction was started on Monday, July 28th, 1927. The football field proper is 120 yards long and fifty yards wide. A quarter mile cinder track circles the gridiron and is separated from the players field by a twenty foot lawnstrip.

Each of the city's service clubs, the Chamber of Commerce and the Bronx Club donated \$200 to the Stadium Association; \$2000 was appropriated by the park board, \$2000 was turned over to the association by the school board and the high school athletic association donated a like amount.

In later years field houses were constructed. Not only can the stadium be used for football, but it provides an ideal place to hold a field and track meet. It was the first time that the high school was able to boast of a cinder track on which its speed artists could break world records. The finished product was a greater achievement than was dreamed of by its sponsors.

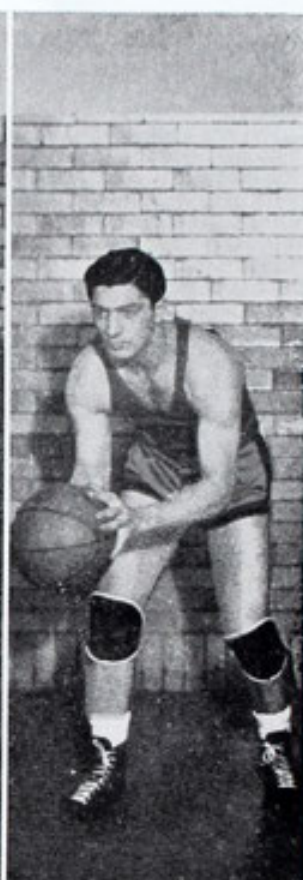

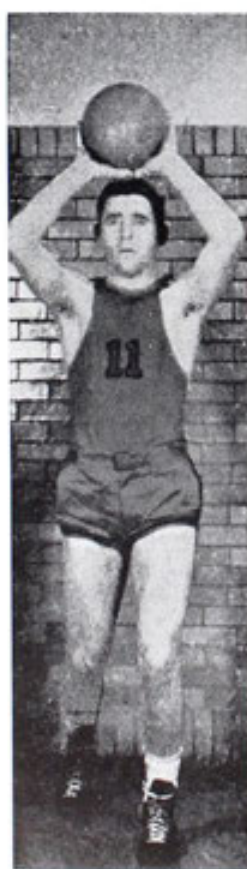

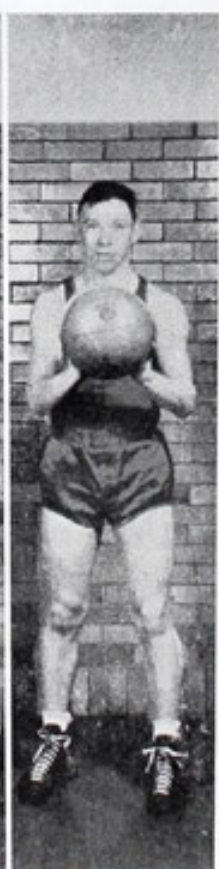

## 1940 UNDEFEATED STATE CHAMPIONS

The 1940 basketball team brought a great honor to the corridors of NPHS. Fighting through a tough schedule, the Quaker Wildcats went undefeated in twenty-five games. Many teams they played had high ratings in the state. The success of the Wildcats was due to the fact of a concerted team effort.

The coach for these boys was Paul Hoerneman, who was only twenty-three years old. It took much know-how to put together a great team such as this and he and the team deserve much credit.

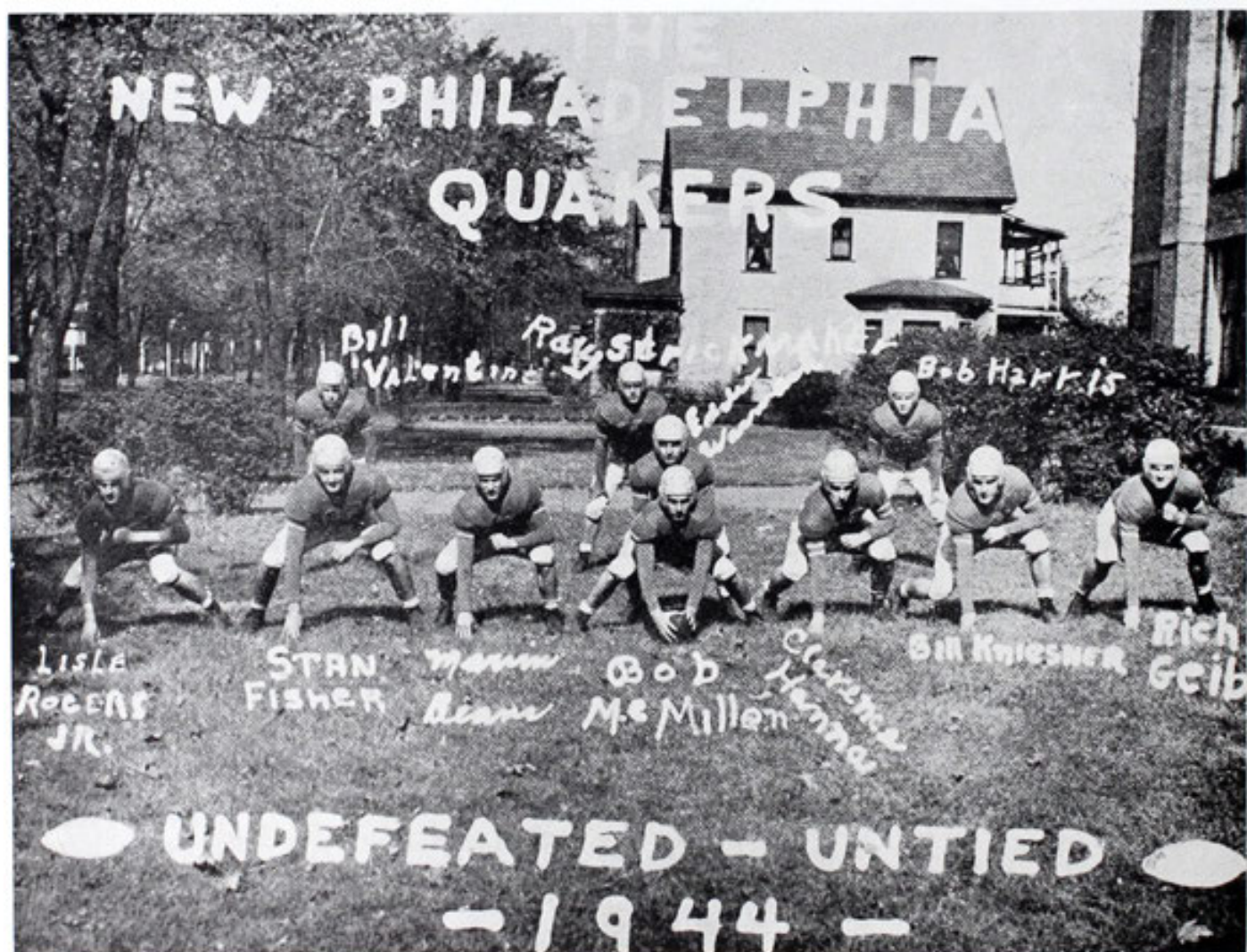
There were two All-Ohio and All-Tournament choices on this team. They were Jack Castagnola and Glenn Barker. The others who greatly contributed to the success of this team were: Bob Ferguson, Don Brown, Lloyd Reese, Leo Benjamin (the present coach), Kenny Gribble, Bob Tope, Don Evans, and Bill Tucker.

The Quaker Wildcats of 1940 were only the third team to become undefeated State Champions.





An interesting highlight of 1920 was provided by the football team coached by Dale Empfield. They had the honor of establishing a new state record for points scored in a single game. They defeated the highly touted Caldwell team by the score of 154-0.



The football team of 1944 posted the best record since 1924. The team, coached by Paul Hoerneman and Bill Kidd, was rated one of the five finest teams in the state and shared the mythical grid title of Ohio. The varsity had only two touchdowns scored against them; the team as a whole gave up only 25 points.

Just last year the New Phila. track team under Coach Ralph Gartrell was undefeated in dual meets.





## *The War Years*

Throughout the war years the patriotic spirit of New Philadelphia High School manifested itself in many successful war activities.

One of its major undertakings was the all-city scrap drive in October. In this drive every house in the city was canvassed for metal. The students were divided into small groups, and each group was assigned a certain district. With the hearty co-operation of everyone, four hundred pounds of keys and twenty-five tons of scrap iron were collected and disposed of.

Four new courses were temporarily added to the curriculum; (1). pre-flight aeronautics, which provided special courses and activities for the preliminary training of prospective aviation cadets and ground crew maintenance men; (2). emergency mathematics, a refresher course for students who had not studied this subject; (3). a physical-fitness program which emphasized not only health, posture, and calisthenics, but also military drill and first aid; and (4). a girls' industrial arts course which gave the girls some training for the industrial jobs that service men formerly held.

The girls with brothers in a service organized a club called G.O.B.S., whose purpose it was to sell defense bonds and stamps. These girls were successful in their enterprise, as they sold approximately twenty thousand dollars worth of bonds

Two Canteen drives were undertaken, one being conducted by the Central News. The total proceeds were thirty dollars' worth of candy bars, sixty-one dollars in cash, and thirty-three hundred magazines.

The Victory Corps, which had been organized early in the fall was composed of five divisions: (1) Land Service, (2) Sea Service, (3) Air Service, (4) Production Service, and (5) Community Service. The plan was to do exploratory work in each field. The division took ea being to help boys and girls find themselfesturns sponsoring a program each week, the id in war work.

The sale of War Bonds and Stamps every Friday was started early in the fall. During an "All Out for Victory" week, through a 100% cooperation of students and teachers, over ten thousand dollars' worth of bonds and stamps were purchased. The second 100% drive on April 16, resulted in the purchase of \$68,516.25 worth of bonds and stamps through the school. A grand total of \$112,321. in stamps and bonds were sold.

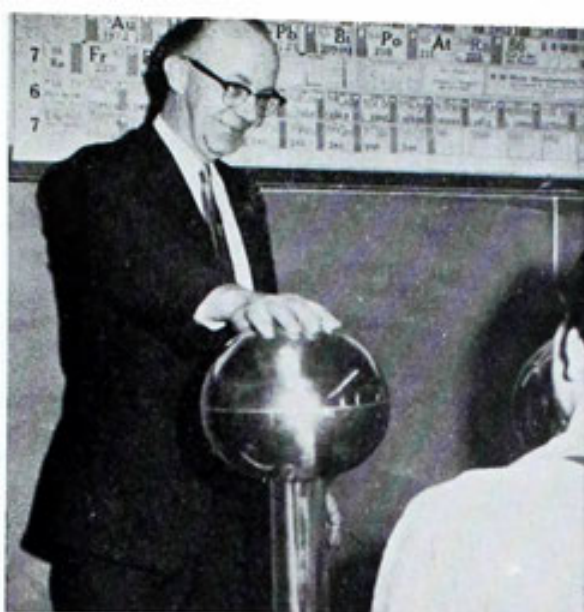
## Quaker

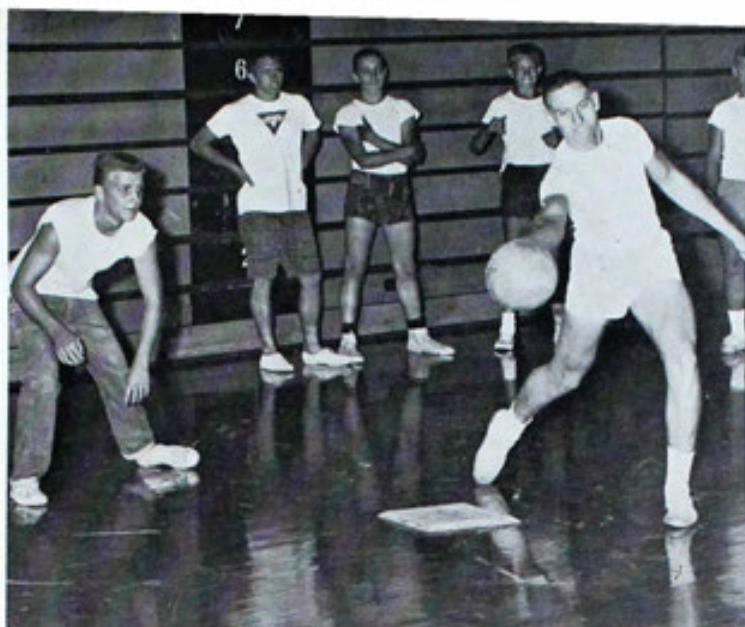
On February 21 the junior class sponsored the annual Junior Jamboree, featuring talent from its class.

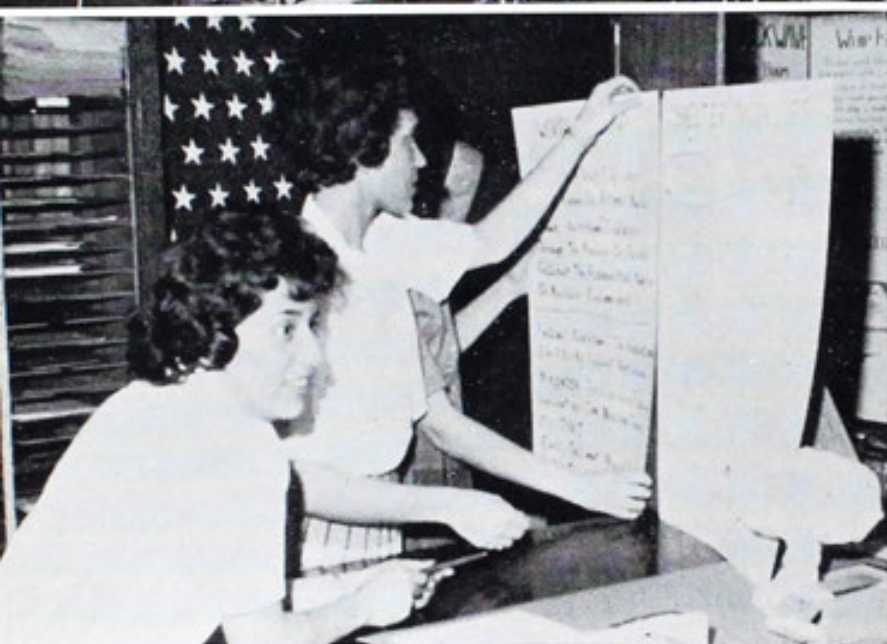
## Corners
