Quakers Win Big




Climax To A Great Football Season

With their first Cardinal Conference Championship in 8 years,


and a brilliant 17–3 regular season record this year's fighting Quaker Basketball team looks like the best hope for a state crown for Phila. in over a decade.
















Tourney Bound


TRIPLE CROWN
