The State Meet in Columbus.

The lone Quaker setback was a one point loss to
Carrollton, 27-28. The Warriors finished their season
19-0 and 10th Class AA in the State.

In regular matches,
Carrollton was the only team to test NPHS
As the Quakers Slimmest Margin of Victory was
14 Points over Marlinton.

Major Highlights of New Phila's 1976 Season came
in

Invitationals and other large Meets.
Quakers gained Big First Place Wins in
The 17-team Dover Invitational and
The 13-team Salt Fork Invitational.

In Addition,
NP finished near Seconds in the
Carrollton Invitational and the
Cardinal Conference Meet.
However, for NP Cross Country Fans,
The Best was yet to come.

The STATE meet

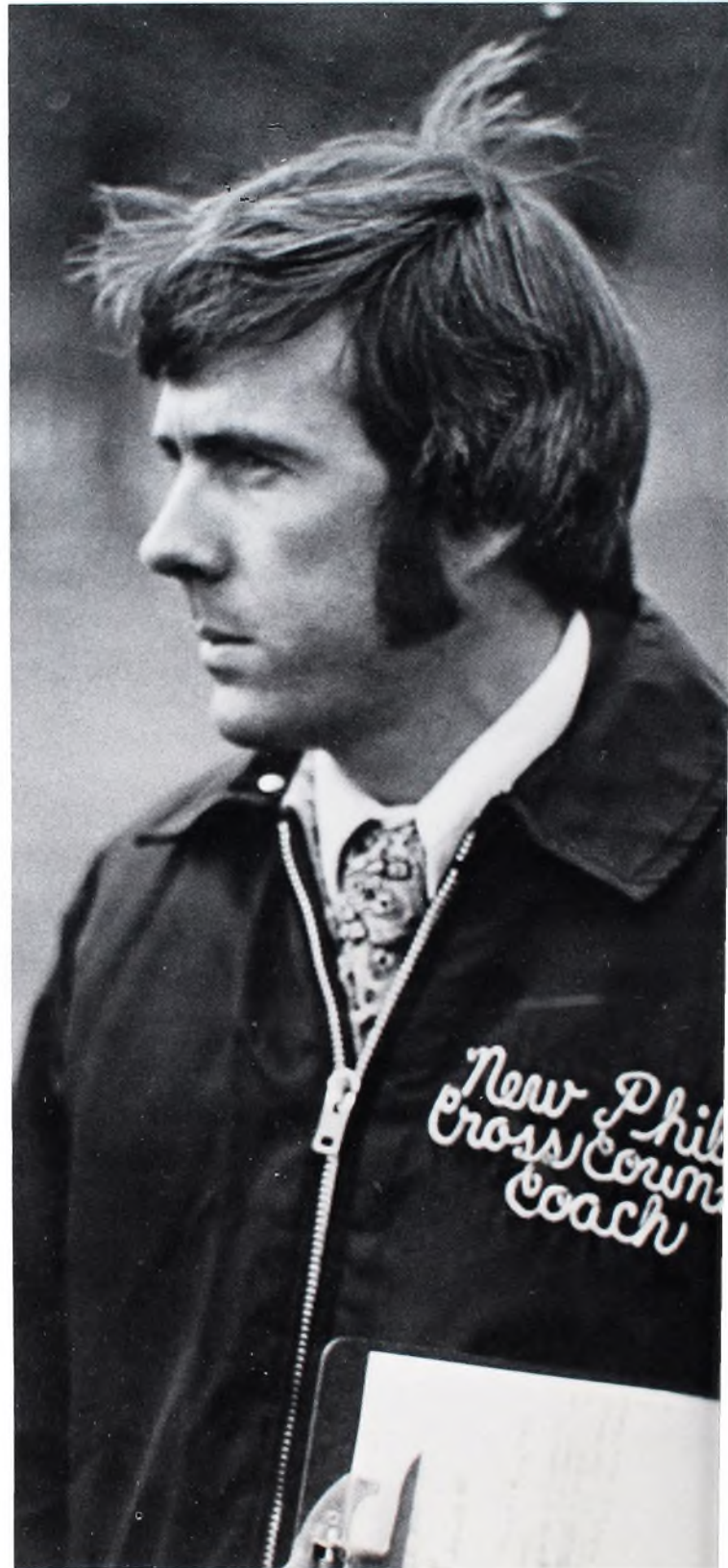
At the Sectional Contest in Dover.

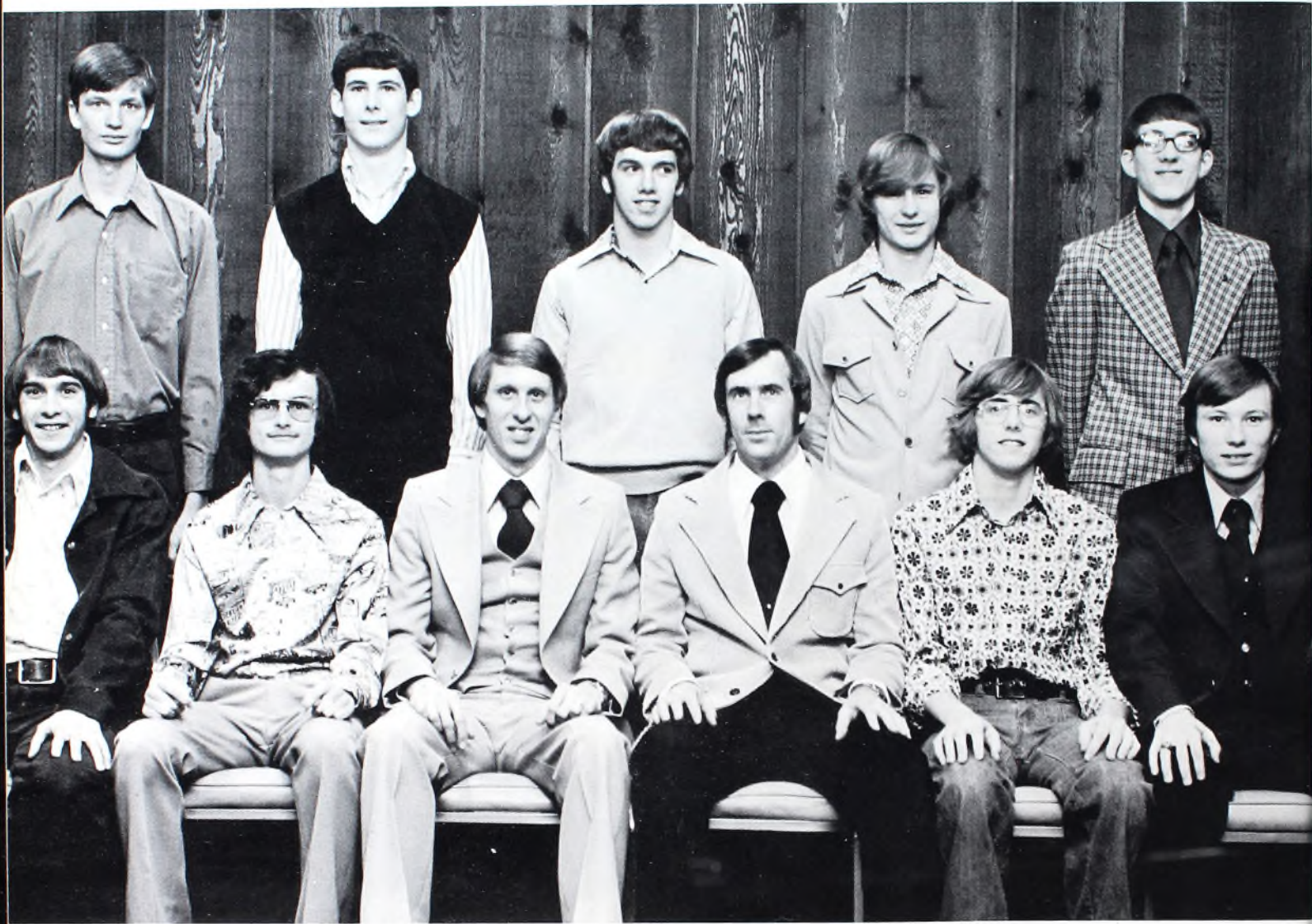

The traditional Dover game brought one of the C.C. ties.
Sr. Larry Trunk was named MVP of the game for the Quakers.
With a 3-2-1 mark, Philly was third in the C.C. line.
The Quakers were hampered by mid-season injuries.
At one time, as many as 9 starters were out.
Statistic-wise in the Cardinal Conference,
Quaker's offense was #1 in rushing with 1692 yards.
Sr. Tim Streb was the top C.C. rusher with 661 yards.
Streb was also named Outstanding Offensive Back.
Outstanding Offensive Lineman went to Sr. Tim Hostetler.
Sr. Quarterback Ken Stiffler was named Offensive MVP.
Defensively in the C.C.,
the Quakers were Number ONE overall!
Sr. Gene (Bear) Schwartz earned
C.C. Defensive Player of the Year.
Schwartz was also named Defensive MVP.

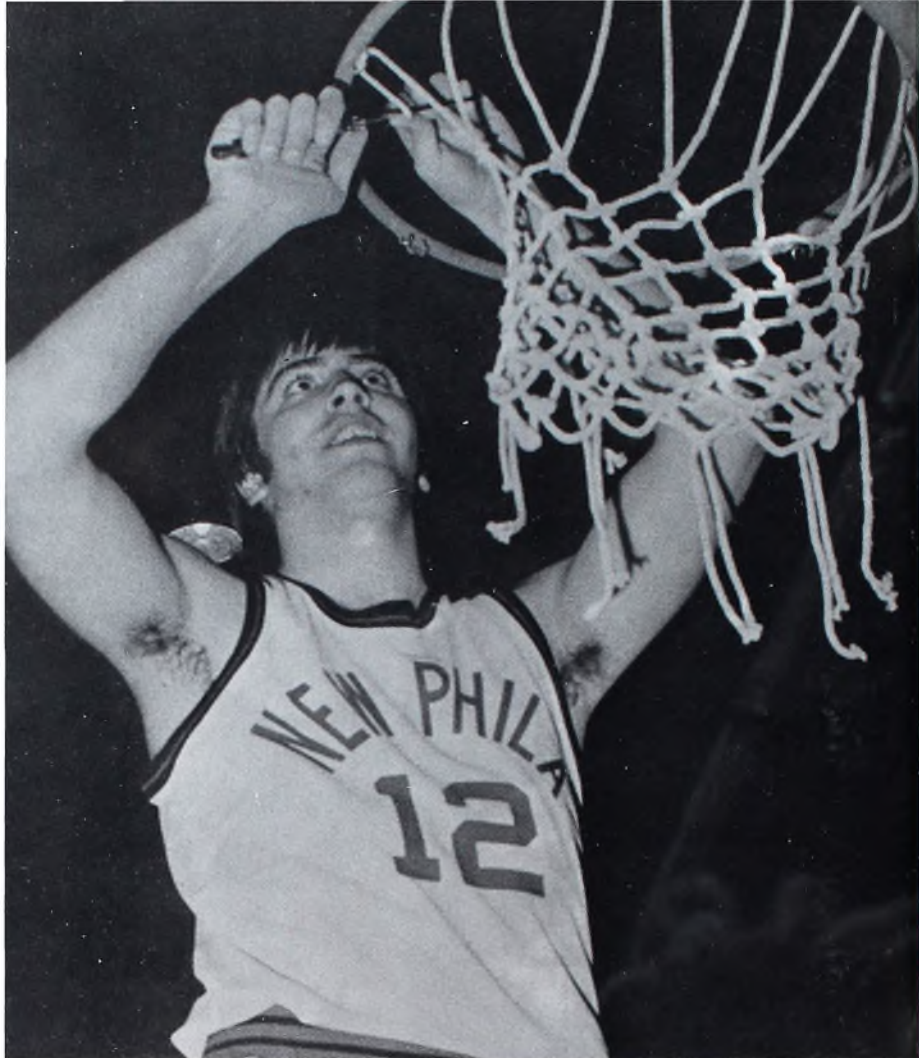
Moreover, the Phila squad gave the Fans

Upper Weight Classes.

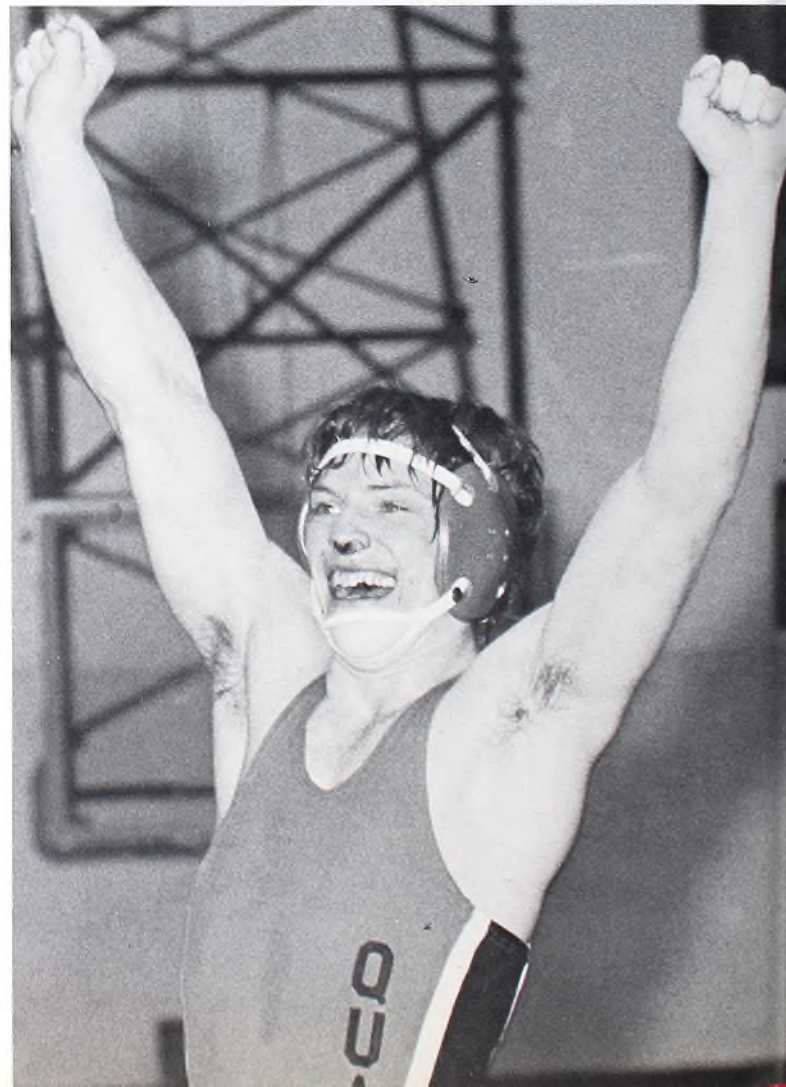
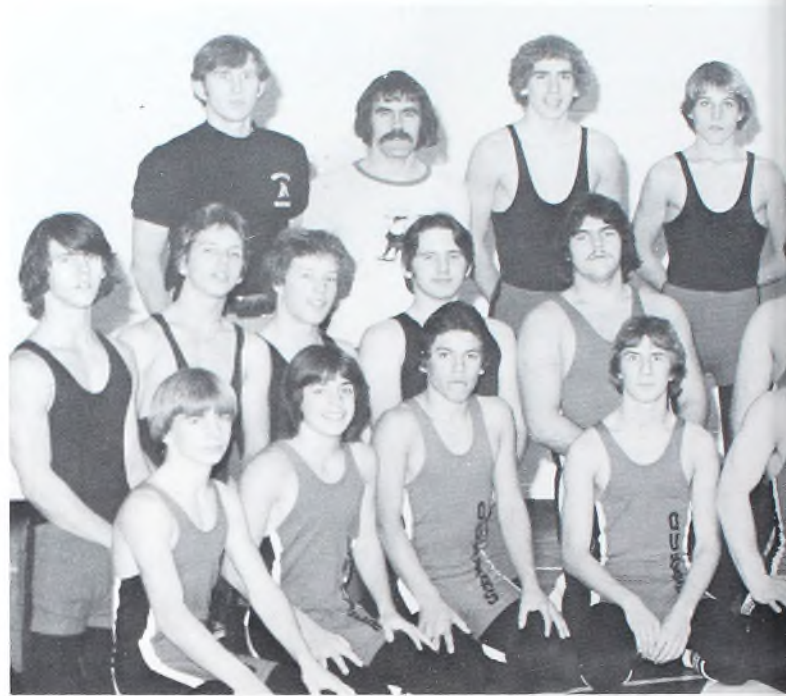
As a result, the Quakers had many Exciting

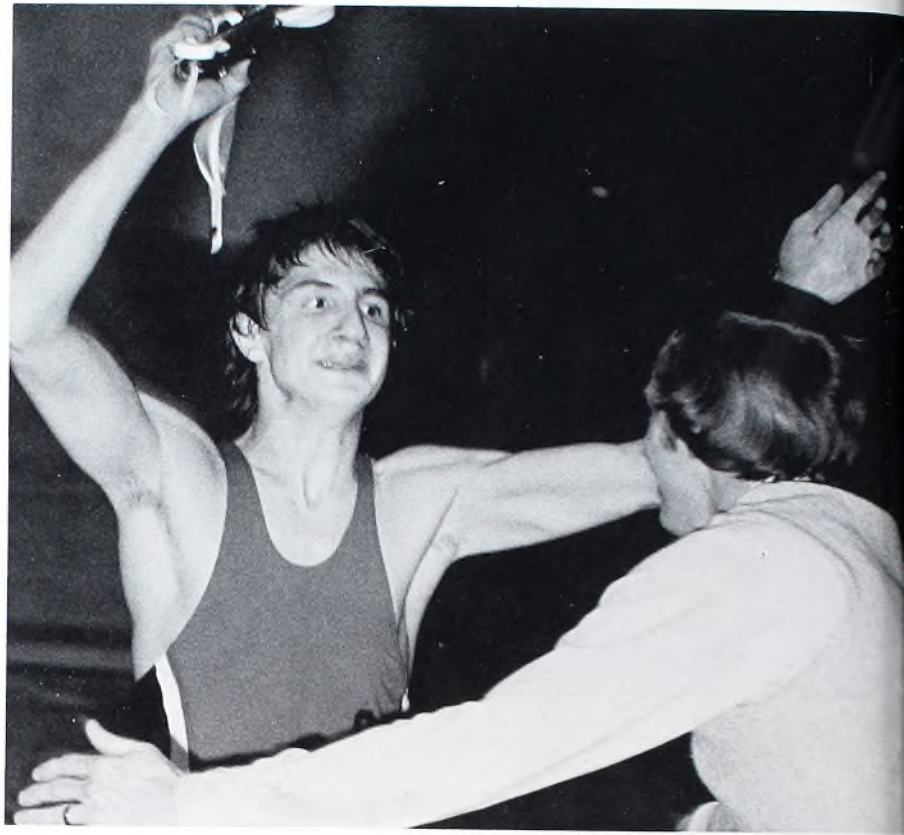

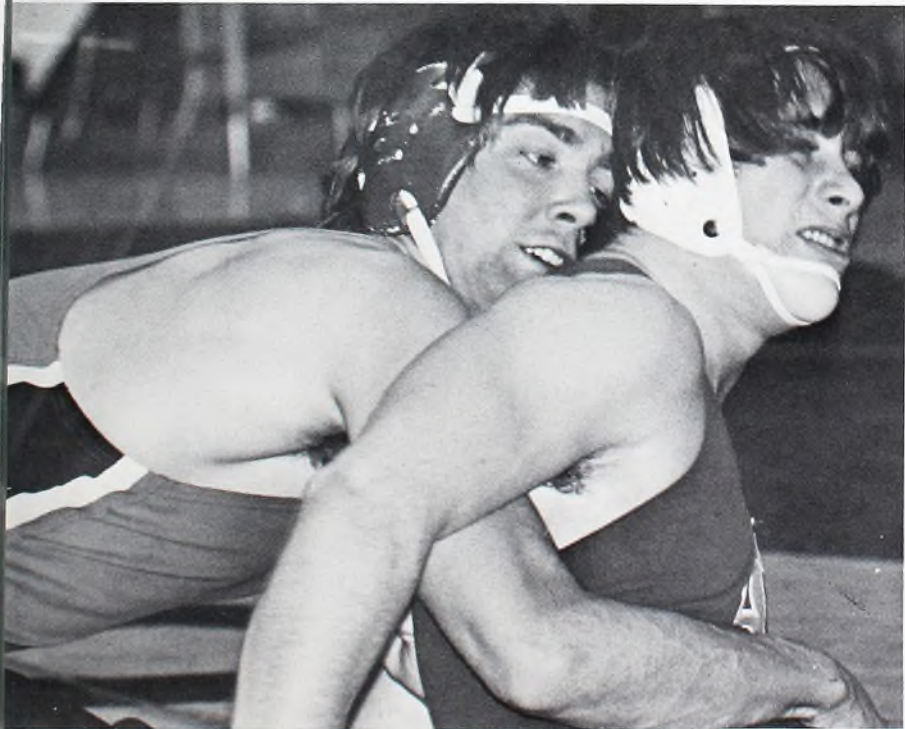

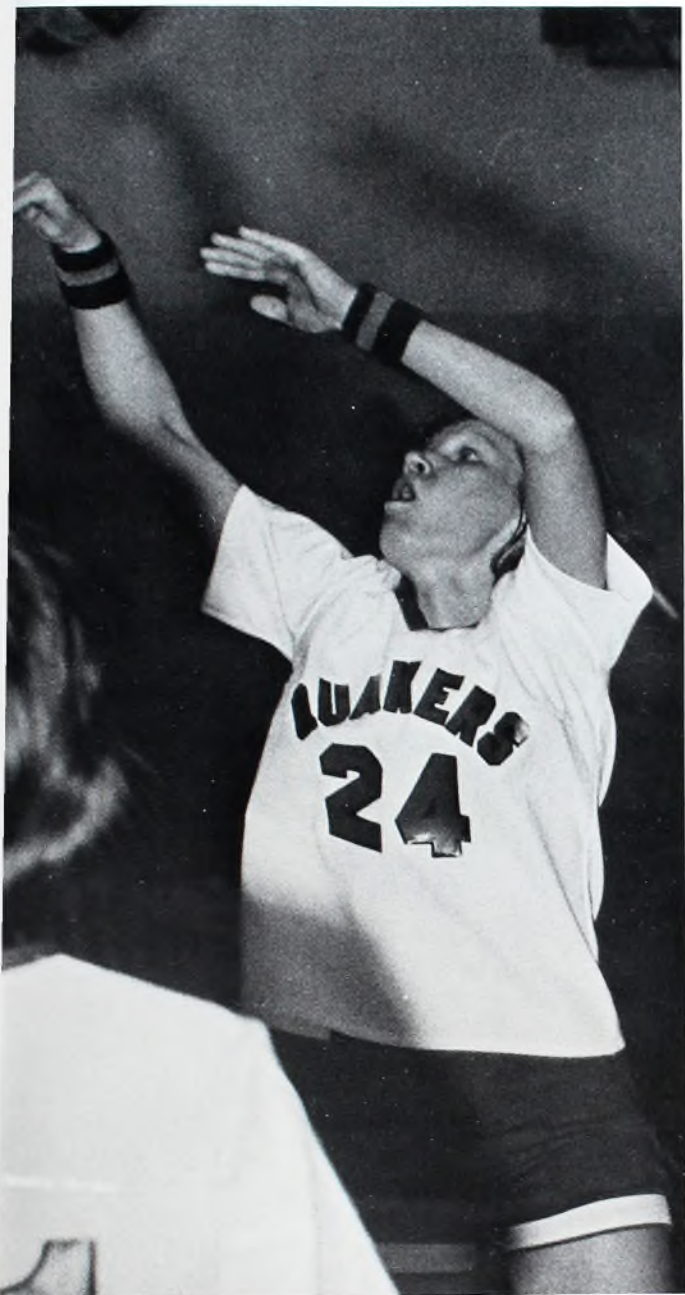

The Best Pitching Award went to Leo Renner, earning a run average of 2.08.

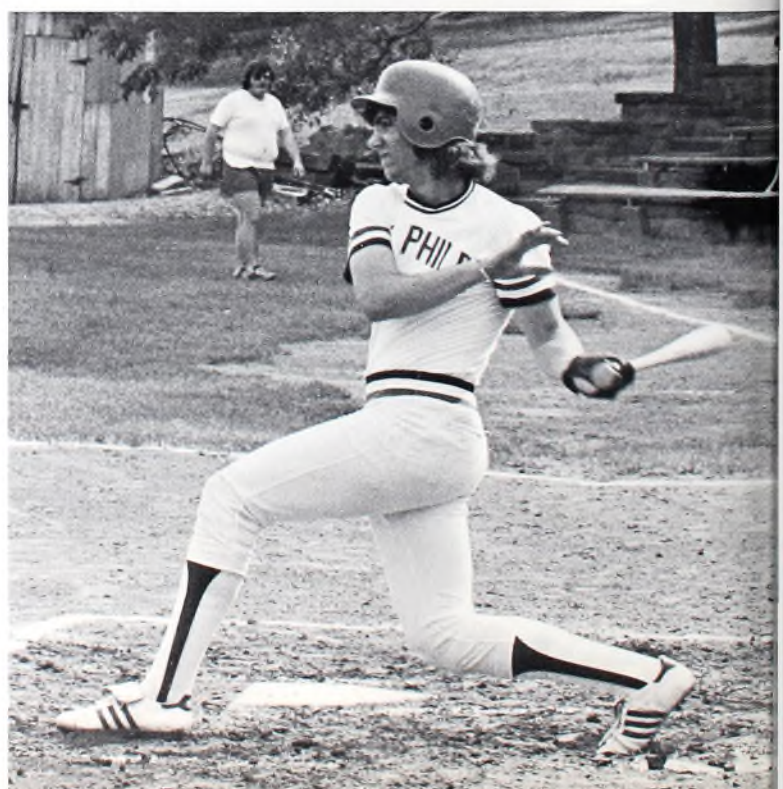

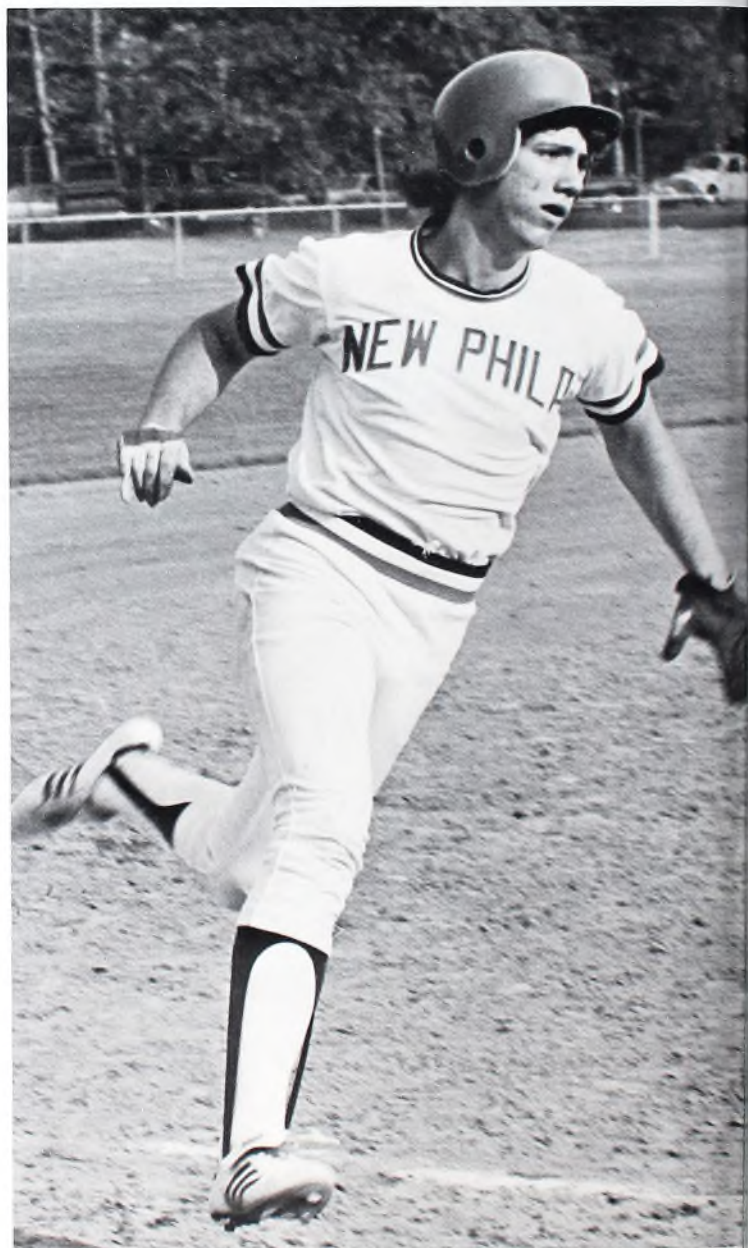

This is the First Winning Record in the History of
New Philadelphia Girls Track.

This was achieved under second year Head Coach Patty Beaber.

Not only did the Girls have a Fine turnaround from a 1-6

Record in Duel Meets the previous season,

they also did quite well in large Meets.

This Year the squad finished fifth of twelve at the Tornado

Relays, fourth of ten at the Marietta Invitational, and

third of seven at the

Sectional.

Success was the Result of Great individual efforts and

the Combination of these in Relay Events.

Andrea Marsh was awarded with Trophies for scoring the Most

Points in Running Events, Field Events, and Track and Field

Events combined.
