




HOMECOMING

Dave Fitch received his three-year letter award as well as awards for Most Valuable Golfer. Most Consistant Golfer, and Sectional and Tournament Medalist Honors. Todd Kugler received his two-year letter award and fourth Medalist Trophy in the Dover Invitational. Other Quaker golfers were seniors, Carl Sherrets and Kevin Yarnell, and sophomores, Tim Tarulli and Roy Pederson. Quakers also won a number of tournaments—Dover Invitational, Sixth Annual Autumn Classic, Second Annual Eastern Ohio Invitational. and the Fall Festival of Golf Classics. Reflecting back, Coach Jim Kaserman commented, "Each boy showed great character, poise, competitiveness, and a terrific attitude.'



After losing five runners from the 1976 State qualifying team, the 1977 NP Cross Country squad responded to the challenge by winning 11 meets against only 3 defeats. The season marked the third consecutive year that the Quaker team won 11 duel meets. Records of 11-4 and 11-1 in 1975 and 1976, respectively, combined with the '77 record make a three-year total of 33 wins and 8 losses. In addition to strong performances in duel matches, the 1977 team had many outstanding showings in invitational meetsfirst places in the Dover Invitational, the Carrollton Invitational, and for the second straight year the AAA Sectional Meet. The only returning lettermen from the fine 1976 team were Seniors Jody Gaffney and John Pollock. Gaffney led the squad during most of the year and placed first in all but two duel meets. He was voted Most Valuable Runner by his teammates and selected to the first team of the Eastern District All-Star Team. Pollock was a second team selection to this honorary squad. In addition to their three-year letterman awards, Gaffney and Pollock gained recognition for running over 1,000 miles during the summer of 1977.

The NPHS 1977 Football Team completed its season with a record of 4 wins, 4 losses, and 2 ties. However, overall the squad outscored its opponents 75-69 for the year. The Quakers, coached by Jim Roman, entered the '77 campaign with only six returning starters—three on each offense and defense. As a result, the NP offensive attack was very slow in developing. The Quaker defense, although dominated by Juniors, arose to the occasion much quicker and was definitely the strong point of the team. Even though the seasonal record is rather indecisive, there were many exciting moments for Phila fans. In the first game of the year, New Phila and Dayton Wilbur Wright played a scoreless contest until midway in the last quarter. Then, Senior Jeff Welsh returned a Dayton punt 70 yards into the end zone and Senior Chuck Albaugh kicked the extra point for the Quaker victory. Although defense was the Quaker highlight, as the offense gained more experience, they produced more points on the scoreboard. In the second half of the season, the Quakers had an average output of 12 points a game.



NP Offense Develops Slowly but a Great Quaker



... NP averaged 59.5 Points a game on the year, and their opponents 62. The Varsity placed exactly in the middle of the Cardinal Conference by finishing Fourth.
