## CROSS COUNTRY



After losing five runners from the 1976 State qualifying team, the 1977 NP Cross Country squad responded to the challenge by winning 11 meets against only 3 defeats. The season marked the third consecutive year that the Quaker team won 11 duel meets. Records of 11-4 and 11-1 in 1975 and 1976, respectively, combined with the '77 record make a three-year total of 33 wins and

8 losses. In addition to strong performances in duel matches, the 1977 team had many out-
standing showings in invitational meets-
first places in the Dover Invitational, the Carrollton Invitational, and for the second straight year the AAA Sectional Meet. The only
returning lettermen from the fine 1976 team were Seniors Jody Gaffney and John Pollock. Gaffney led the squad during most of the year
and placed first in all but two duel meets. He was voted Most Valuable Runner by his team-
mates and selected to the first team of the
Eastern District All-Star Team. Pollock was a second team selection to this honorary squad.

In addition to their three-year letterman awards, Gaffney and Pollock gained recognition for running over 1,000 miles during the summer
of 1977.

The NPHS 1977 Football Team completed its season with a record of 4 wins, 4 losses, and 2 ties. However, overall the squad outscored its opponents 75-69 for the year. The Quakers, coached by Jim

Roman, entered the ' 77 campaign with only six returning starters-three on each offense and defense. As a result, the NP offensive attack was very slow in developing. The Quaker defense, although dominated by Juniors, arose to the occasion much quicker and was definitely the strong point of the team. Even though the seasonal record is rather indecisive, there were many exciting moments for Phila fans. In the first game of the year, New Phila and Dayton Wilbur Wright played a scoreless contest until midway in the last quarter. Then, Senior Jeff Welsh returned a Dayton punt 70 yards into the end zone and Senior Chuck Albaugh kicked the extra point for the Quaker victory. Although defense was the Quaker highlight, as the offense gained more experience, they produced more points on the scoreboard. In the second half of the season, the Quakers had an average output of 12 points a game.

## NP Offenge Develops Slowly but a Great Quaker

Except for a collapse against a tough Zanesville team, the NP defensive scuad was extremely strong. Statistics which reflect this strength are: only two opponents scored over 7 points, and three foes were shut-out by the Quakers. Despite a great defensive effort, the PhilaDover clash ended in a 7-0 defeat for NP. As many times during the season, a few big plays by the opponent greatly hindered the Quaker cause in the rivalry. The '77 squad had many fine individual performances in gaining a .500 seasonal mark. Junior Ed Wilson was a two-way star as he was NP's leading ball carrier on offense and the leading tackler on defense. His great efforts were reflected by the presence of his name on post-season all-star squads-All-Cardinal Conference, All-Eastern District, and 2nd team All-Ohio. He was also Eastern District AAA Defensive Player of the Year. Junior Kevin Sherer was also All-Eastern District, and he gained Special Mention All-Ohio for his fine play. Seniors Rich Huston and CoCaptain Jim Demuth were All-Cardinal Conference selections in addition to Wilson. Huston was the top CC punter in 1977. Many other Quaker footballers received some type of post-season honors: Seniors John Calhoun, Mike McMorrow, and Greg Adkins; and Juniors Karl Beahm, Don Milarcik, Bob McConnell, and Bob Graham. The Coaches' Award went to Senior CoCaptain Mitch Drumm for support given although injured in 1977.

. . . NP averaged 59.5 Points a game on the year, and their opponents 62. The Varsity placed exactly in the middle of the Cardinal Conference by finishing Fourth. Senior Co-Captain Dan Liedtke led the Quakers throughout the season.

He was high scorer with a 21 point per game average, the leading rebounder, the leading shot blocker with 88 total, and also had the only Dunk of the season for the Phila Cagers.
