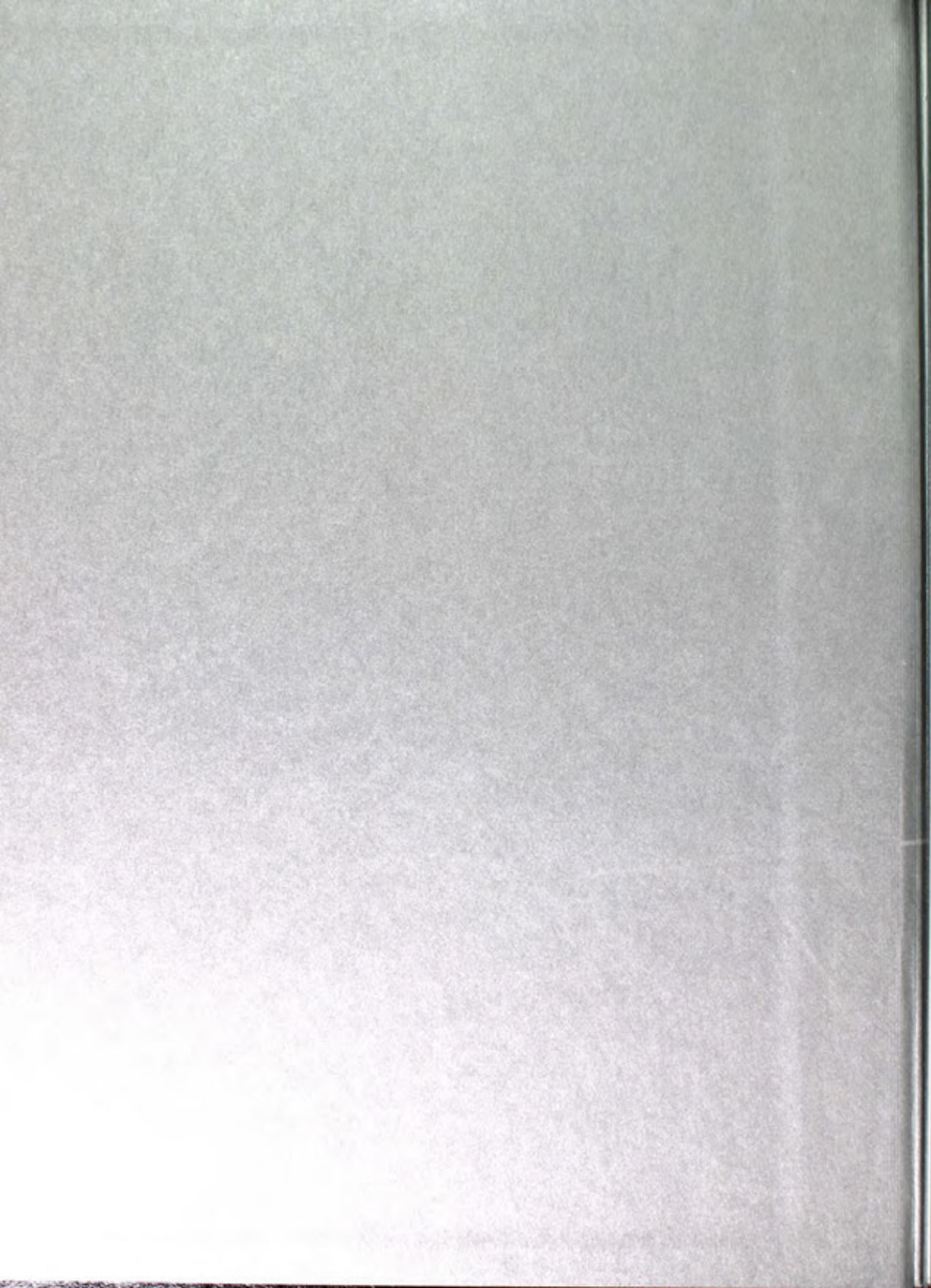

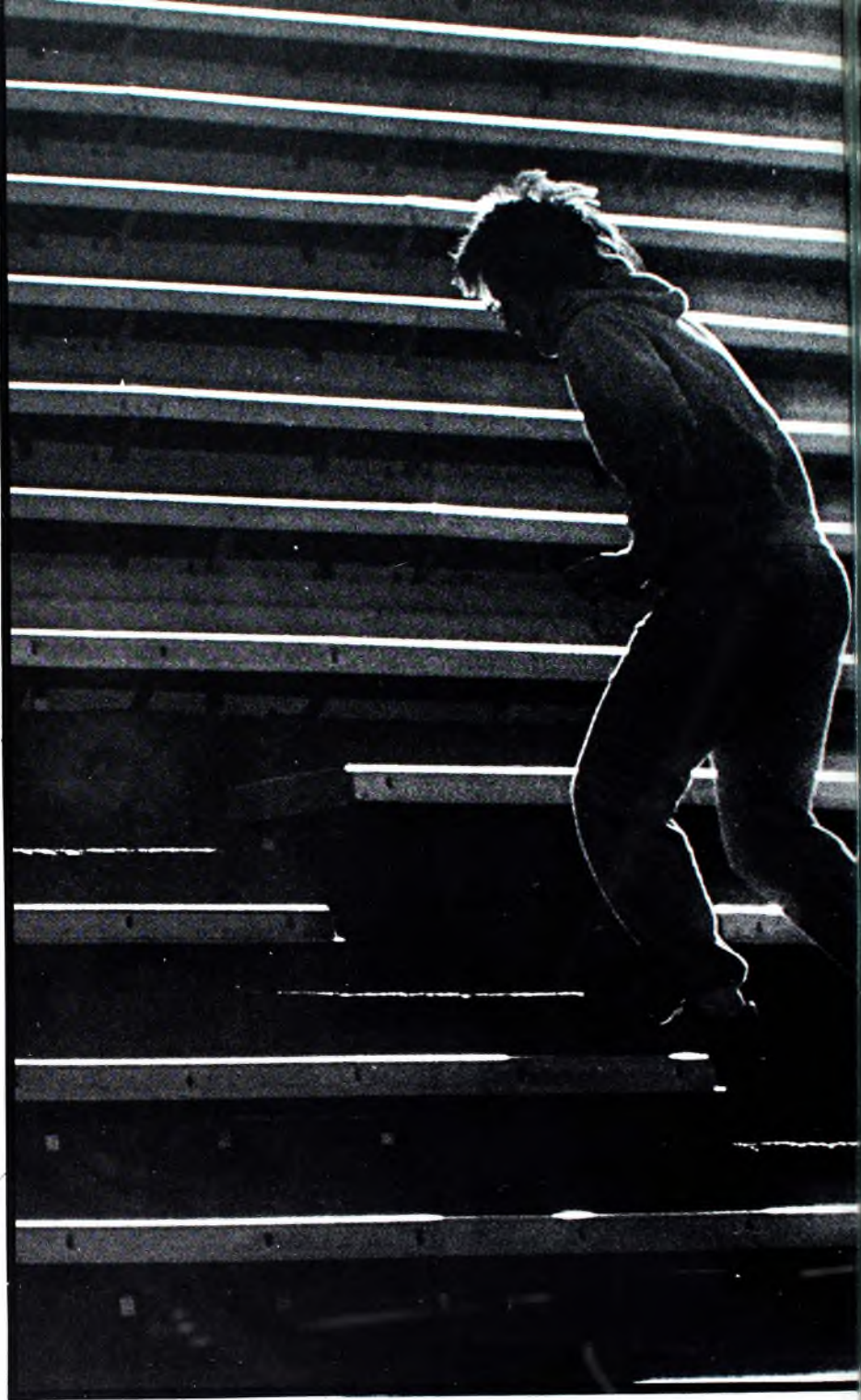




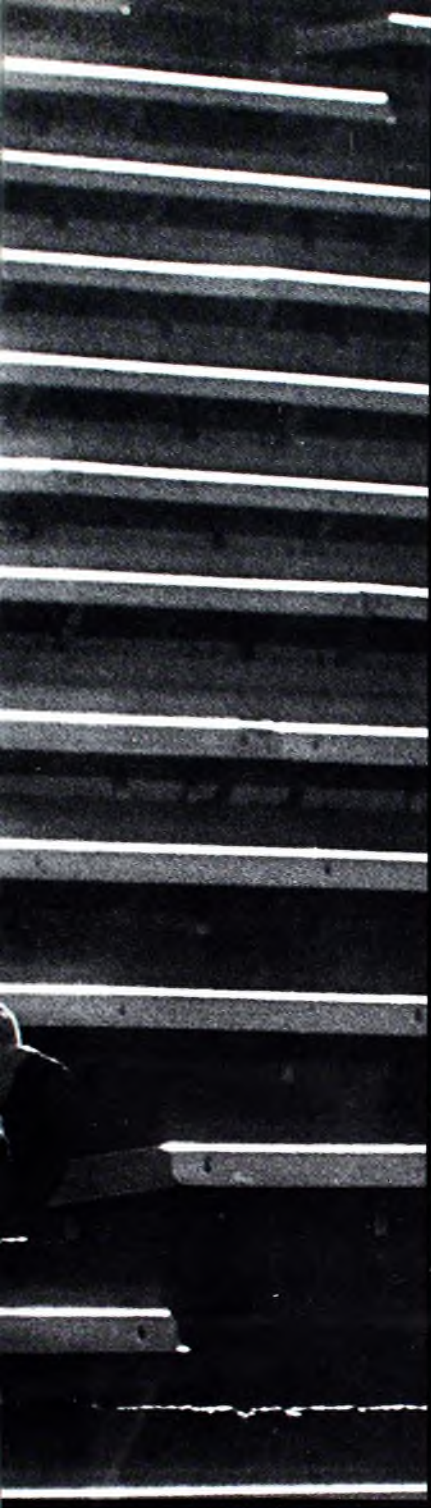

"Go West Young Lovers" on prom night.

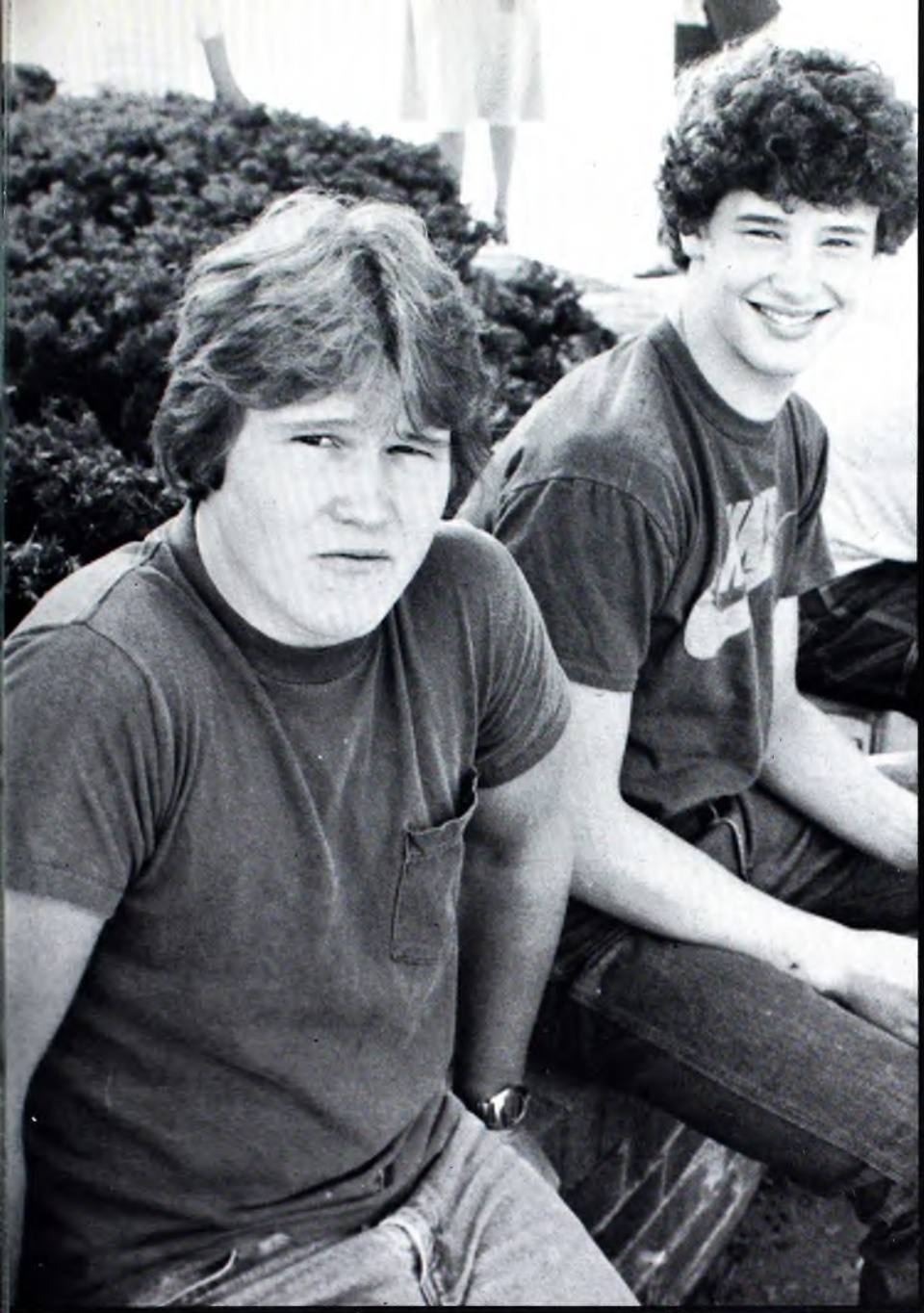
The last brush stroke

to preserve them forever.







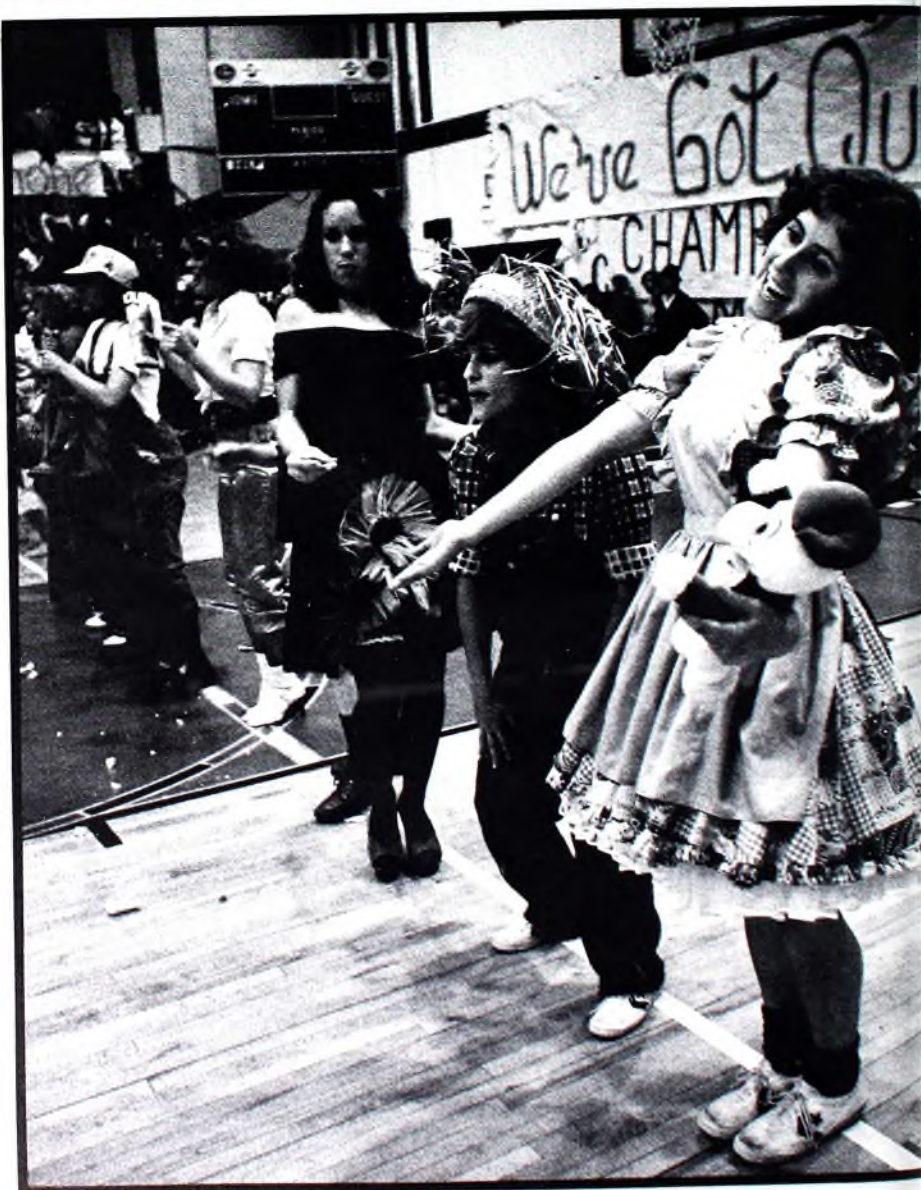

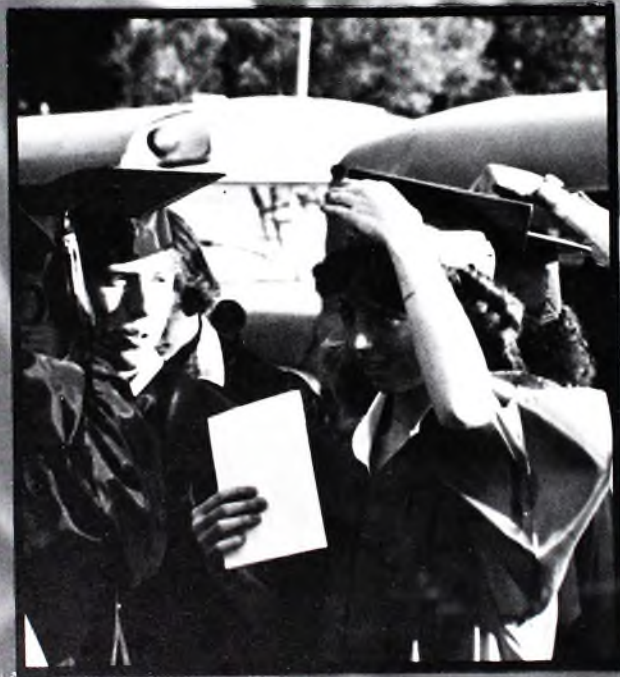
# GRADUATION

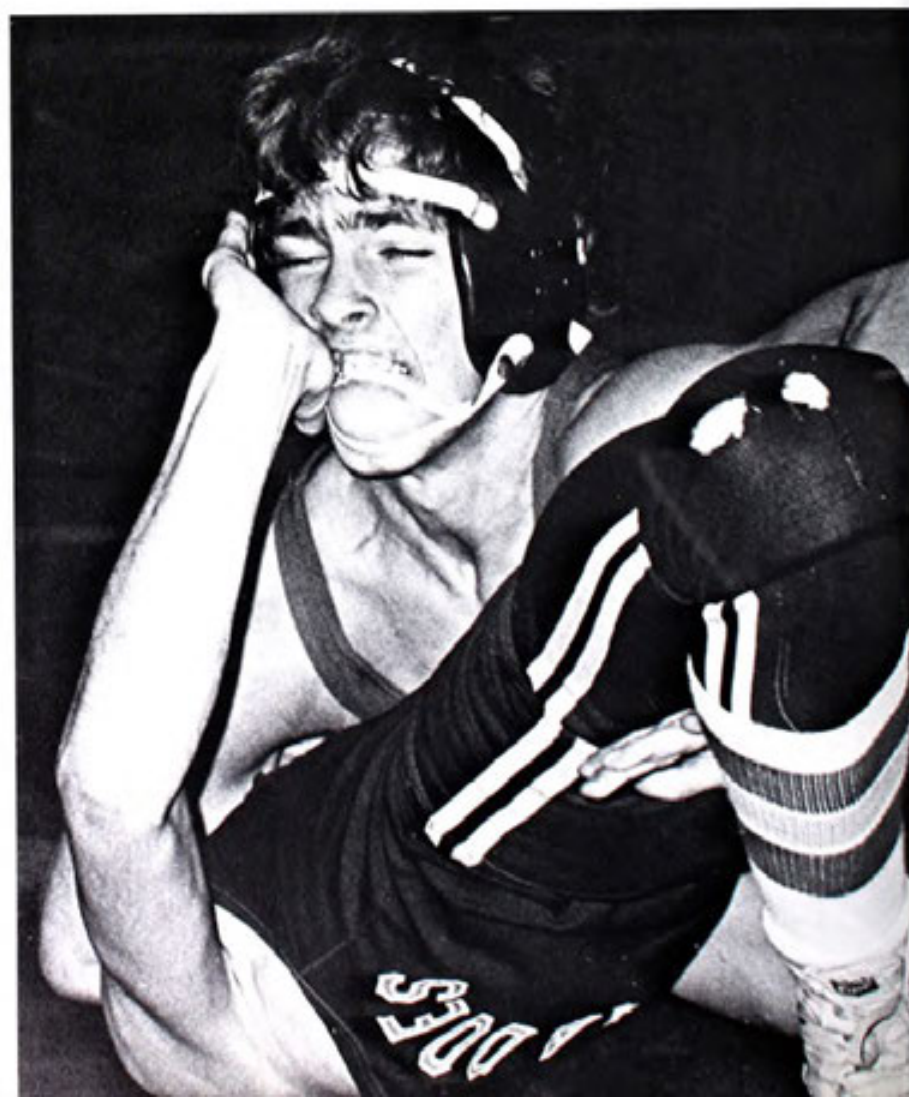
The Quaker Matmen were victorious in 15 out of 17 dual matches producing the best record ever at N.P.H.S.

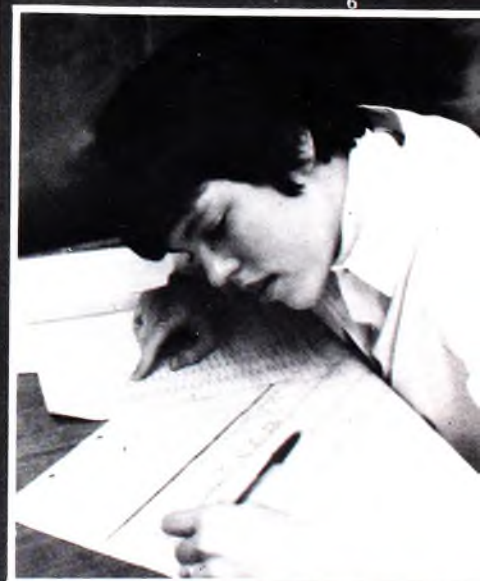


# DELPHIAN STAFF
