The young Quakers, coached by lim Roman, were predicted to finish fifth in the Cardinal Conference this year, but they battled for first right down to the last game of the season and only when it ended, were the Quakers second in the Conference. The team suffered defeat in their first game of the season to a tough Cincinnati Hughes team. but rebounded to win their next five games and only lose two more well-fought battles the whole season. Some of the 1979 post season honors went to Senior Co-Captain John Gray who was chosen as First Team All Cardinal Conference Offensive guard. Senior Co-Captain Ian Baley and Senior Andy Mallernee received honors for First Team All Cardinal Conference Defense.
