
















HOMECOMING

DREAMS




ICE CASTLES






GRADUATION

1980 proved to be a very trying year for the New Phila Track squad. It was a season which featured many underclassmen


carrying a major part of the load. Compiling the situation was an abundance of injuries














BASEBALL
