Student Council provided the setting for a memorable evening. Anna Johnson was DJ and set the stage for everyone to have "One of Those Dreams."









by Toni Basil was the favorite Top 40 Hit, while Journey took top honors for the best recording group. Clash and Stray Cats also followed closely behind Journey.




The 1983 prom, captured the romance of Paris. The gym lobby was transformed into a springtime garden complete with a fountain and gazebo.

Seniors Paul Burrier and Lisa Elliott were crowned prom king and queen. Students danced to the music of Champion.


Post prom activities moved to the Schoenbrunn Racquet Club where students enjoyed the music of Monterey. The eventful evening concluded with bowling and a movie.














## QUAKER LADIES CAGE 16-5 SEASON


## LADIES SHATTER TRACK RECORDS


Finally, our hard work and planning produced a spectacular prom, "An Evening in Paris" on May 7. We are eagerly anticipating our final year at NPHS.

### SOPHOMORES - CLASS OF 1985


