



will end the day.

















### **ESPAÑA**


Casual Atmosphere Enjoyed By All

The 83-84 Quakers were the first team since 1967 to have a perfect season with a 9-0 record.



We were now ready for our sixth victory, over archrival Dover.




#### Grapplers Have Successful Season



Both Coach Wherley and Coach Meeman were impressed with the improvement shown by the girls and are eagerly looking forward to future years.



The season ended on a sad note as the lady cagers lost a heart breaker 55-54 to Lancaster in the district finals.






















## TRI-HI-Y




