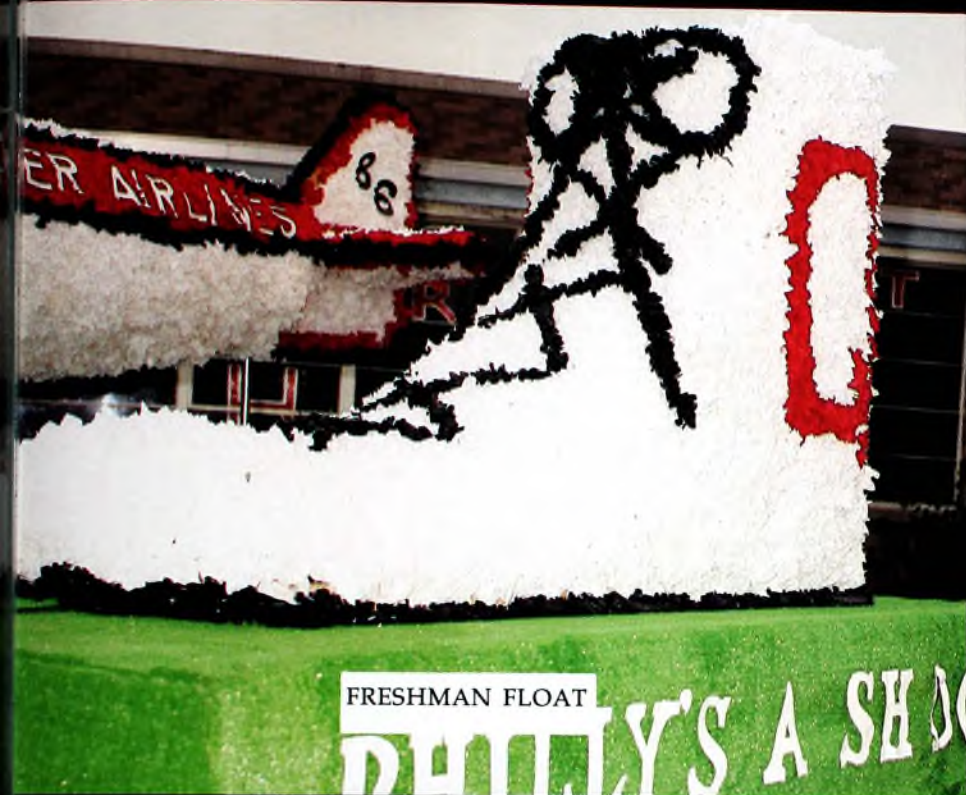

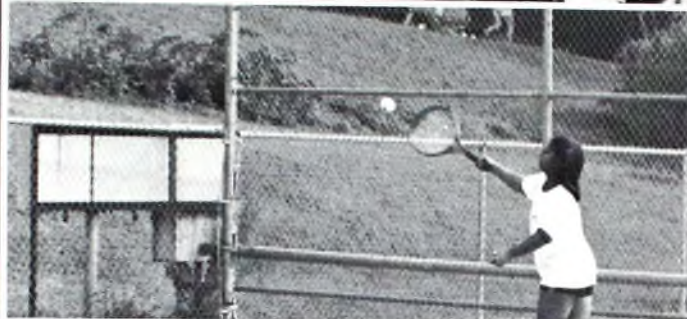

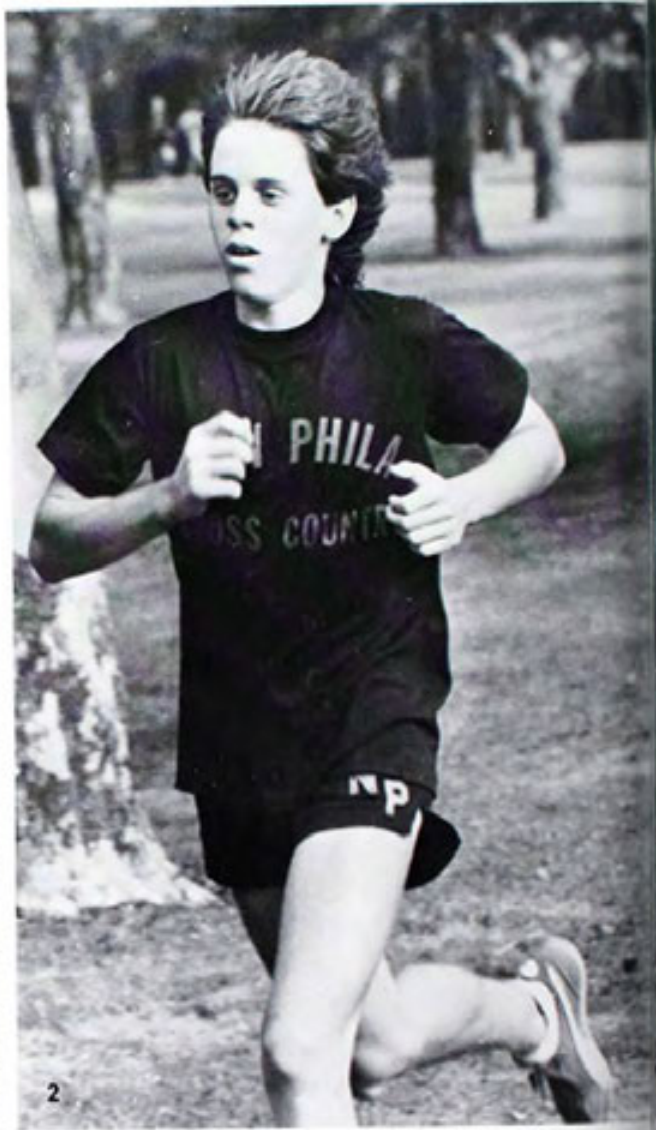
The 83-84 Quakers were the first team since 1967 to have a perfect season with

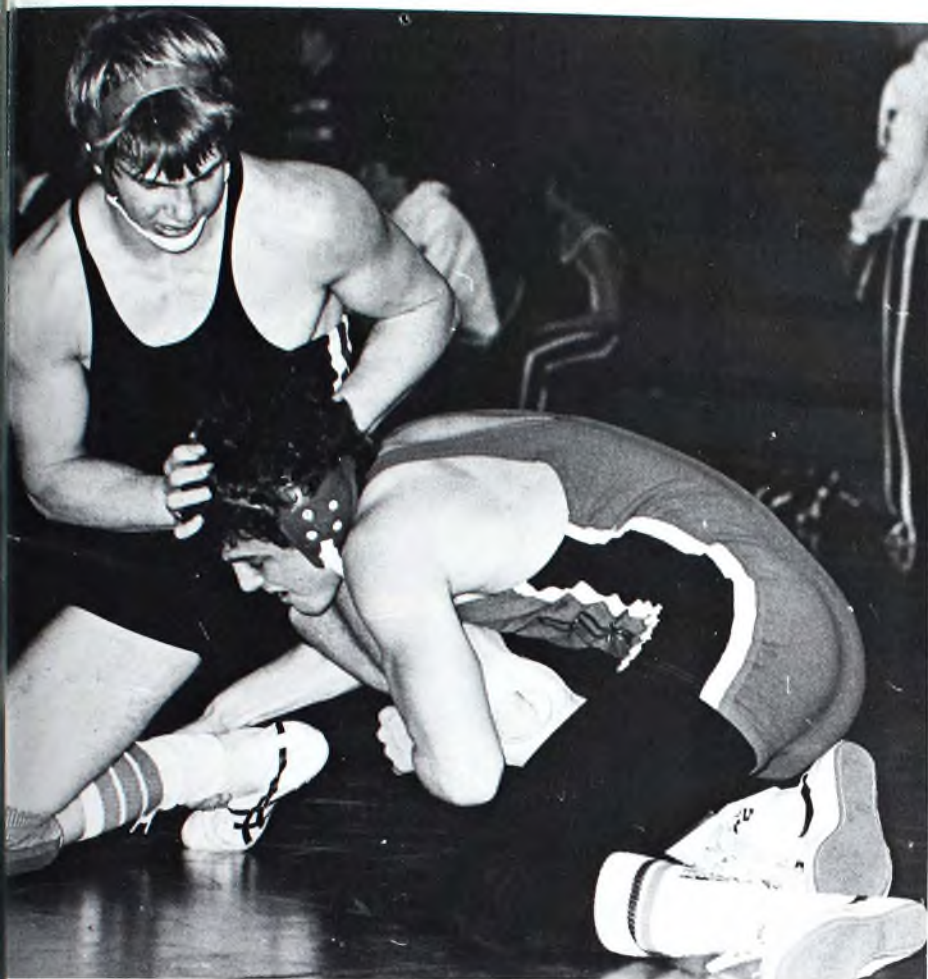
## Grapplers Have Successful Season
