FAIR WEEK '85 Many Recognized For Excellence


The 1985 Tuscarawas County Fair was a success in many ways. Records were set in attendance as well as the number of superior awards that were given.







Although both teams entered Dover's Crater Stadium with identical 2-7 records, the 81st annual Phila-Dover game proved to be the most exciting game of the season. Both teams came in hoping to end their seasons on a positive note. The Quakers drew first blood as Ed Veley poured in from a yard out on New Phila's opening drive. But the Quakers failed to capitalize on chances later on in the game, and the Tornadoes put together a nifty drive and scored their lone touchdown late in the game. They scored the winning points on the two-point conversion that followed, giving them an 8-7 victory.

New Phila had several players who played respectable games, including their junior tailback Ed Veley. He bolted and slashed through Dover's often stingy defense and took game rushing honors with 119 yards. The Ouakers ended up with a disappointing 2-8 record, but their season had its bright spots. This loss to Dover especially hurt them as they failed to bring coach Ward Holdsworth a victory in his final game as the Quaker head coach. The Quakers are looking to start a new winning streak with next years season ending classic, as their two-game winning streak was snapped in the 3rd oldest gridiron rivalry in Ohio.



gave seven performances in four days and they also performed for the community pep rally. The guys really looked sharp this year in their new tuxedos and now the girls are working for new dresses.









The fact that a teacher too was killed is very close to me. I feel as if I've lost one of my own. It was obvious that Christa McAuliffe loved her job too. Her students will surely be better for her efforts.

Having witnessed three assassinations and an attempt on President Reagan, the feelings I have now can only be compared with those I had then.

Hopefully the NASA program will learn and go forward. We kid ourselves if we believe no other tragedy will ever occur.

As John Glenn put it, "Someday, we knew something like this would happen, we just wanted to push it back forever."








Gas Prices Hit 10 Year Low







RED & BLACK PACK Shows Spirit Throughout the Year





WORK PROGRAMS

Give Valuable Experience

Three work programs, M.E., O.W.E., and O.W.A., are offered at NPHS.

The Marketing Education class, which is taught by Mr. Roman, prepares students for careers in business by teaching marketing, merchandising, and sales. This business program is designed for seniors only.

The students are given an opportunity for work experience by requiring them to attend school for only a half day. After school, the students need to work an average of 15 hours per week, but most average 25 hours. Three reliable community businesses that have repeatedly served as training stations are Schwartz Kline's, Buehler's, and Daniel's.

O.W.E. is a work program

for Sophomores, Juniors, and Seniors that is instructed by Mr. Chaney. These students spend half of their school day on the job, also.

Then, they spend two periods working in the school system. Some work in the cafeteria, the A-V Office, or even in the elementary schools.

VOLLEYBALL Best Season Ever





The 1985-86 Lady Quakers completed a very successful season by winning their second Cardinal Conference Championship and advancing to the regionals for the 2nd time in the sports history.


