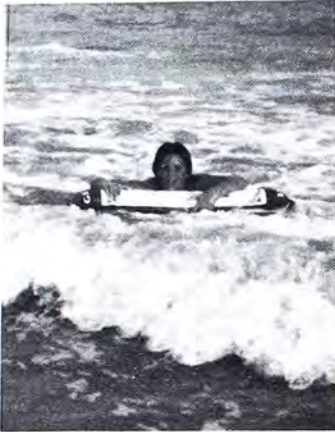

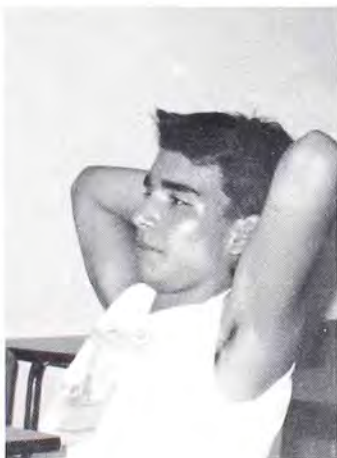

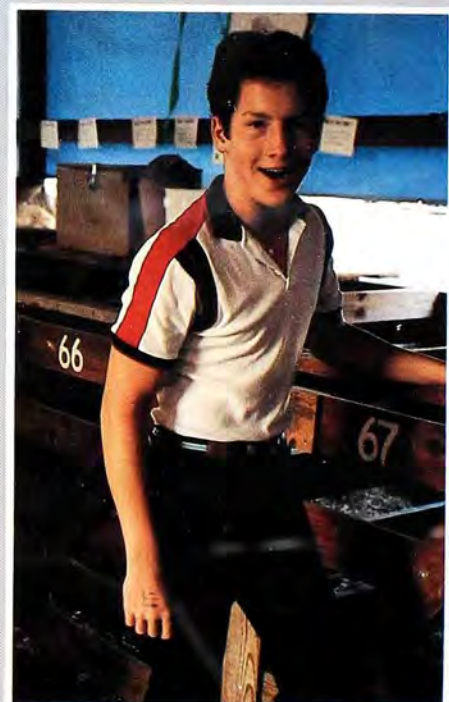
FAIR WEEK '85

Thanks to all those who participated and make the fair the exciting annual event it is.



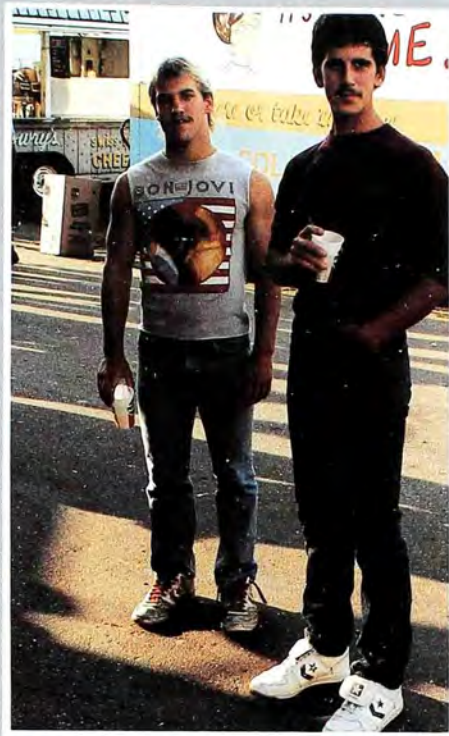

Starts the Year Off Right

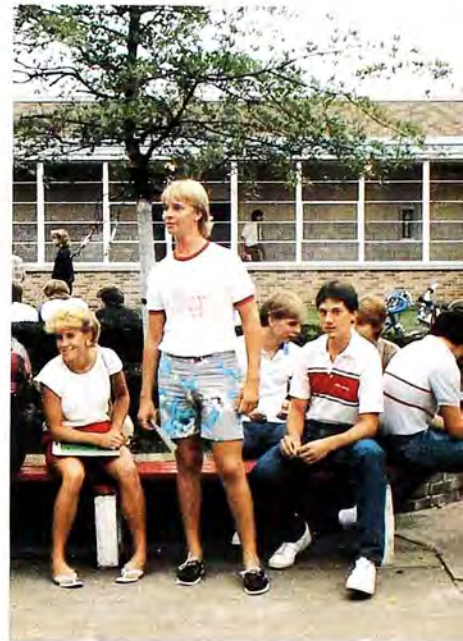

The old stand-by outfit of comfortable jeans and an big sweatshirt advertising a college was by far the most casual clothing seen at NPBS.

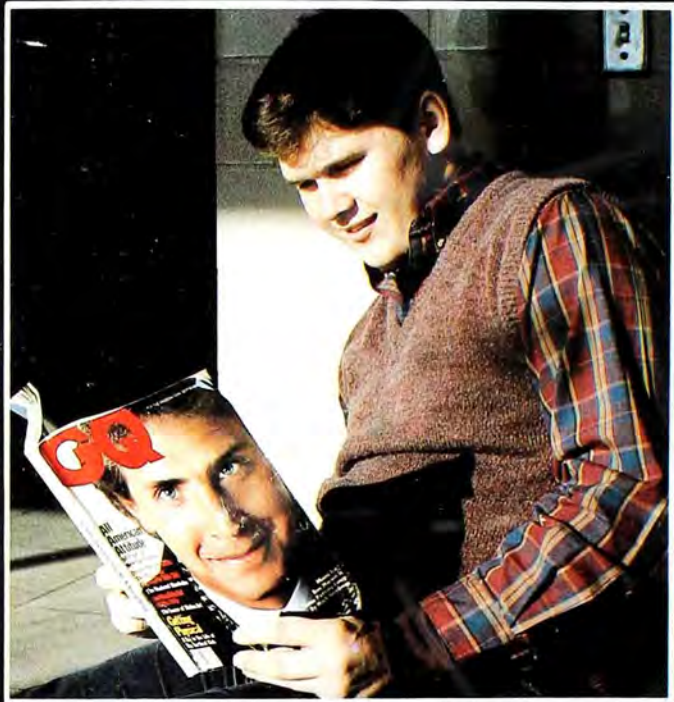
Oversize was definitely in. The bigger the better. Guys got into this by donning their baggy jeans and a large sweater. Girls also wore oversize shaker-knit sweaters

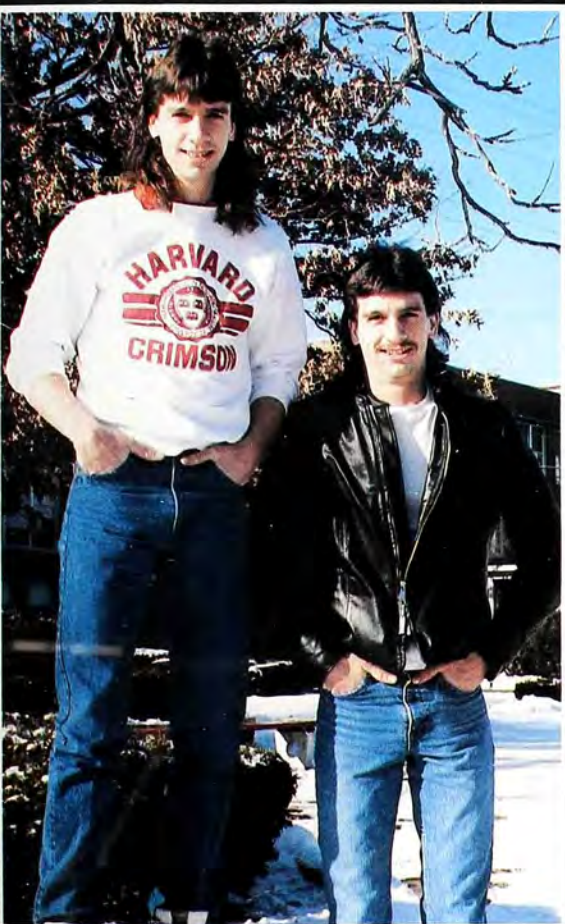

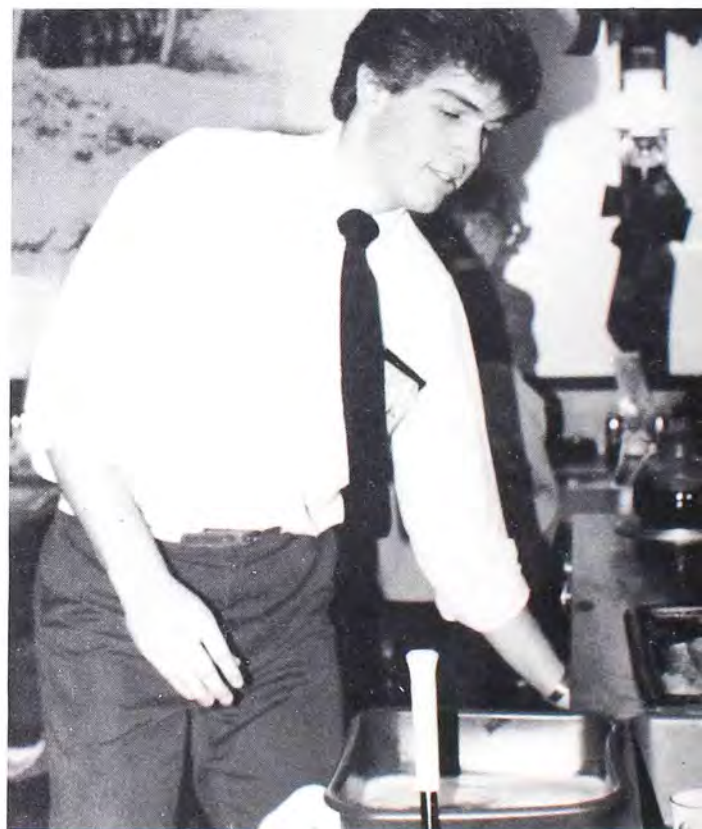

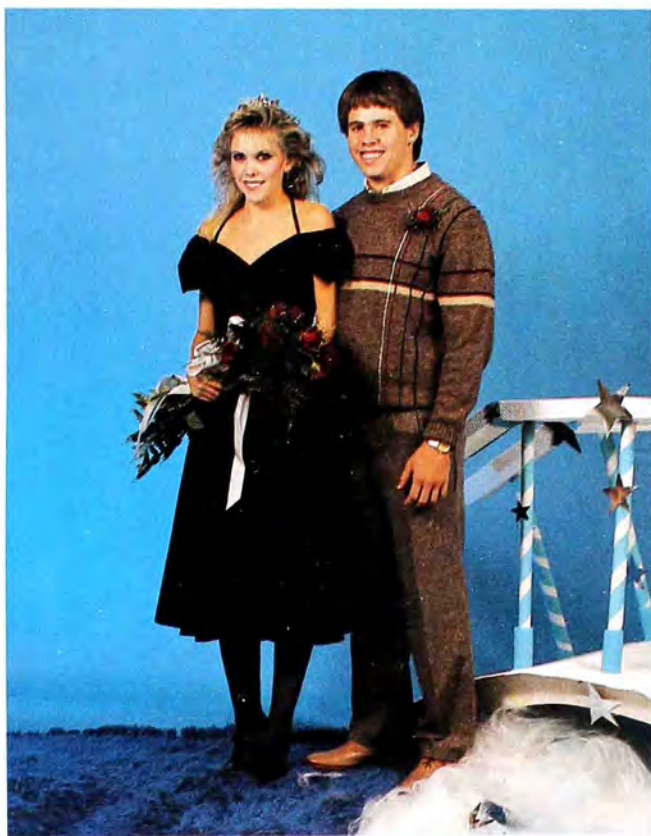
Quakers Defeated But Spirit Lives On

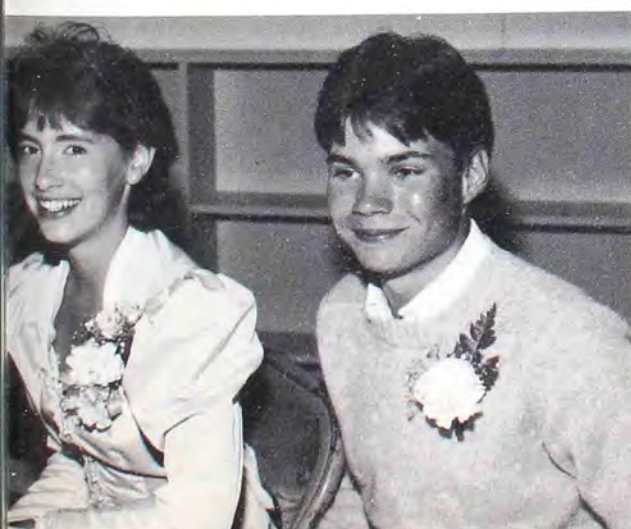

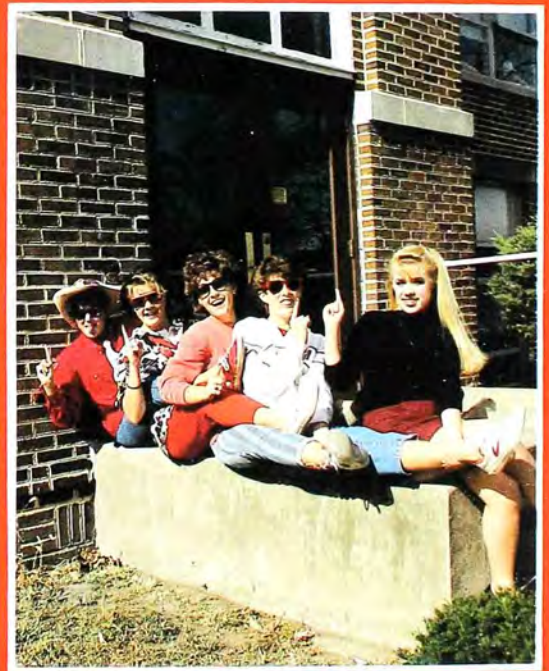
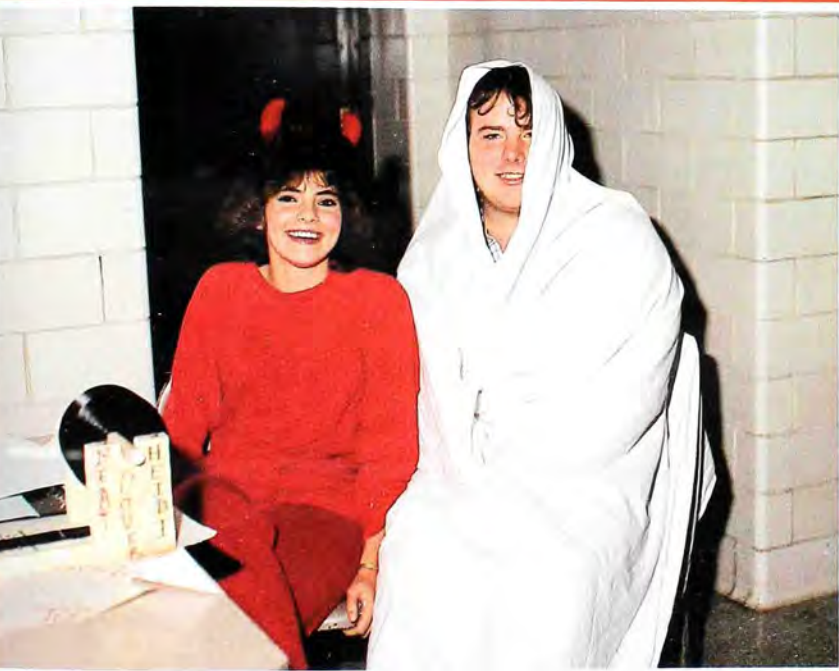

Although both teams entered Dover's Crater Stadium with identical 2-7 records, the 81st annual Phila-Dover game proved to be the most exciting game of the season. Both teams came in hoping to end their seasons on a positive note. The Quakers drew first blood as Ed Veley poured in from a yard out on New Phila's opening drive. But the Quakers failed to capitalize on chances later on in the game, and the Tornadoes put together a nifty drive and scored their lone touchdown late in the game. They scored the winning points on the two-point conversion that followed, giving them an 8-7 victory.

New Phila had several players who played respectable games, including their junior tailback Ed Veley. He bolted and slashed through Dover's often stingy defense and took game rushing honors with 119 yards. The Quakers ended up with a disappointing 2-8 record, but their season had its bright spots. This loss to Dover especially hurt them as they failed to bring coach Ward Holdsworth a victory in his final game as the Quaker head coach. The Quakers are looking to start a new winning streak with next year's season ending classic, as their two-game winning streak was snapped in the 3rd oldest gridiron rivalry in Ohio.



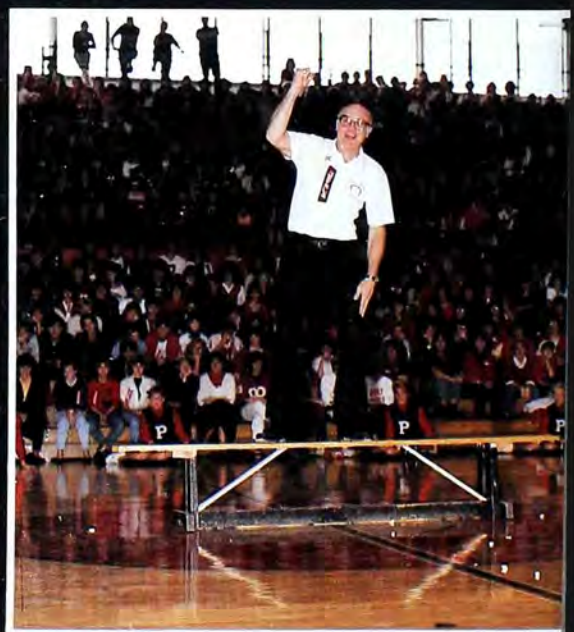
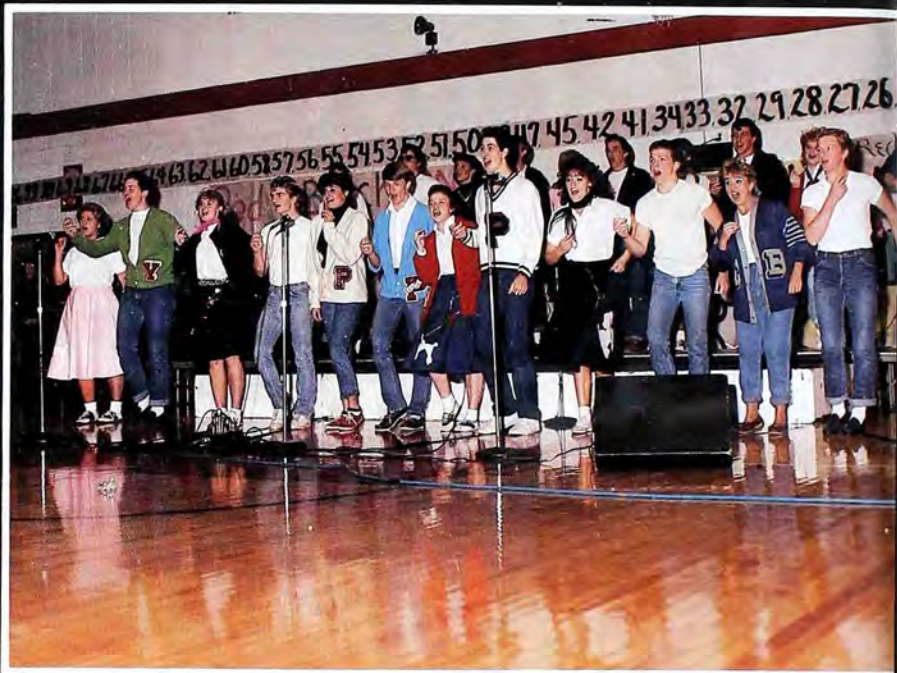
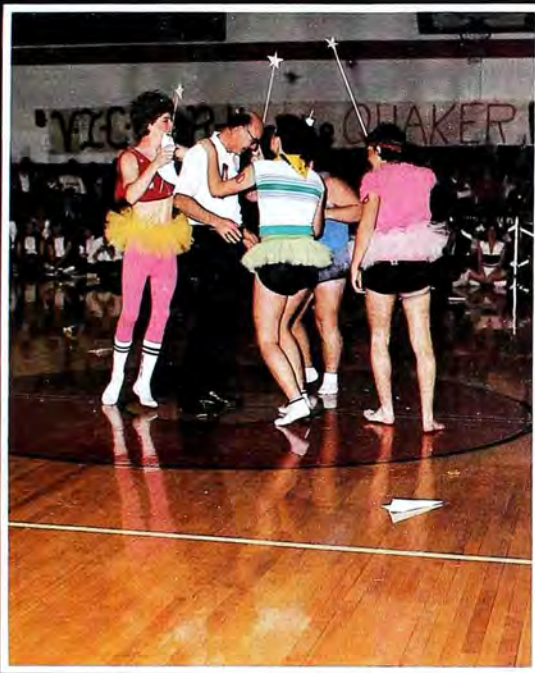

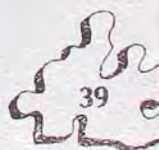

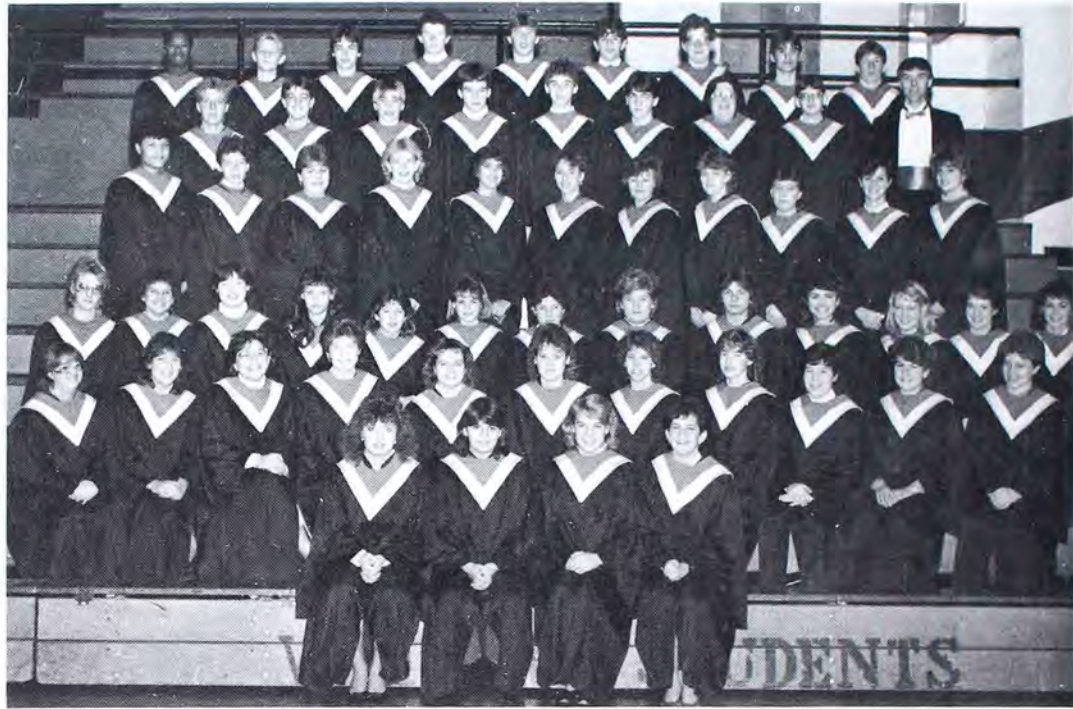

Hopefully the NASA program will learn and go forward. We kid ourselves if we believe no other tragedy will ever occur.

As John Glenn put it, "Someday, we knew something like this would happen, we just wanted to push it back forever."

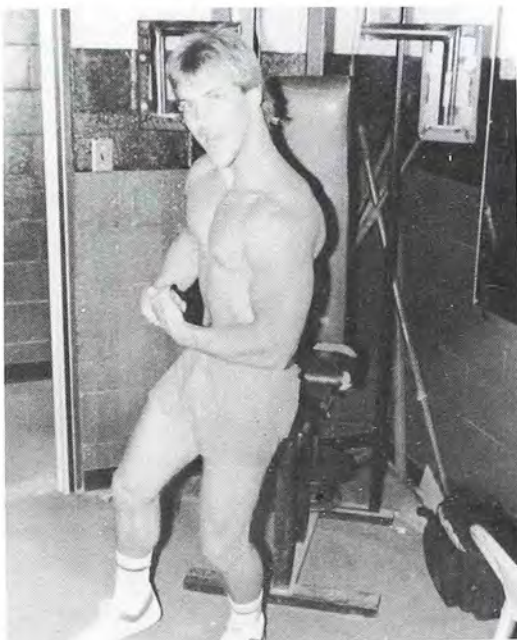




After School Workout

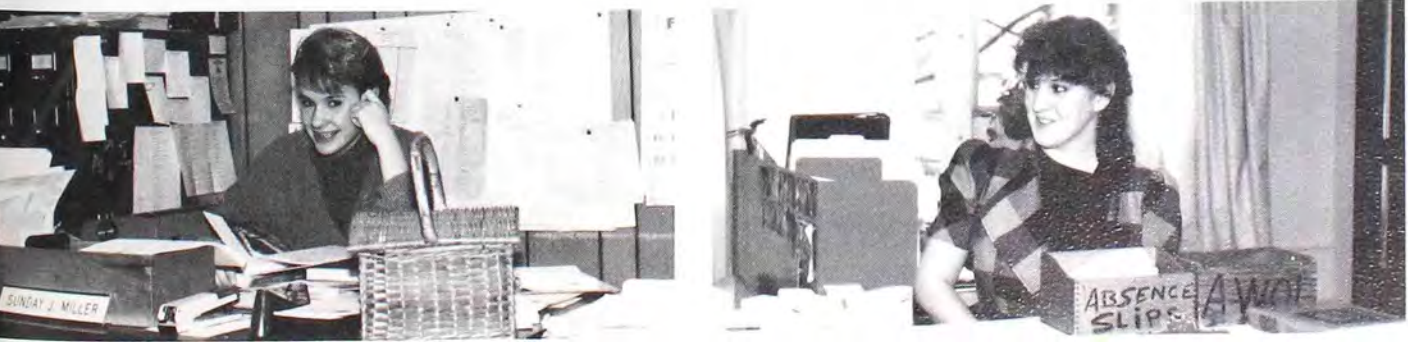

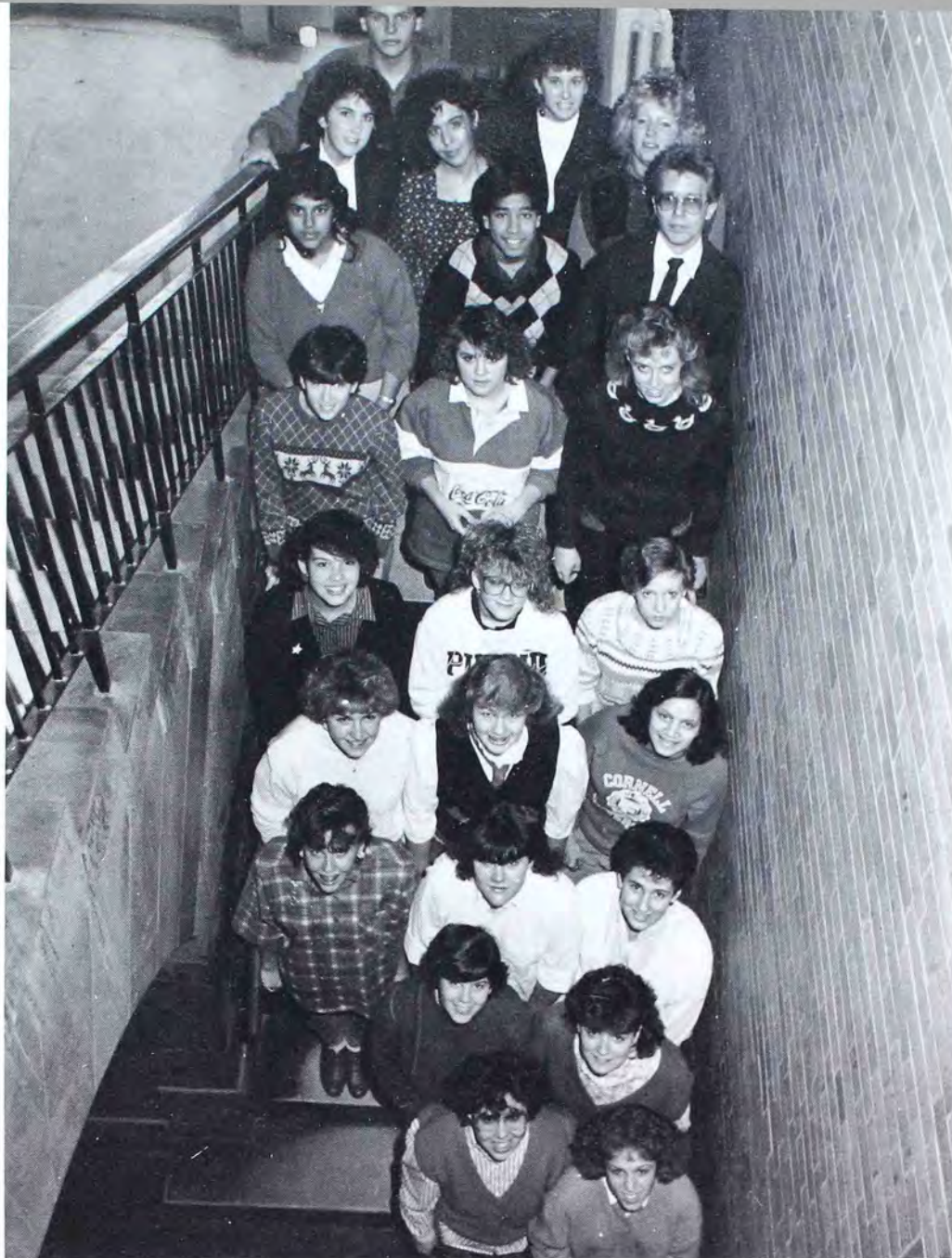

WORK PROGRAMS

Give Valuable Experience

Three work programs, M.E., O.W.E., and O.W.A., are offered at NPHS.

The Marketing Education class, which is taught by Mr. Roman, prepares students for careers in business by teaching marketing, merchandising, and sales. This business program is designed for seniors only.

The students are given an opportunity for work experience by requiring them to attend school for only a half day. After school, the students need to work an average of 15 hours per week, but most average 25 hours. Three reliable community businesses that have repeatedly served as training stations are Schwartz Kline's, Buehler's, and Daniel's.

O.W.E. is a work program

for Sophomores, Juniors, and Seniors that is instructed by Mr. Chaney. These students spend half of their school day on the job, also.

The third work program, Mr. Sattler's O.W.A., is for Freshmen only. His students are in class with him for two periods. During these periods they are taught math and one related subject. Then, they spend two periods working in the school system. Some work in the cafeteria, the A-V Office, or even in the elementary schools.

The work programs are an excellent option for many students. They provide all the benefits of school, work, and credits for graduation.

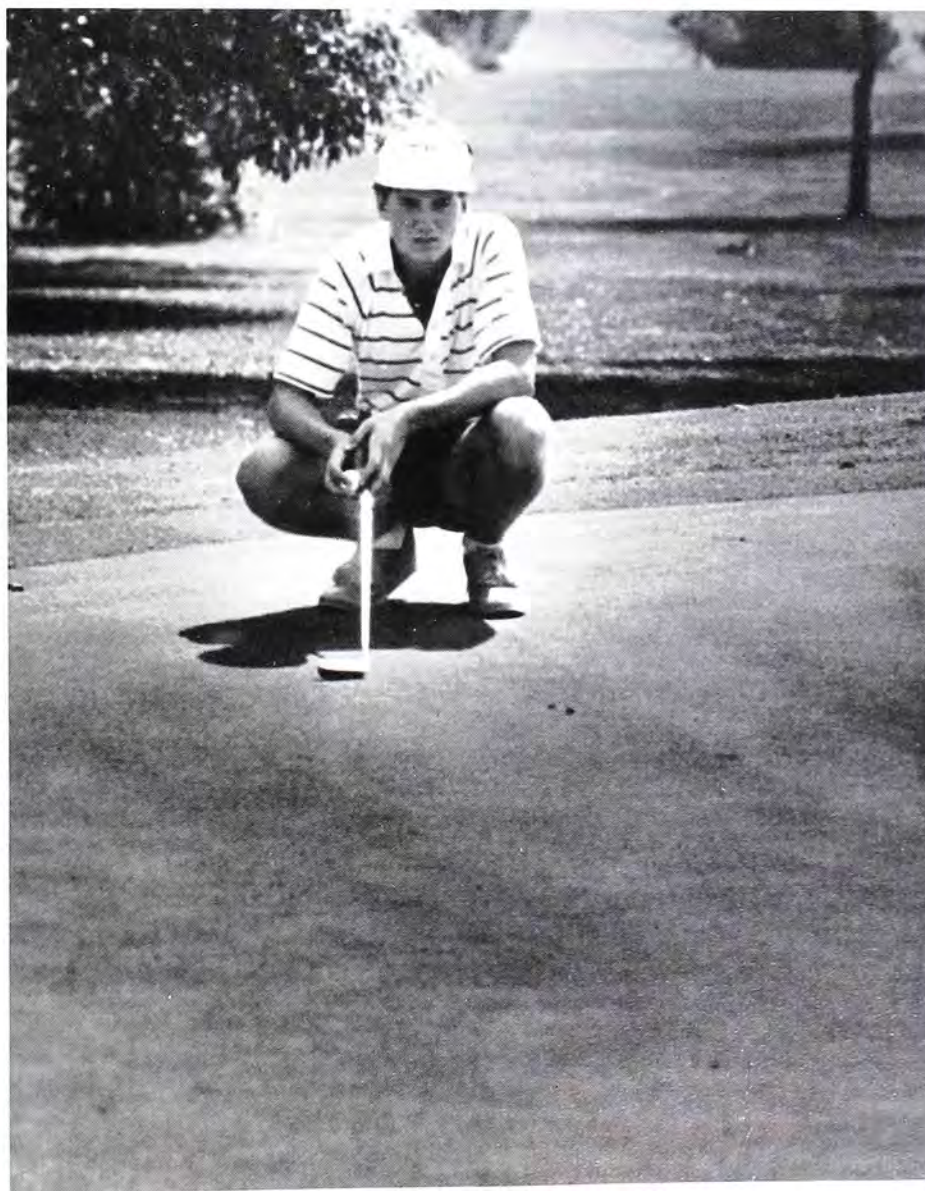

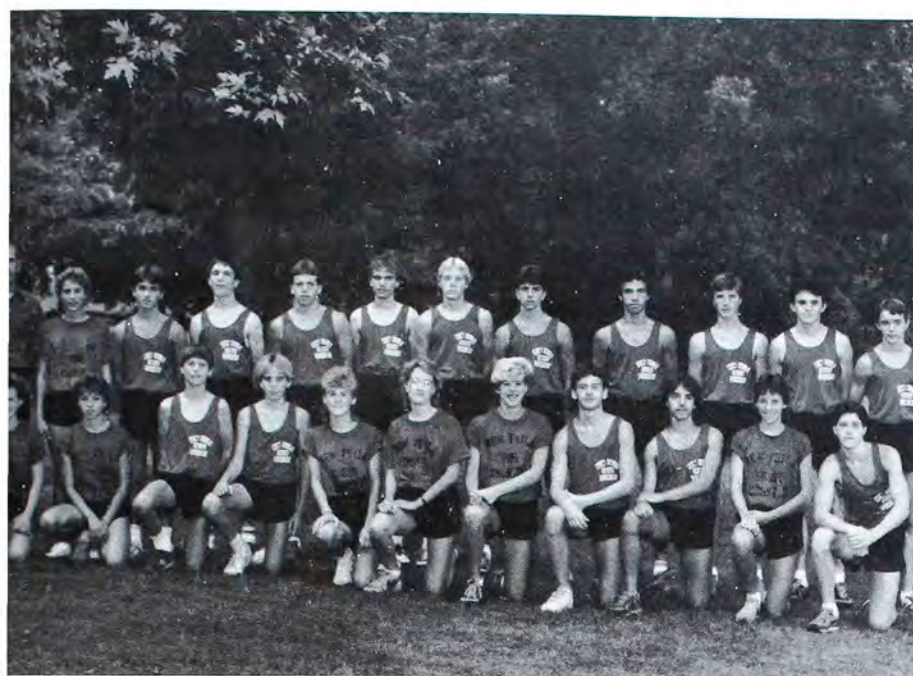

Although it was a disappointing season the players always gave everything to the games played. That gives us all pride in the players. We have much to look forward to as we try to rebuild and improve on this year's record.



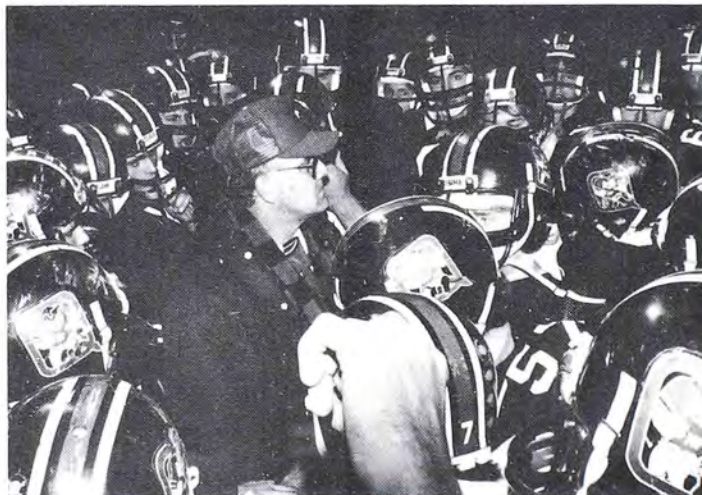

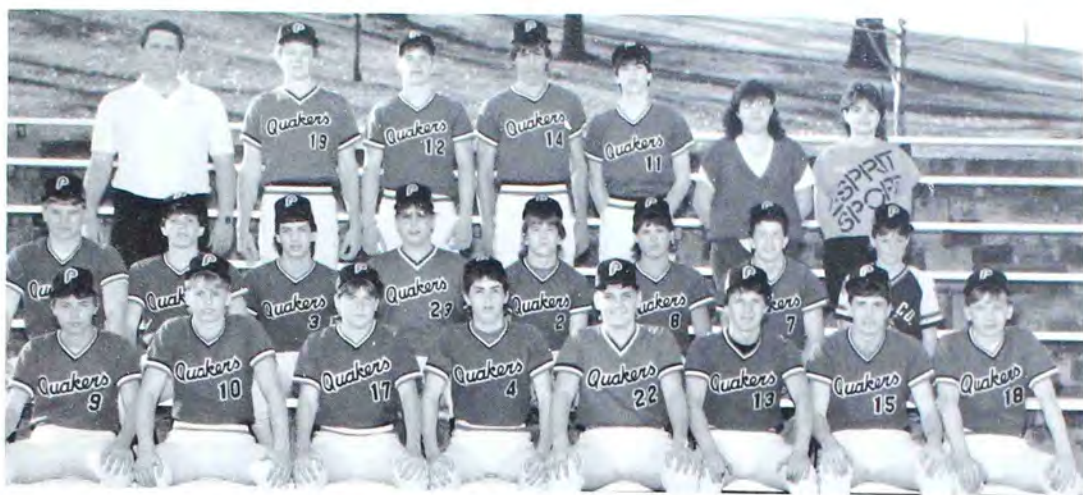

then hopefully to State. Unfortunately George Uschold broke his hand towards the end of season so Dean Green took his spot. The Reserve team also had a good season.



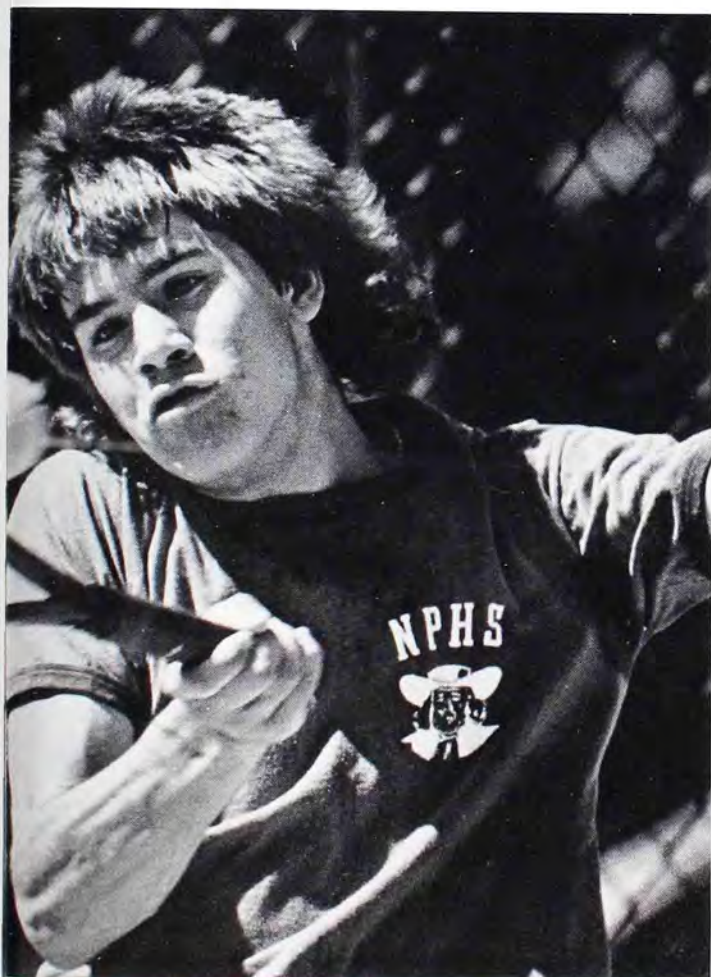
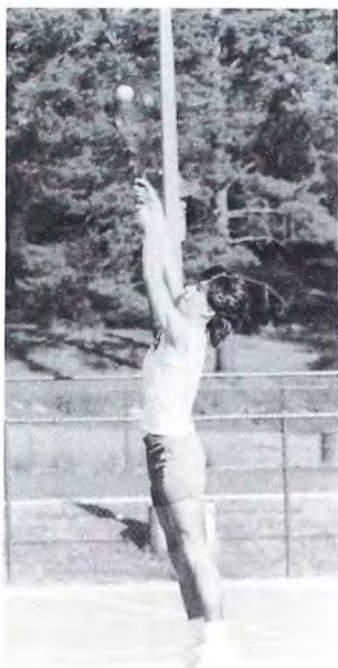
