


#### A Time To Socialize








#### CO Fun and Rewards R






s the school year approached,






## Lead On Quaker Spirit







The Quakers sent Mike Chamberlain and Chris Miller to State. Mike Chamberlain placed 5th in the State Tournament.




#### Girls' Have Outstanding Season




## Just Another Manic Morning C


















## COLOPHON

Thanks also to Jim Barbour and the


