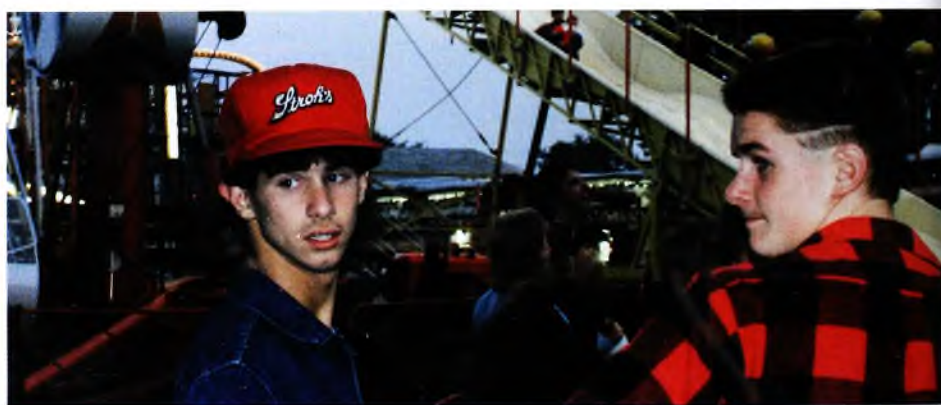


COUNTY FAIR

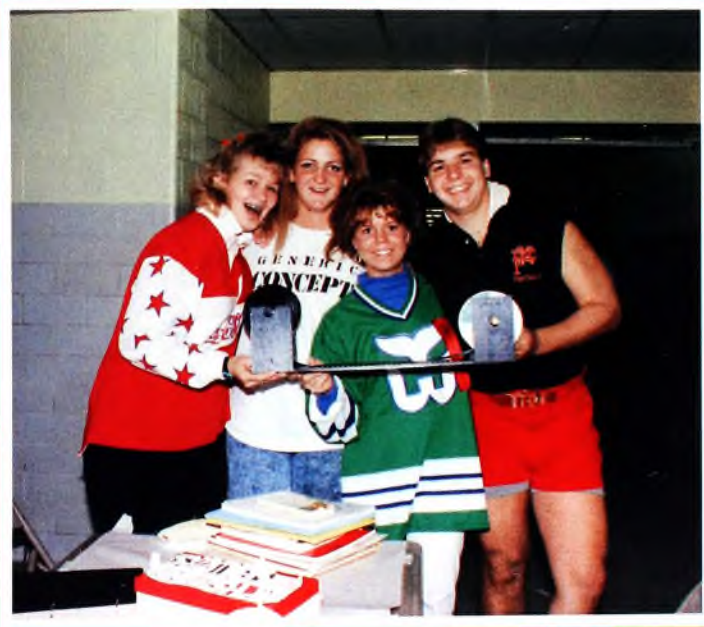

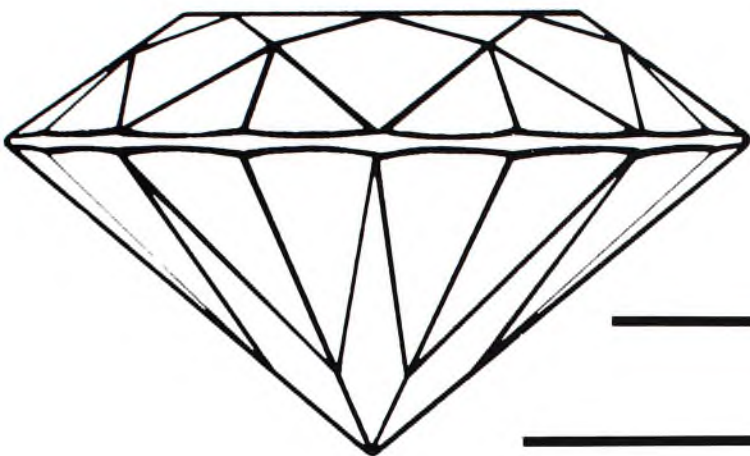

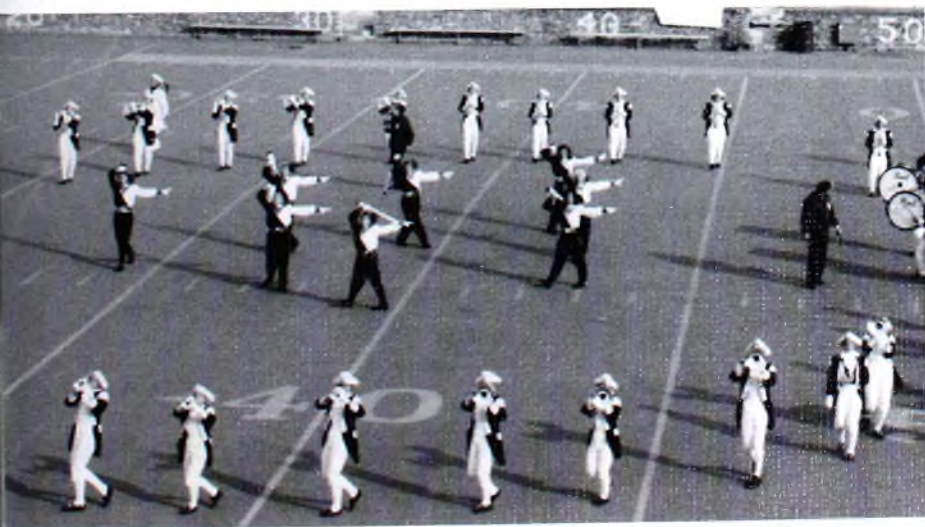

Preserves Memories of NPHS

As the school year approached, Delphian Staff members, under the direction of advisor Jason Young and editor Jenny Shoup, planned for the Seventy-fifth Edition of the Yearbook here at NPHS. Along with Jenny Shoup, members Kirsten McGarry and Tom Jacobs attended a yearbook camp at Walsh College for help in planning the 1987-1988 Delphian. While at camp, plans were developed for the yearbook budget, which was to be the largest amount of money spent for a

NPHS yearbook as of yet.

A record number of ads was sold by the staff to help with the cost, and community support was given by local businesses, which furnished prizes for drawings throughout yearbook sales. A record number of yearbooks were sold during the first sale. After a year of computer problems plaguing the staff, a new IBM PC was purchased and has helped staff members meet deadlines.

The Delphian staff was awarded a certificate from the yearbook company,

ICP, for being one of six schools to meet all of their deadlines successfully. During Phila. - Dover week the Delphian staff also decorated their door and came in second in that contest.

There are of course always problems but the Delphian Staff worked through them and produced the work seen here. 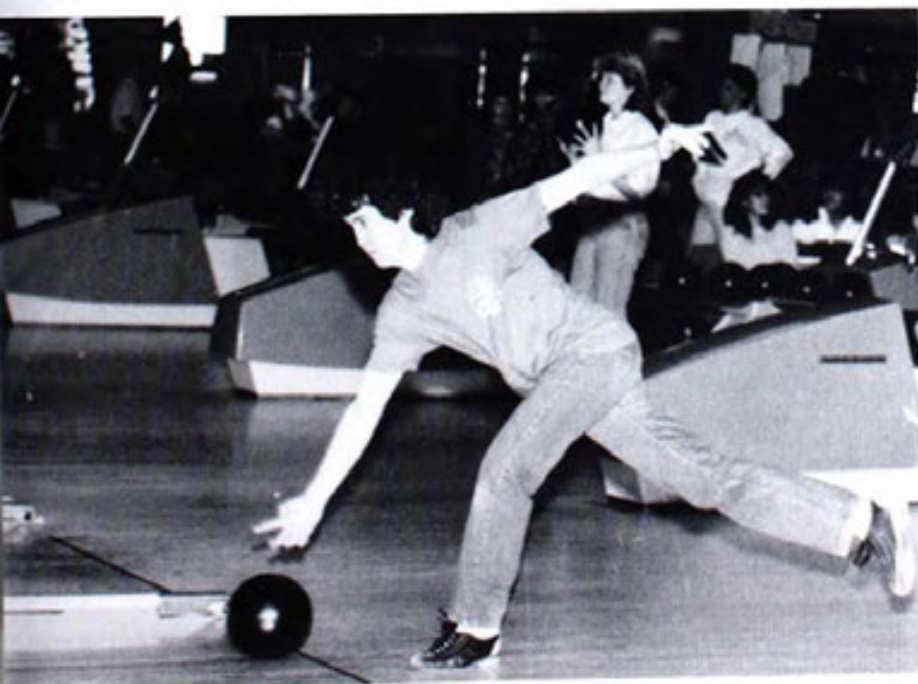

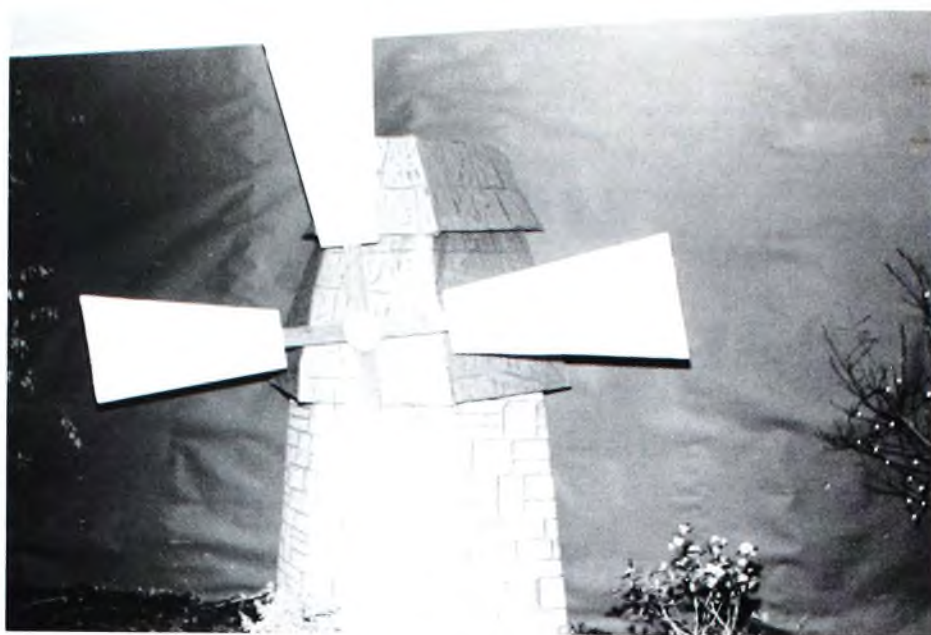

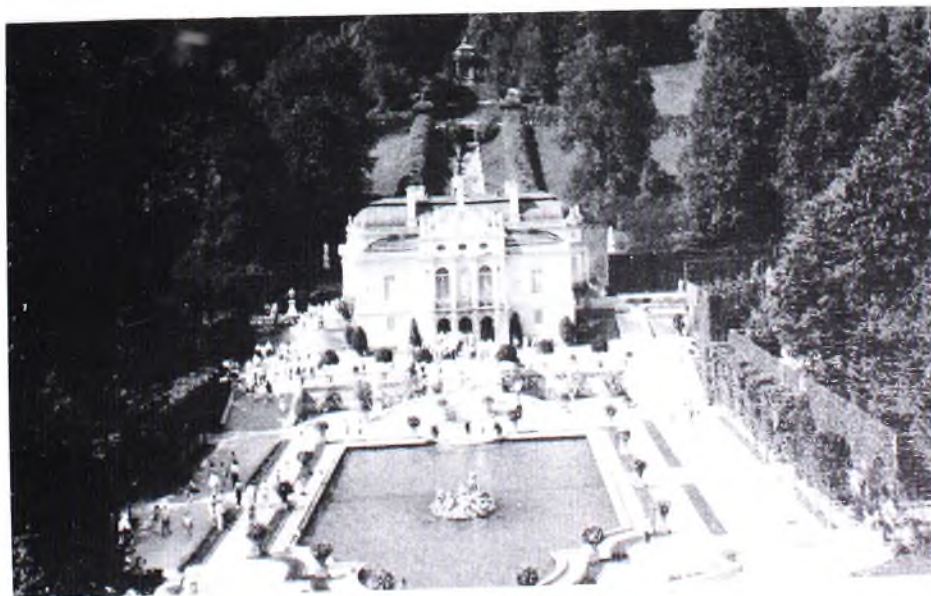

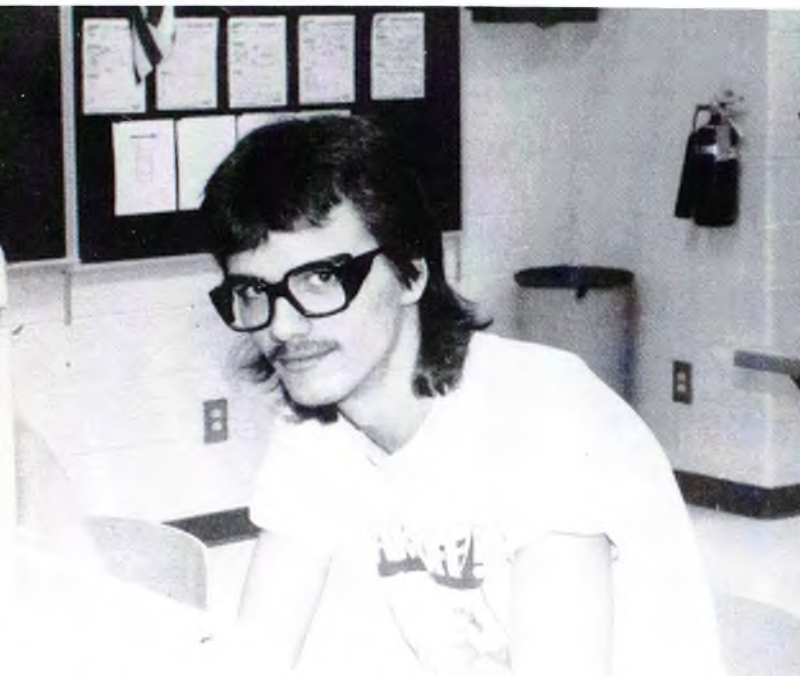
A Jump Into The Future

The Quakers sent Mike Chamberlain and Chris Miller to State. Mike Chamberlain placed 5th in the State Tournament.

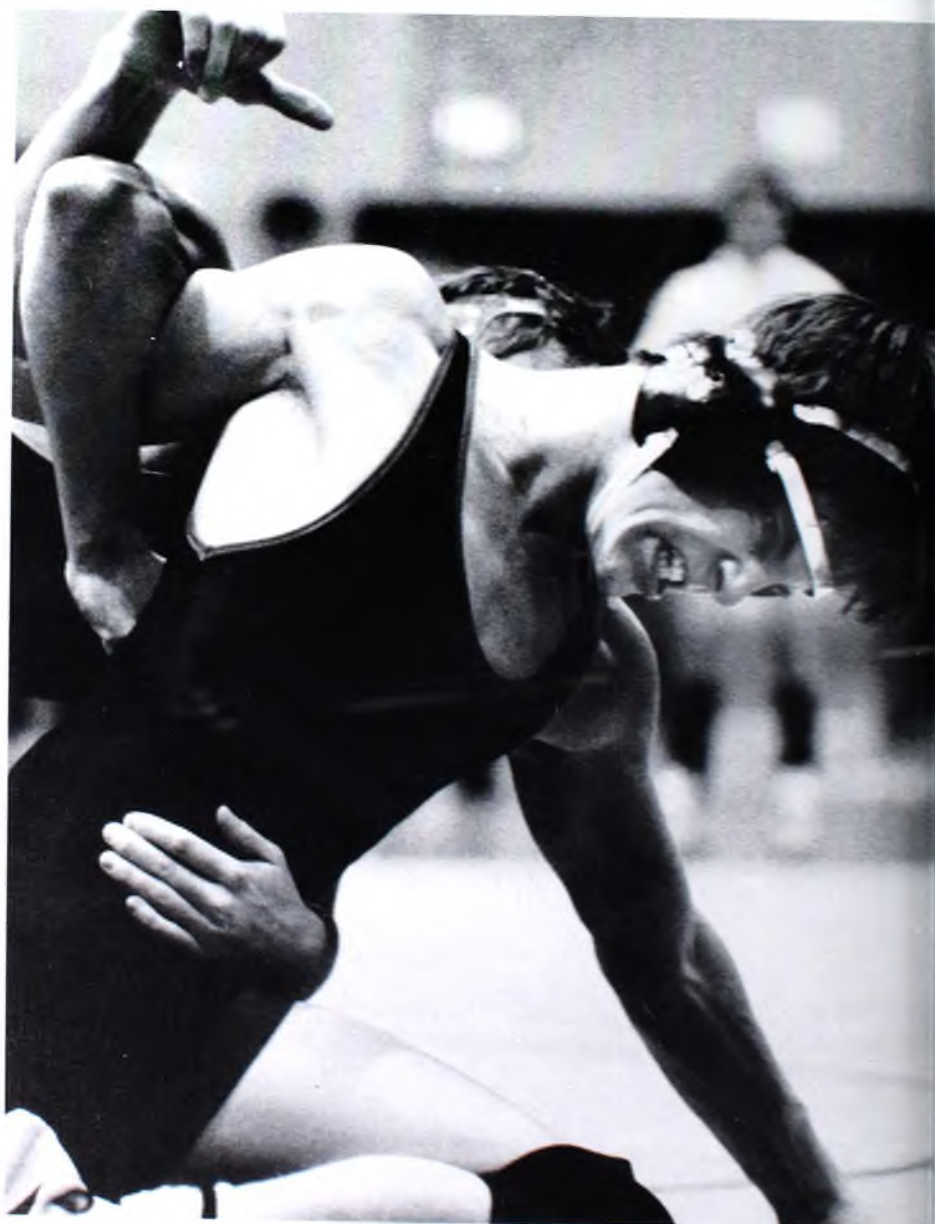

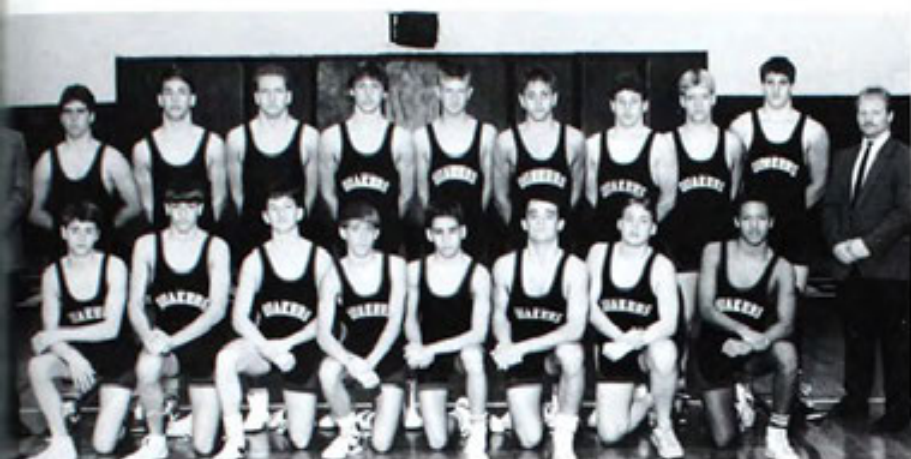

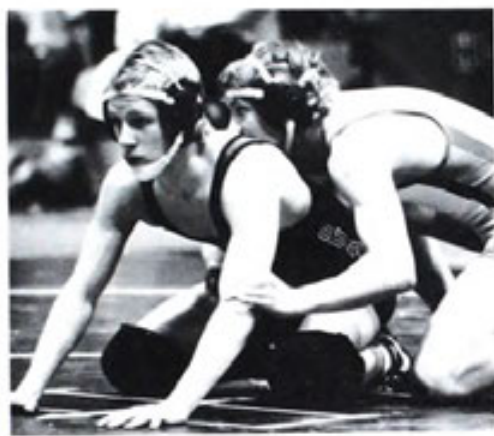

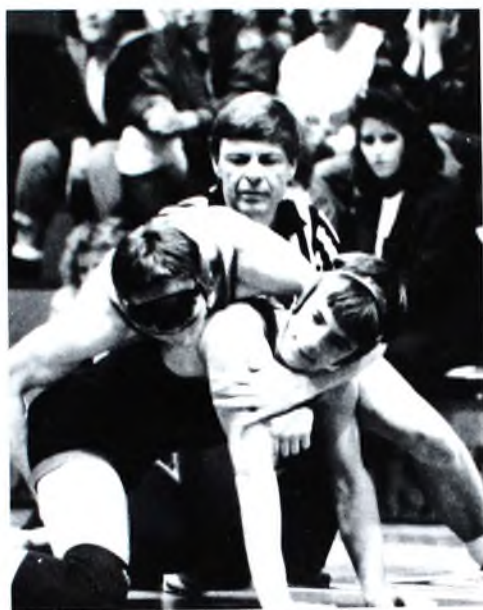

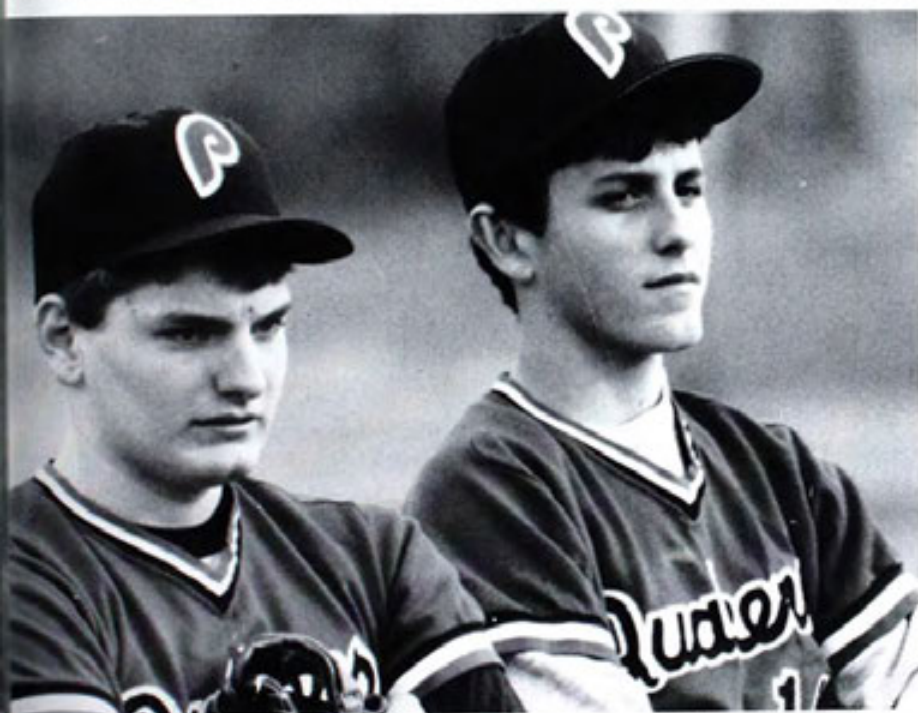

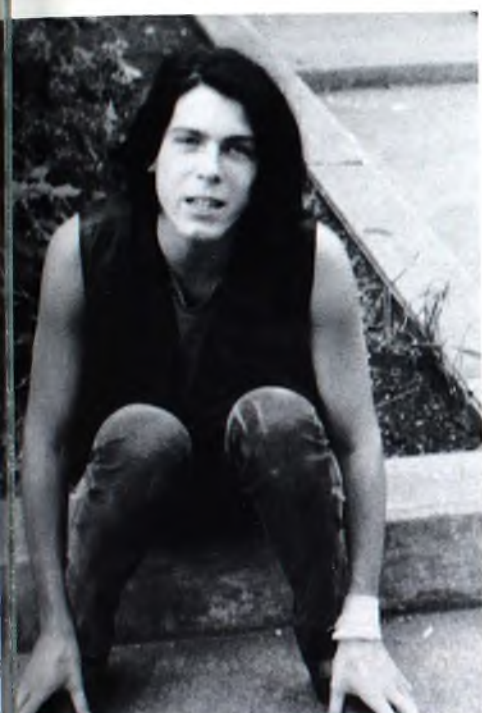
Seniors Last Fling

staff at ICP-Herff Jones for their help in designing and bringing together our ideas. With their help and Mr. Young's relentless nagging we met all our deadlines for the second year. This has earned us another plaque, which we should all be proud of. All staff members learned how "precious" those deadlines are.

The budget totaled nearly \$21,000 for this Anniversary Edition. \$5,040 was raised in advertising and \$660 in patron contributions. Money was also received from underclass picture day and dual memory picture day. Books sold for \$20.00 early in the year to \$35.00 for those who waited for those extra copies in September.

The cover is vibra text antique red, grained with french straight base material. The diamonds and rule are blind embossed and silver top stamped. The title and date are embossed and black

silk screened. Hinge copy is embossed and black silk screened. The 'C' art silk screened on a hologram. The end sheets are vibracolor with regency the text paper. The binding is signatur. The body type is Tiffany Light. Hinge line is 50 % Metabold with the subhead Saul Bold Italic overburned. Folio titles are Tiffany Bold. Captions are Avant Garde Bold. Quotes are Stymie Italic. Ads are Tiffany Bold. Scoreboards are Avant Garde Bold. These type styles vary in point size from 48 down to 12. The use of four color amounted to 100 pages which is an all time high amount of color in a DELPHIAN.

The Four C's was printed by Inter Collegiate Press/Herff Jones in Shawnee Mission, Kansas. Press run was 725.
