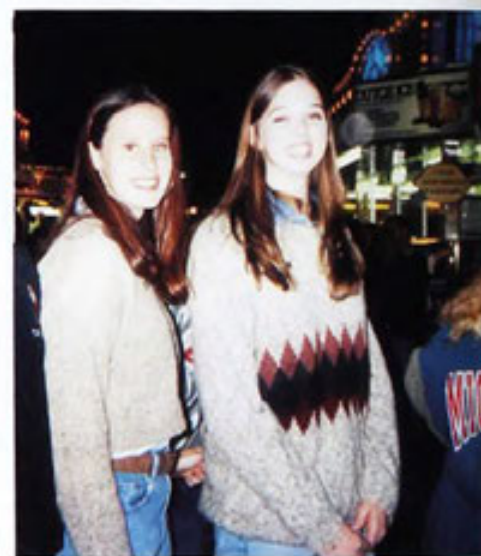

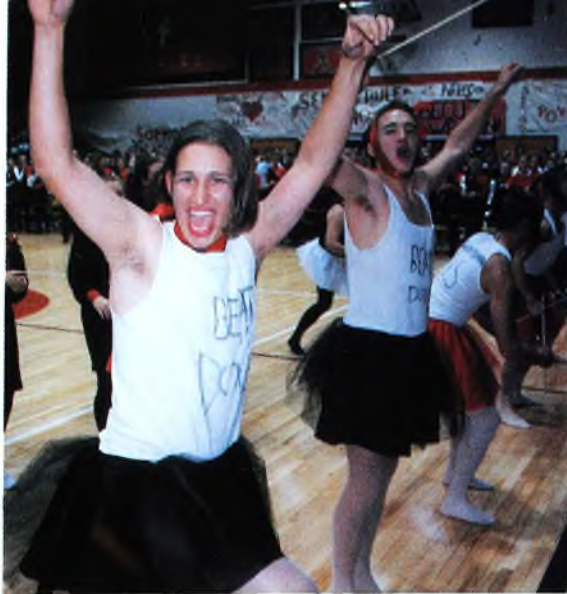

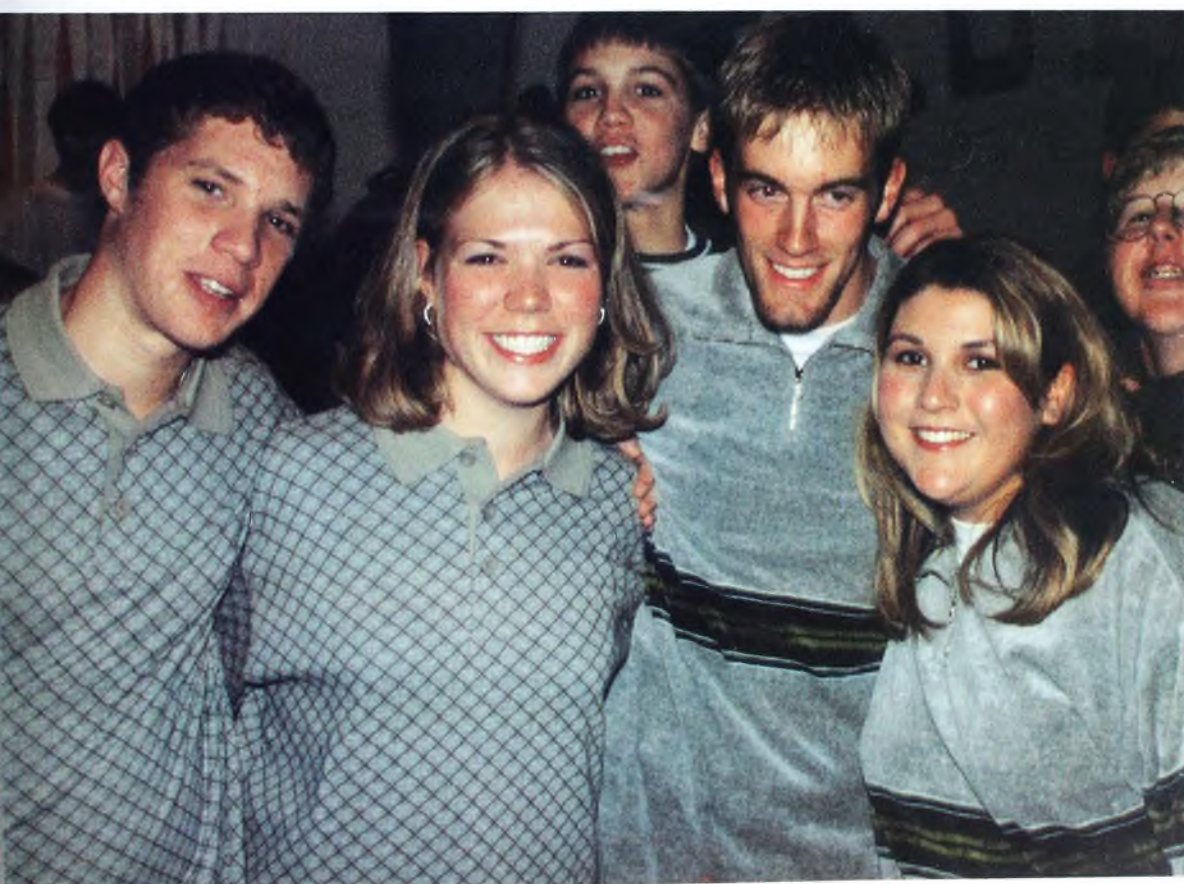

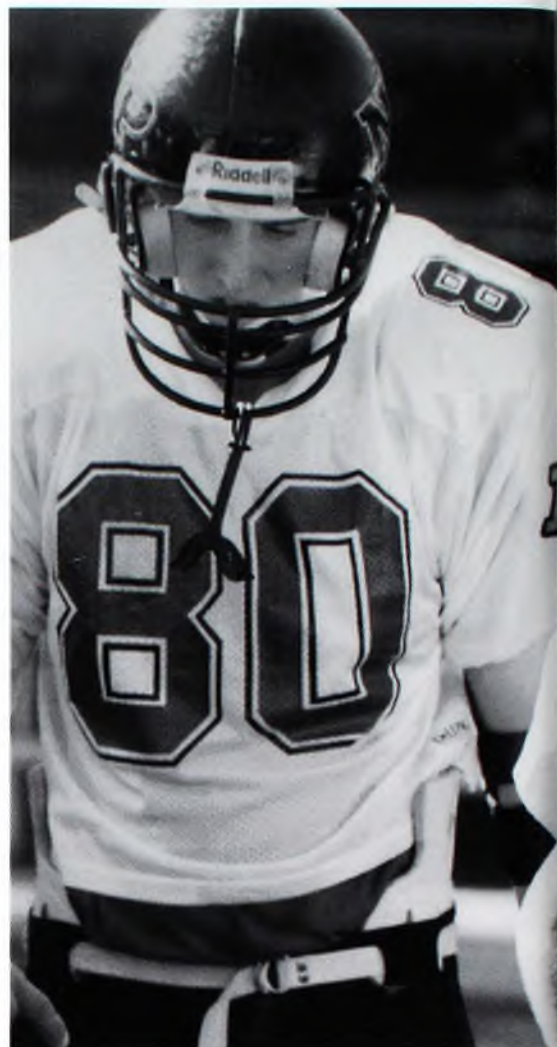

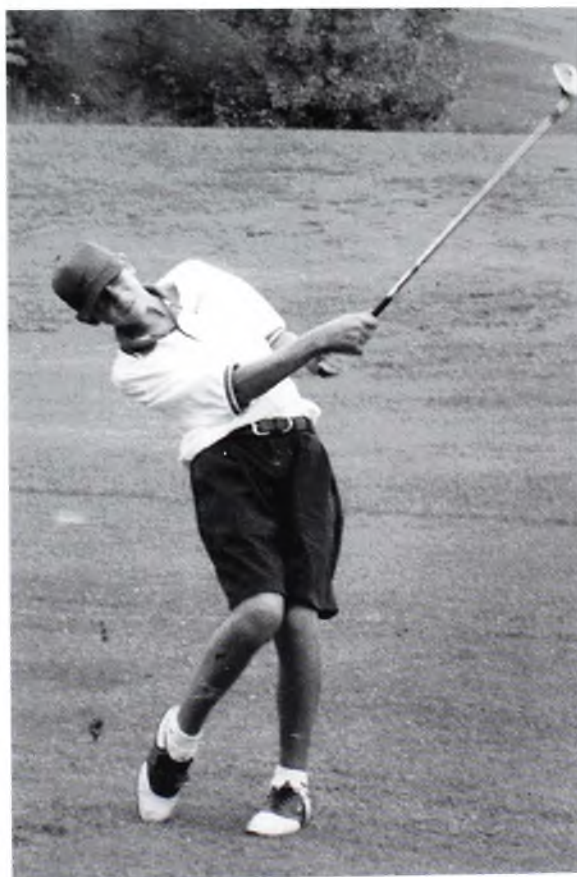

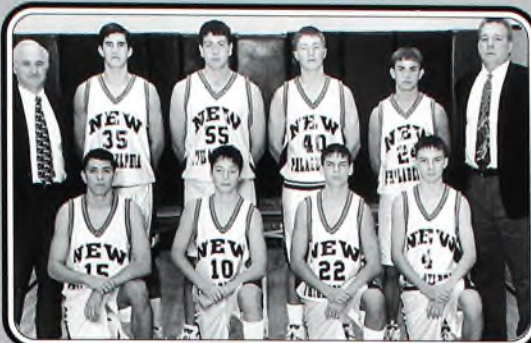

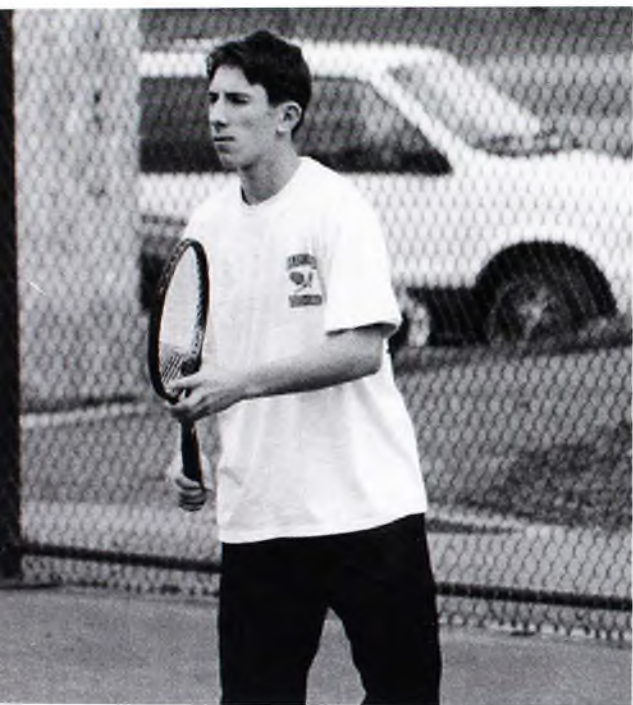

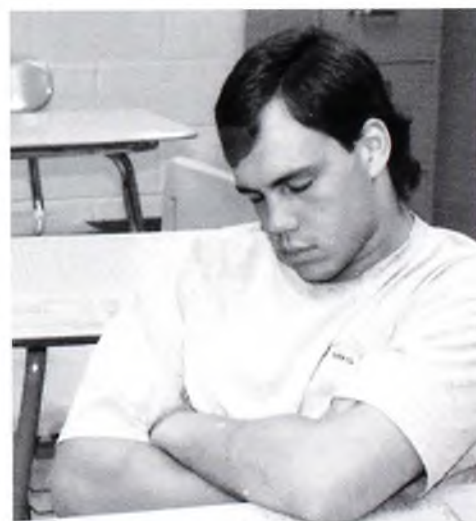

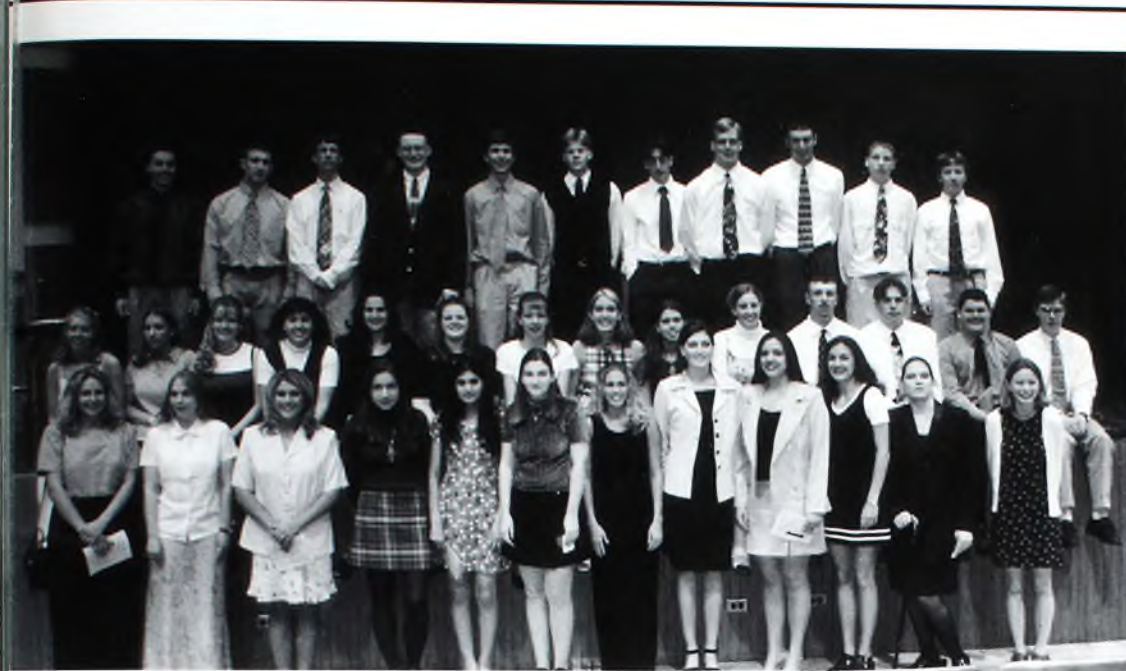
Students recognized for their outstanding academic accomplishments

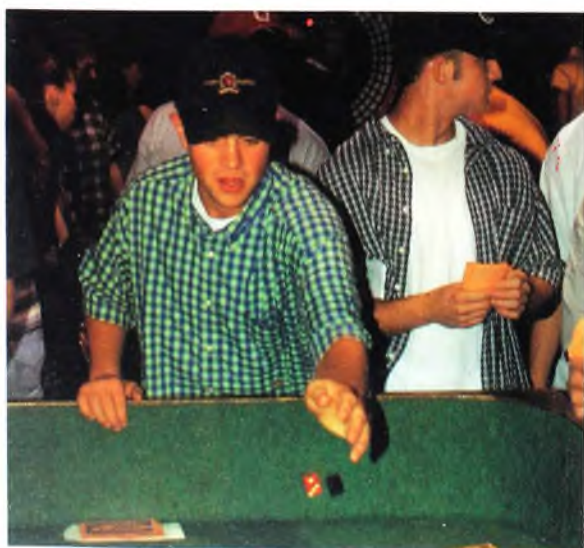
