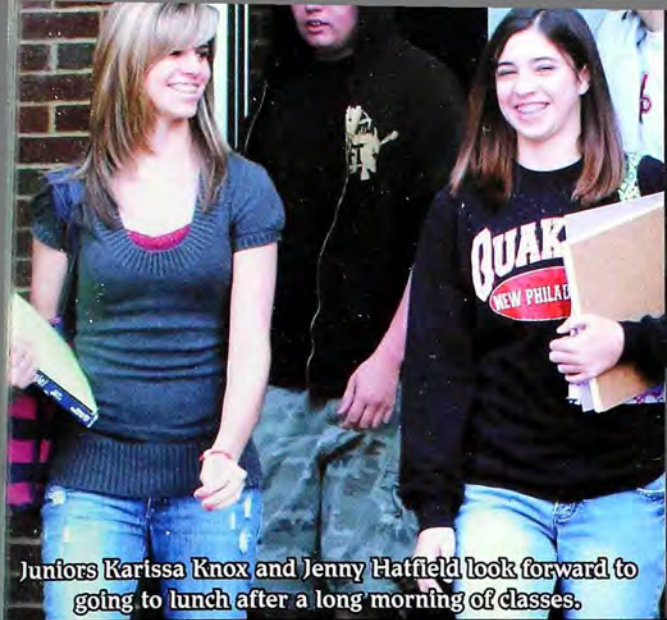

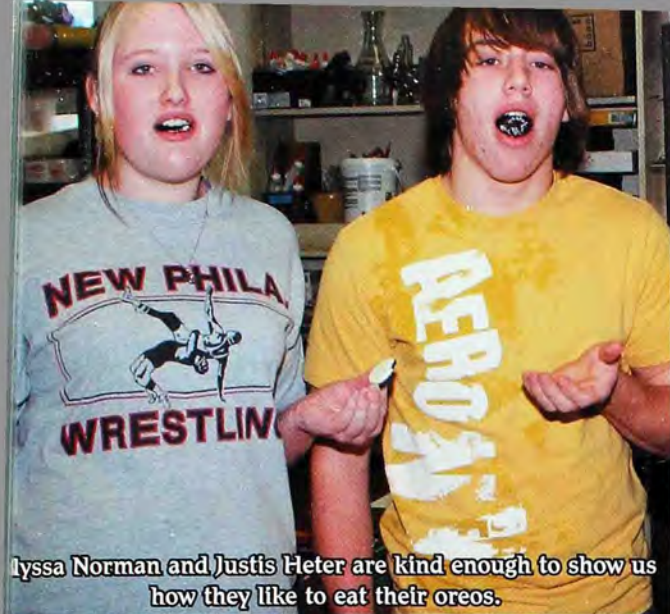

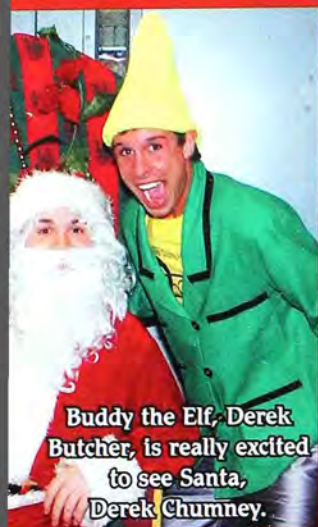

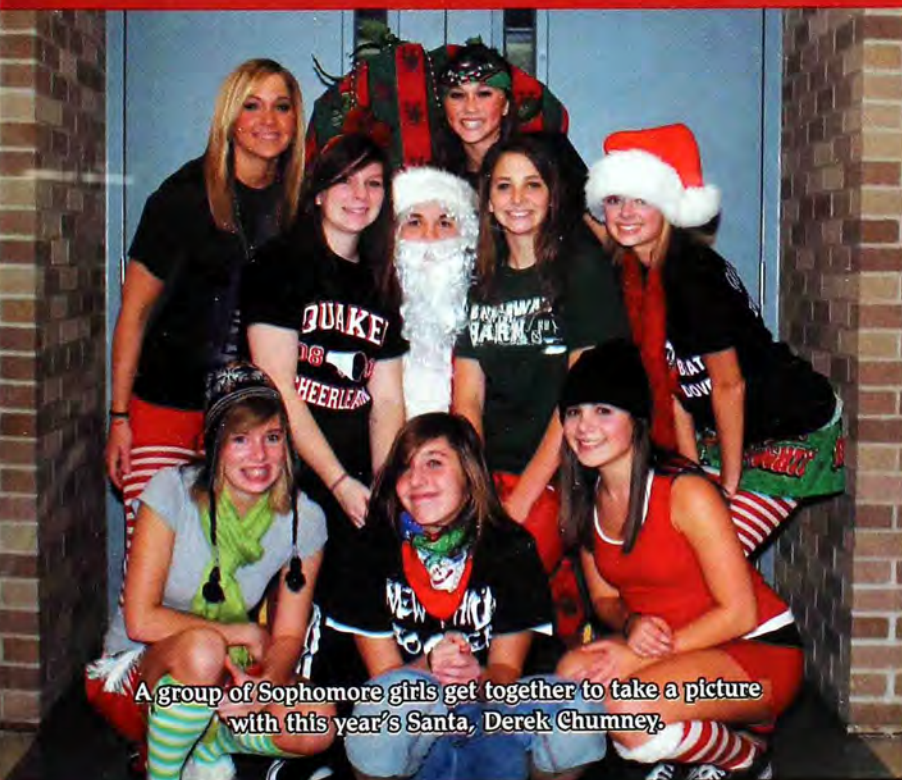

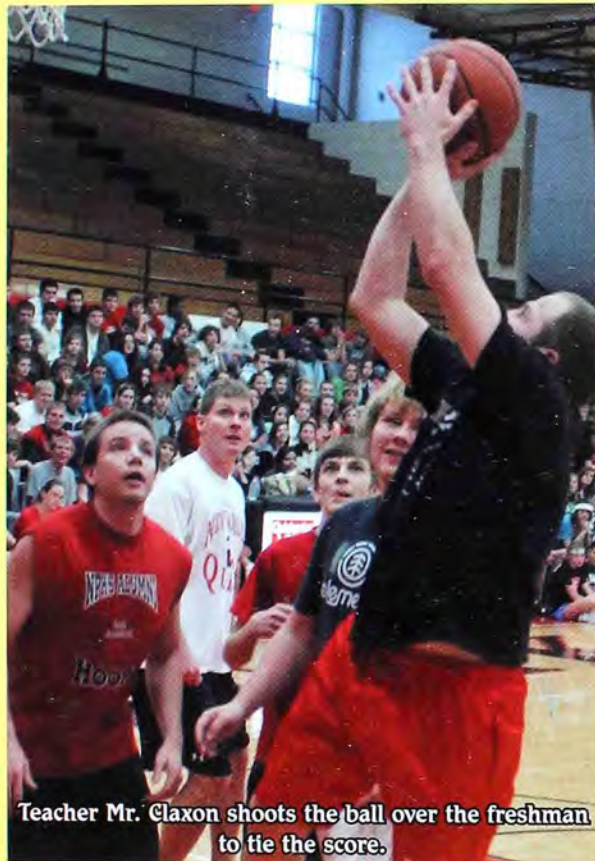
# Old School Skills

THE STAFF SHOWED THE STUDENTS UP!

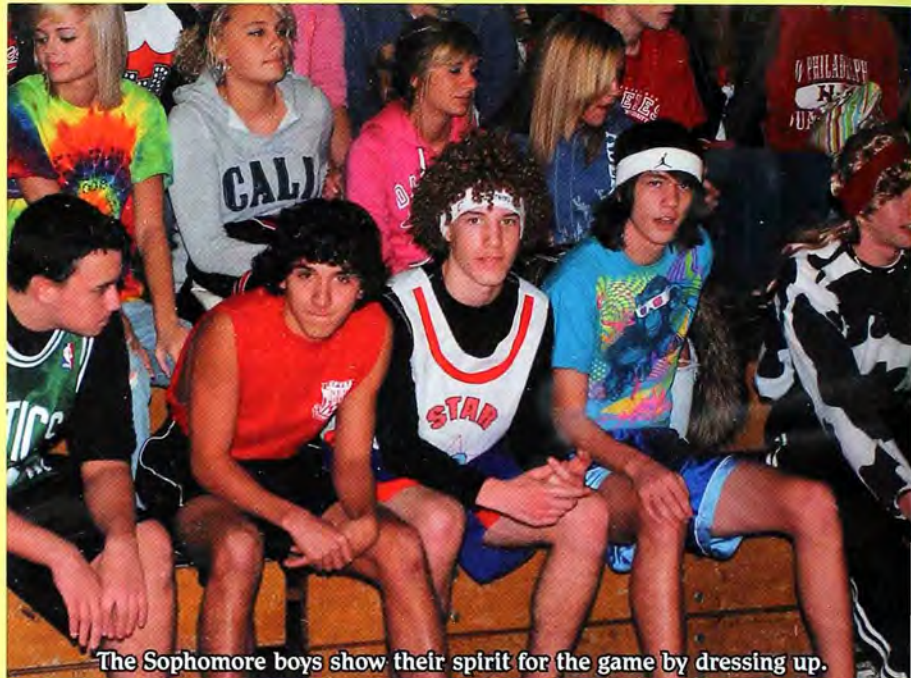

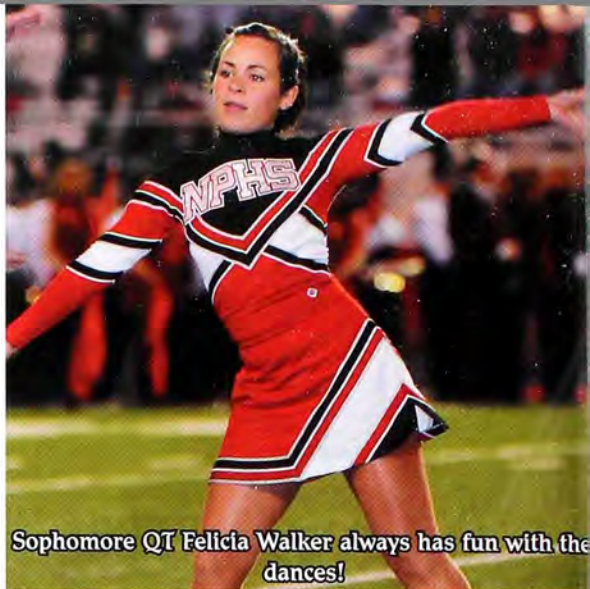

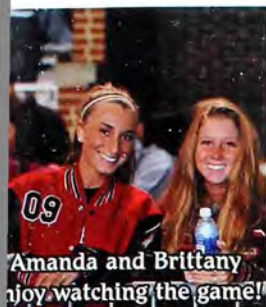

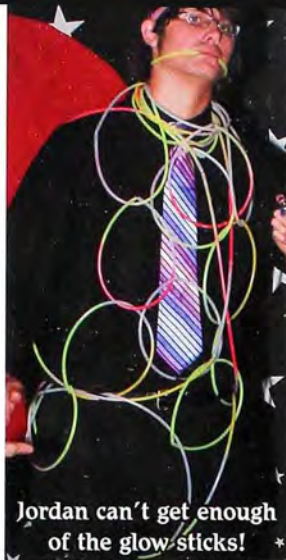

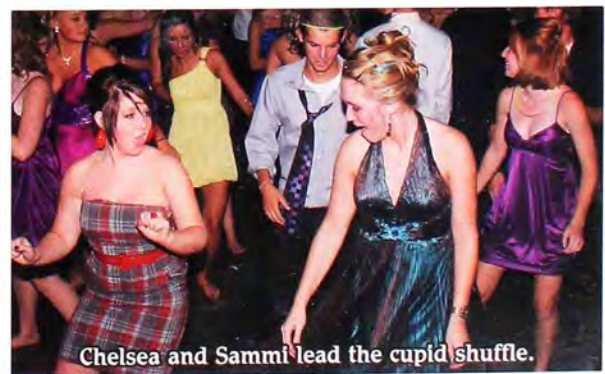

2008 SPIRIT WEEK WAS BY FAR THE CRAZIEST!

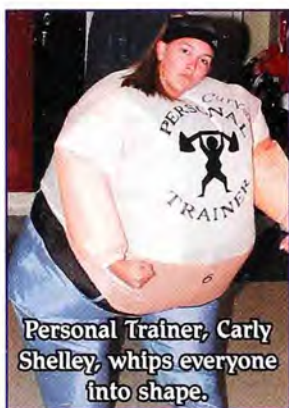

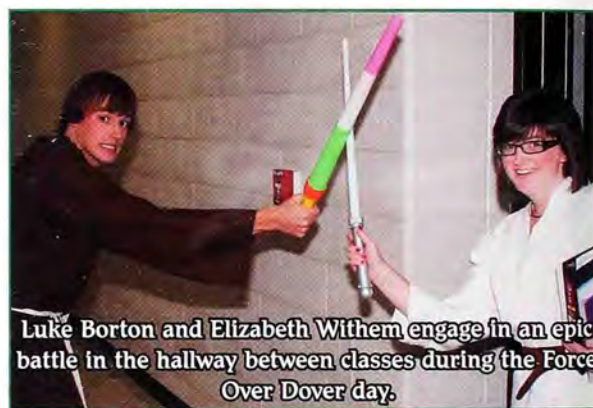

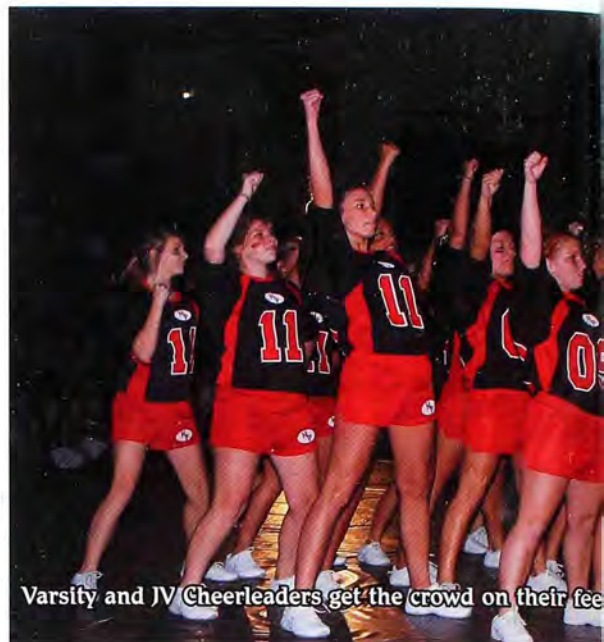
# Don't Stop Us Now

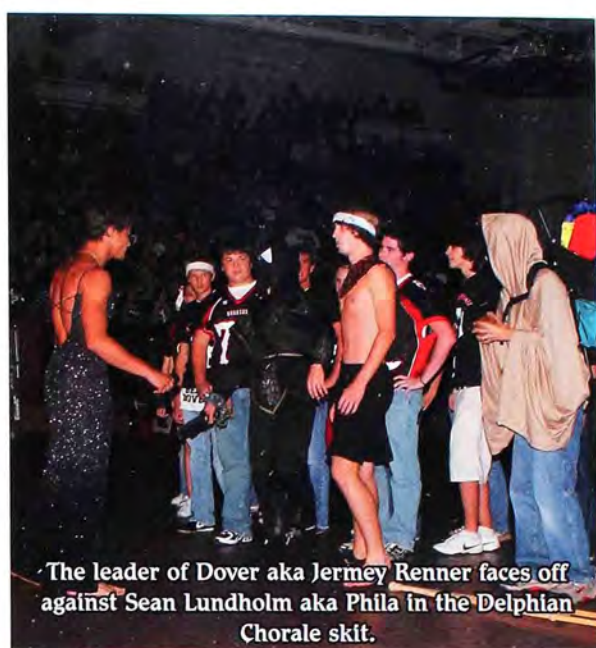

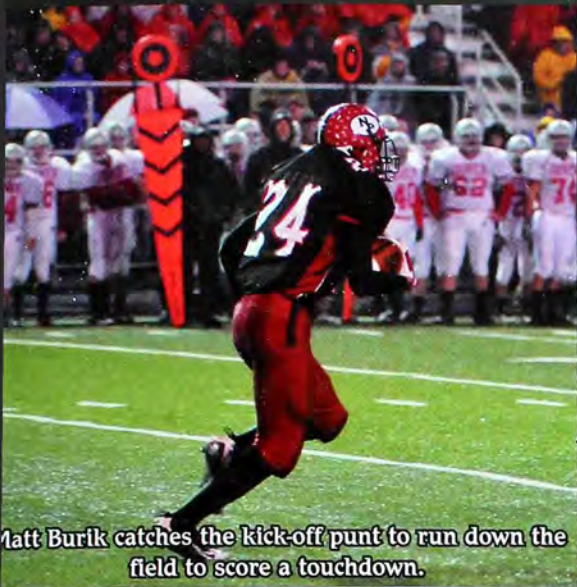

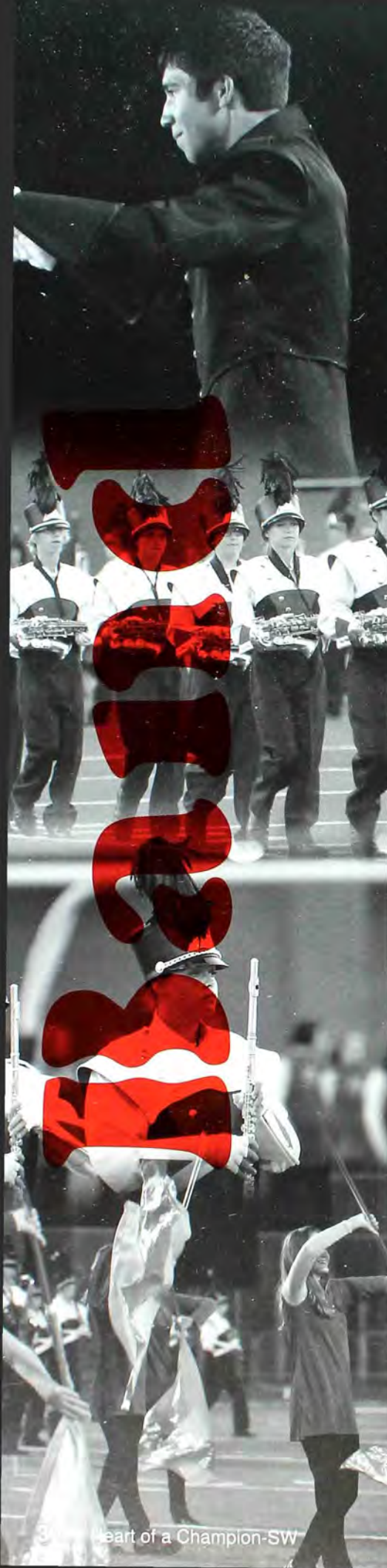

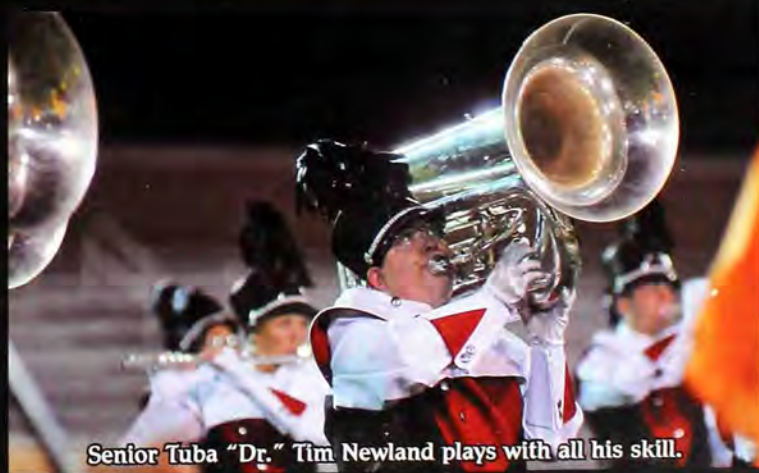

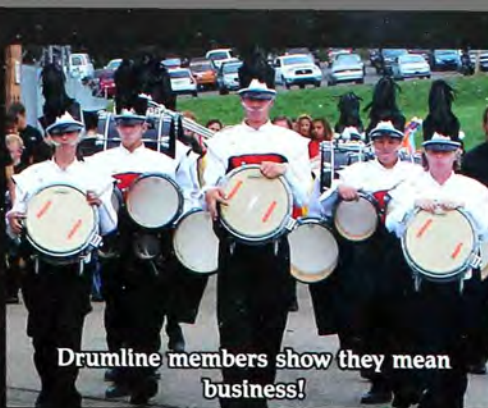

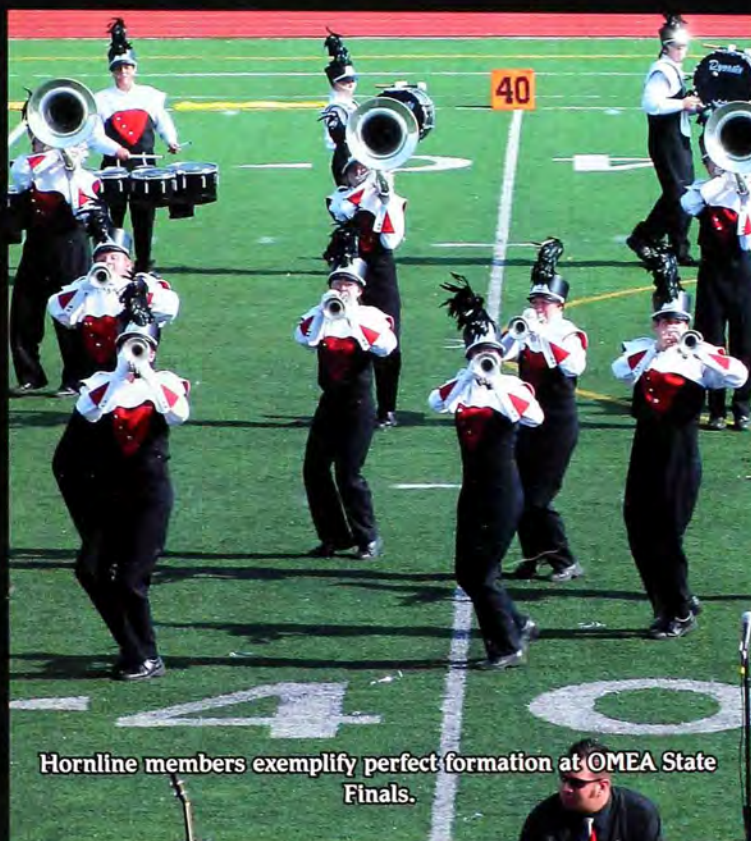

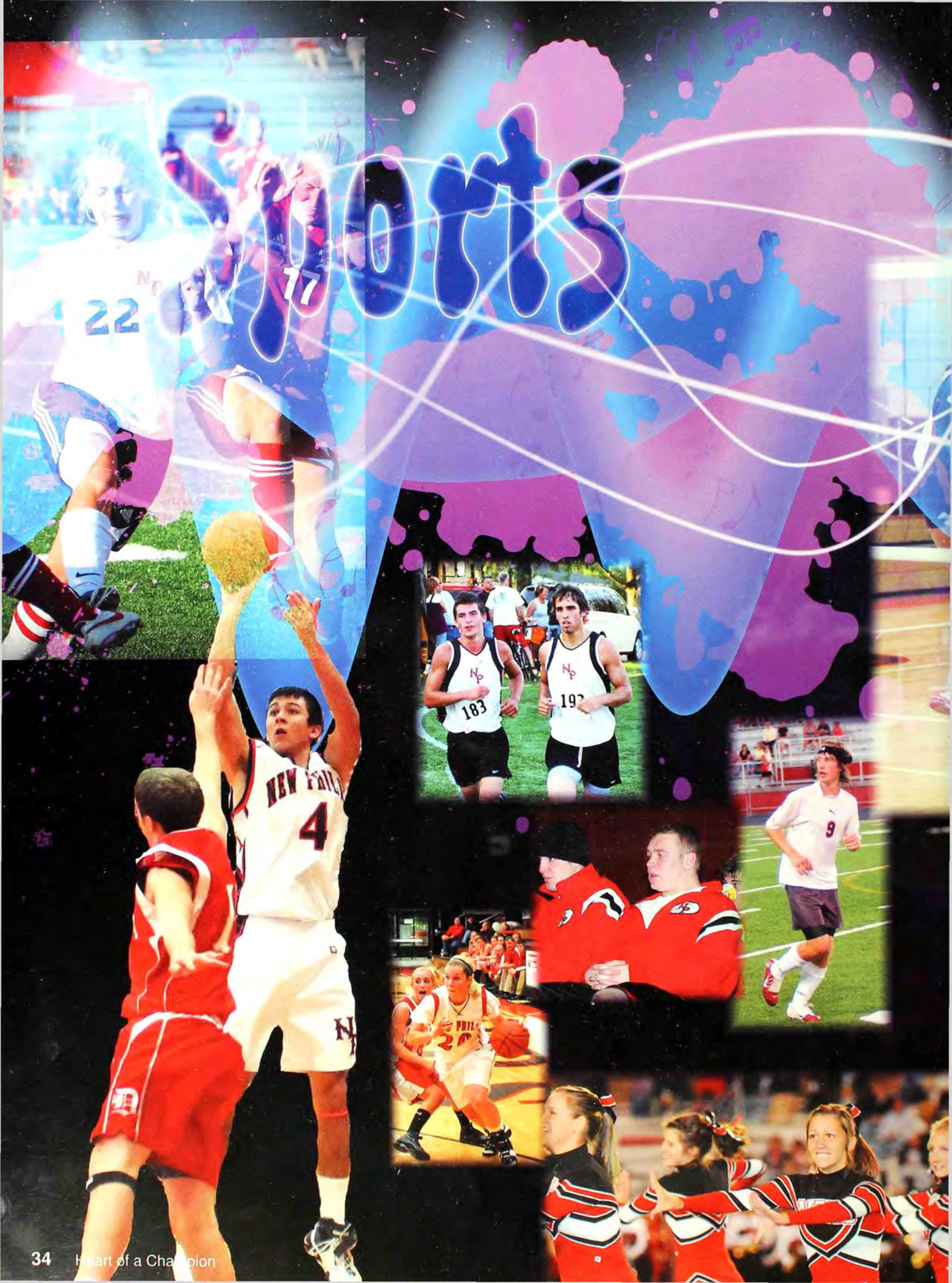

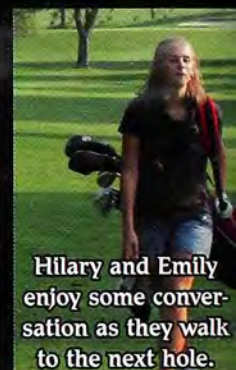

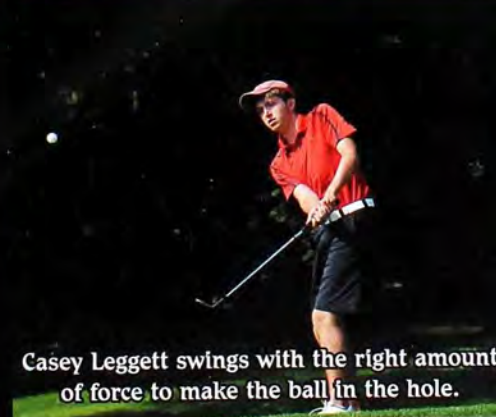

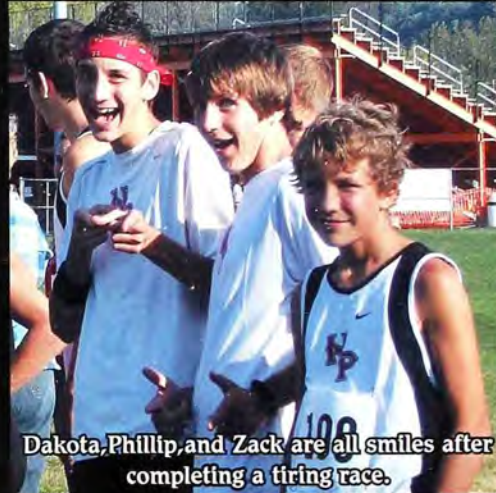


# RUNNING THE COURSE

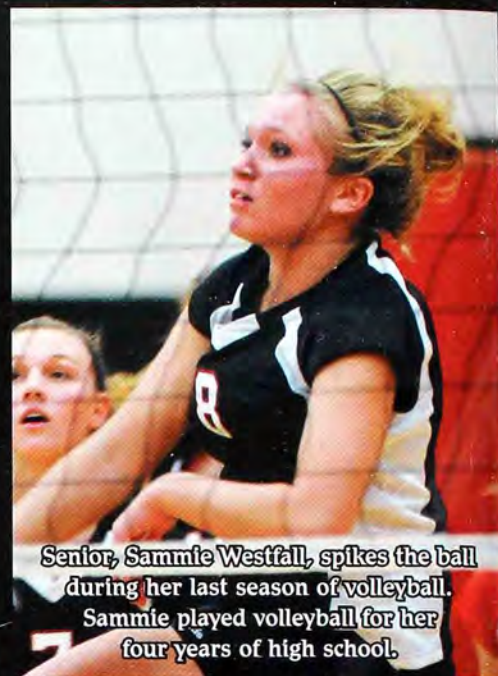

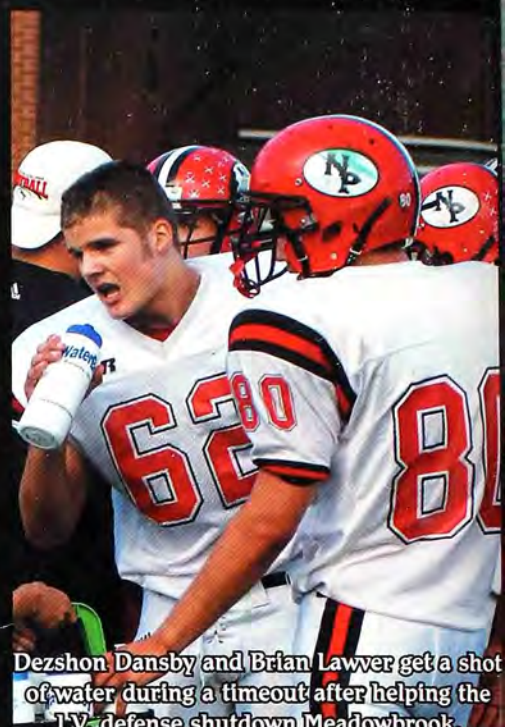

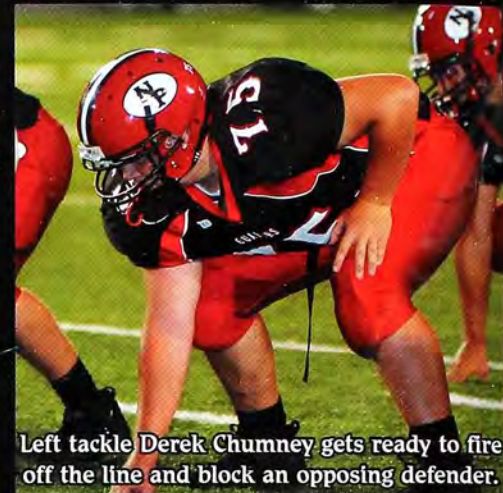

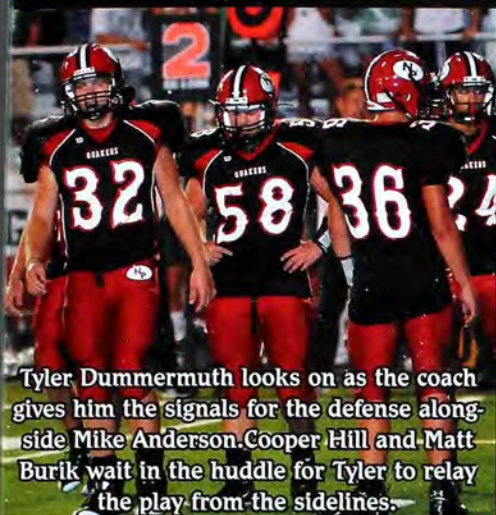

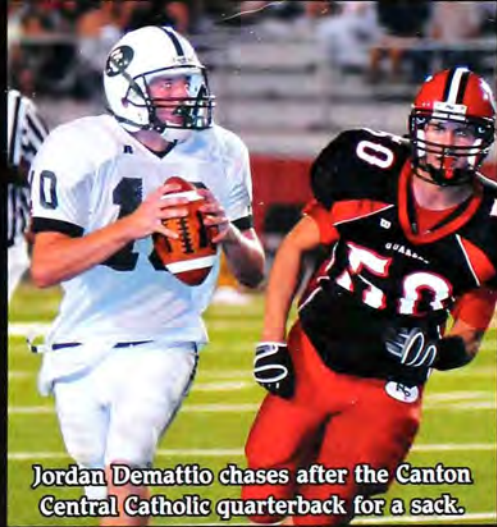

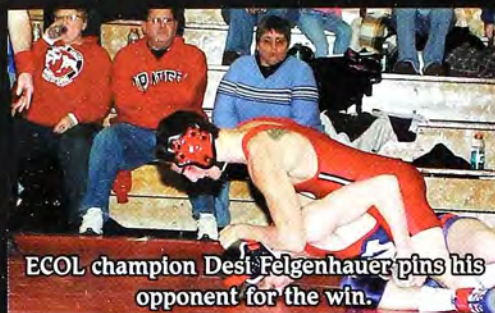

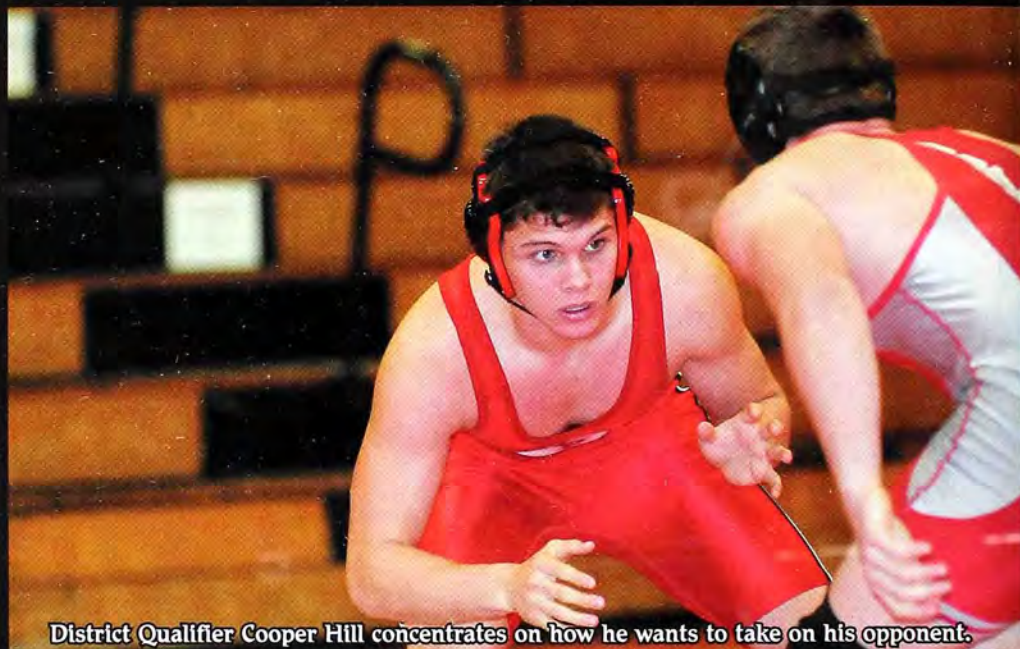

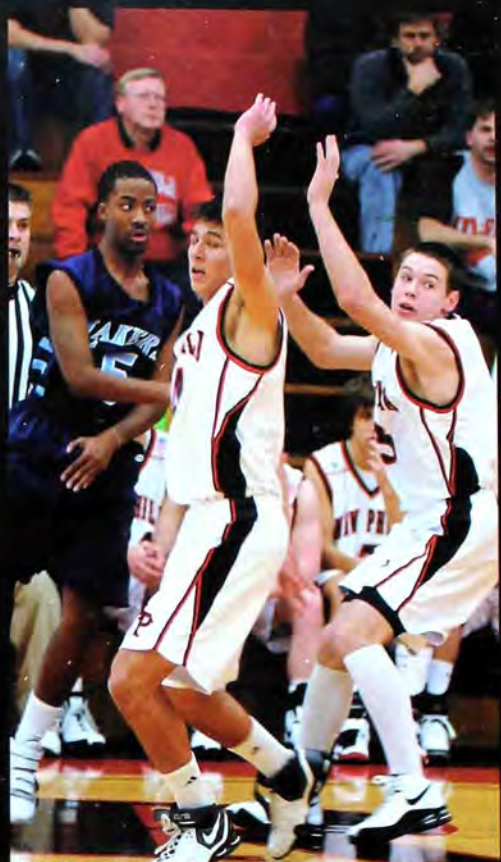

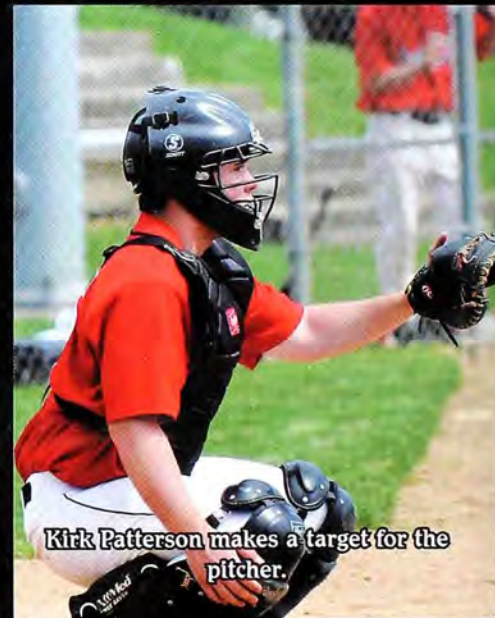

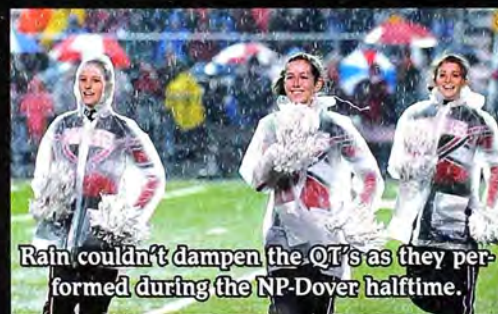

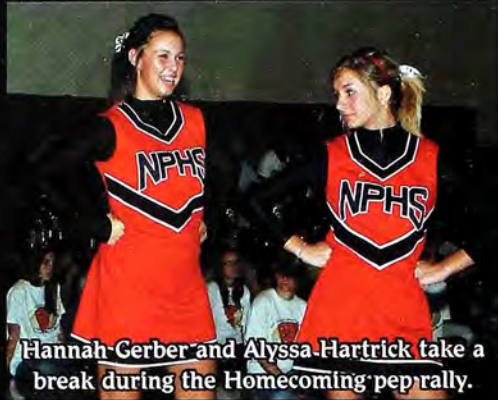

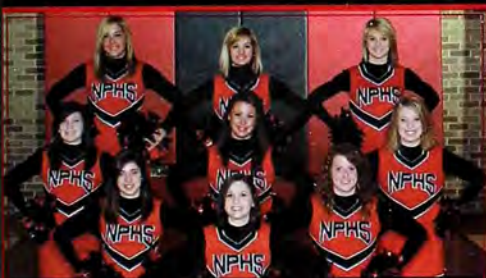

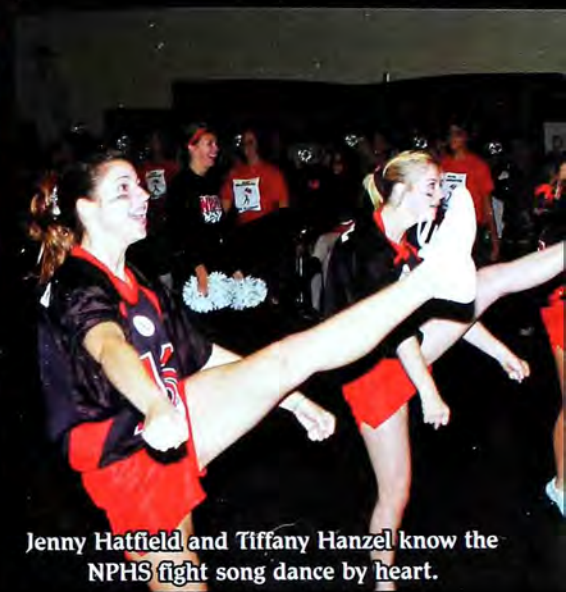

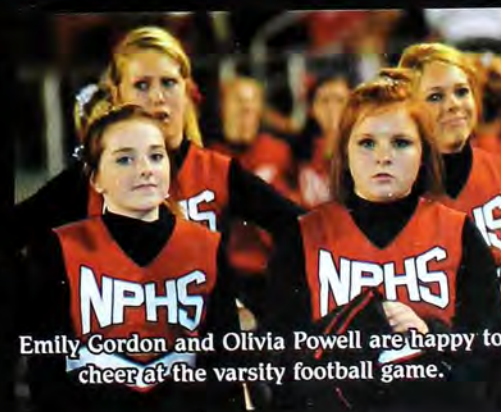

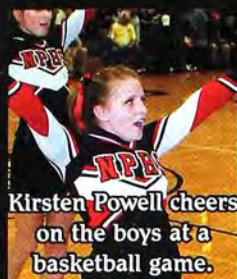

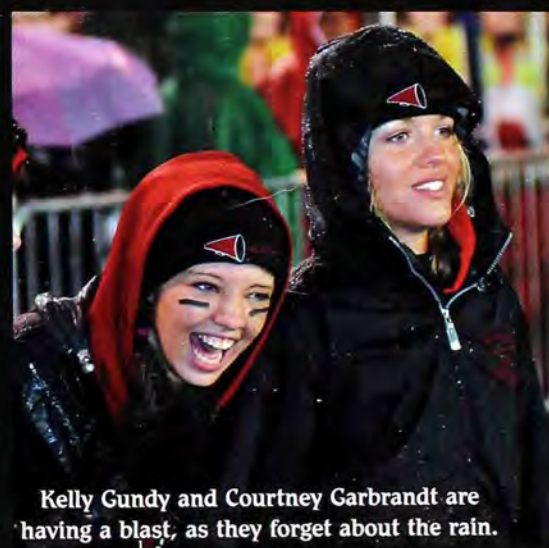

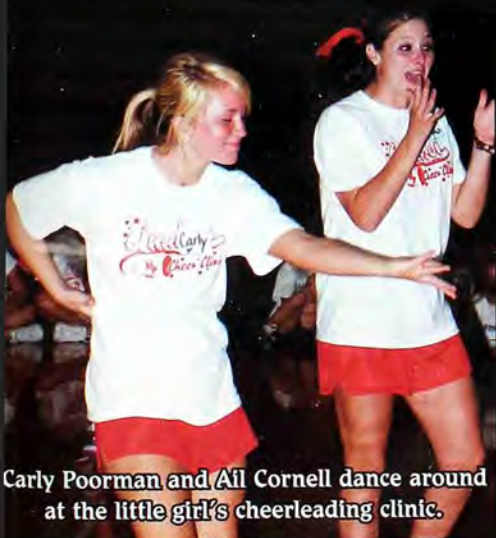

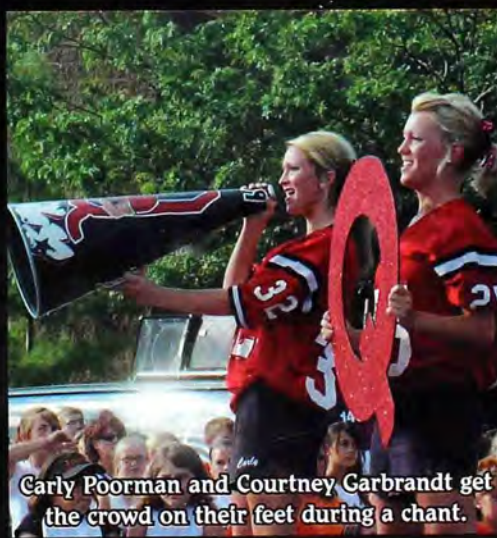

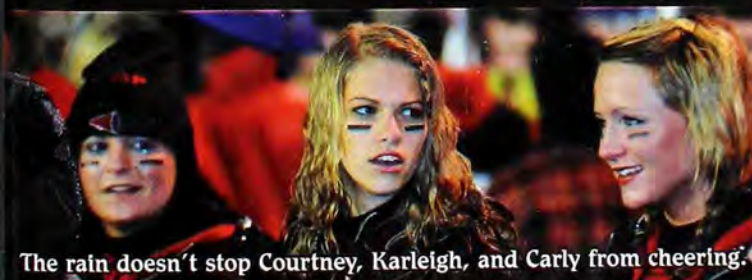

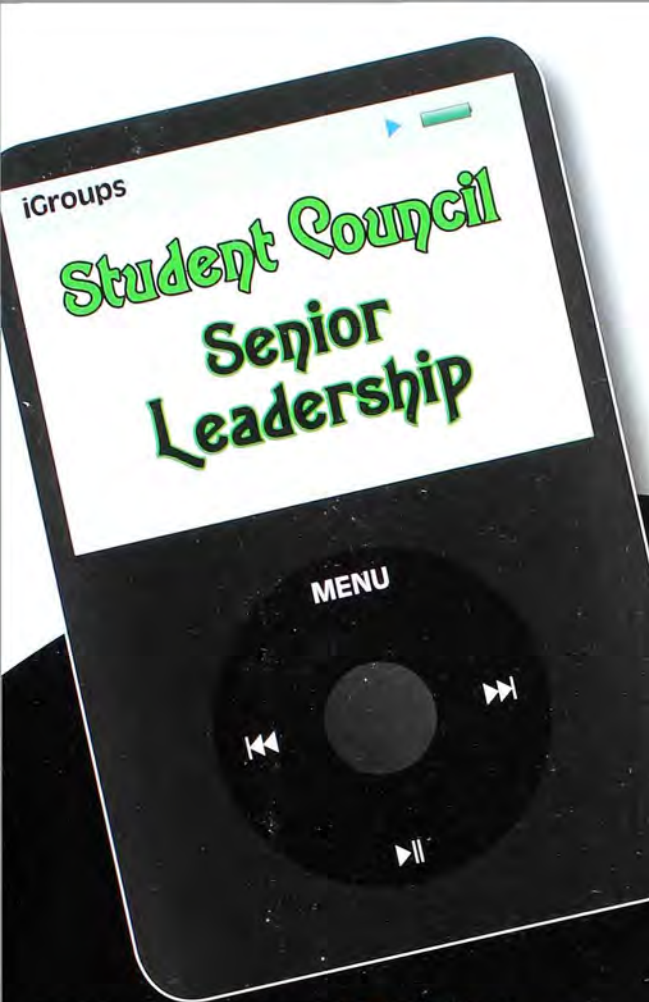

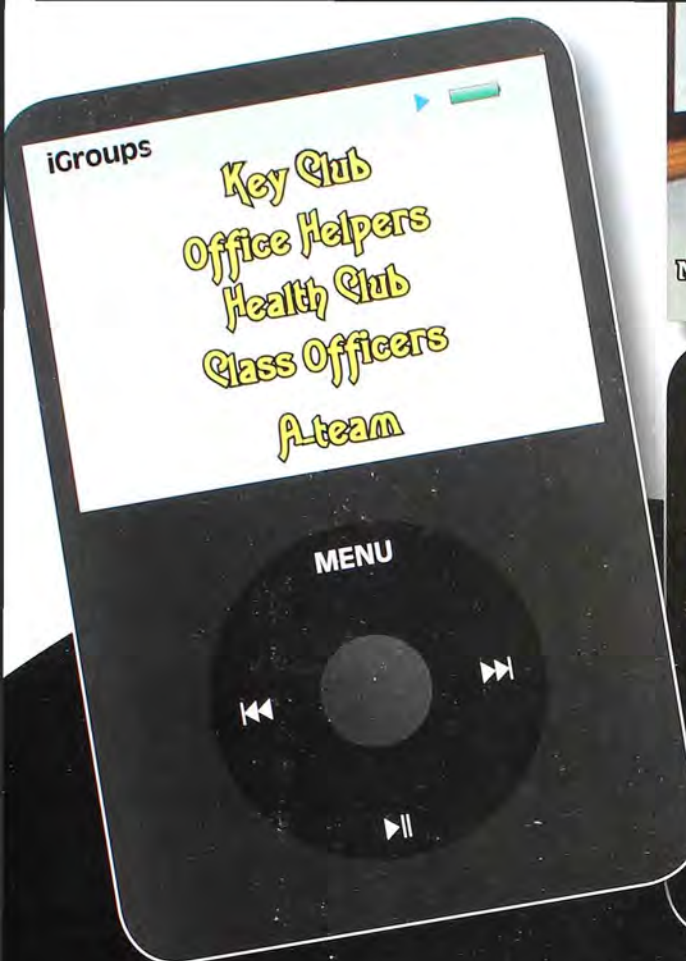

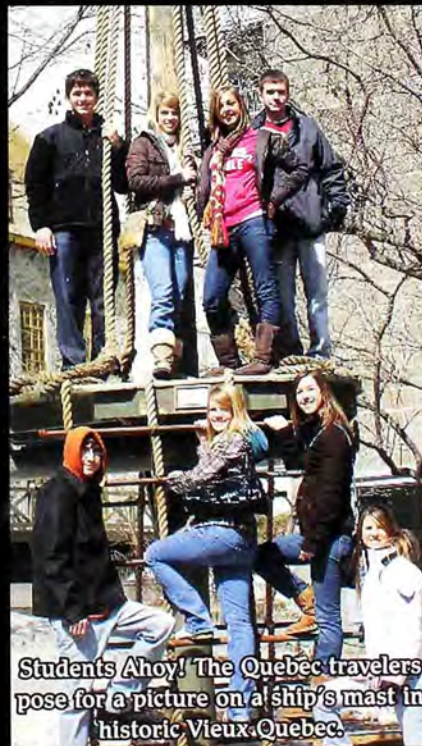

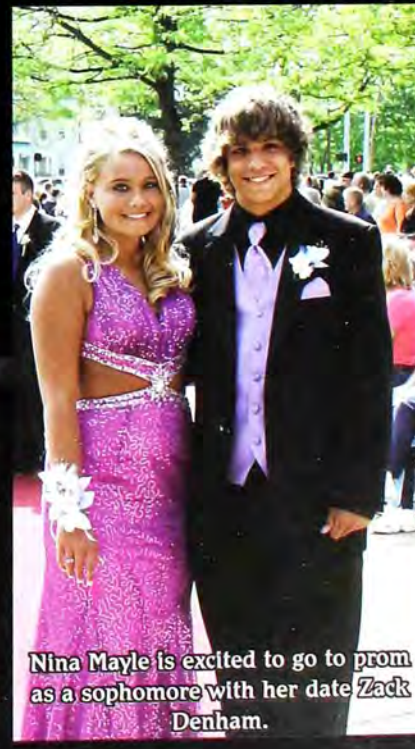

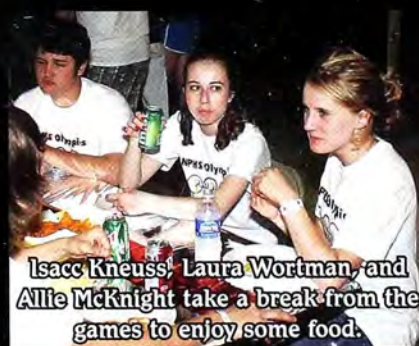
