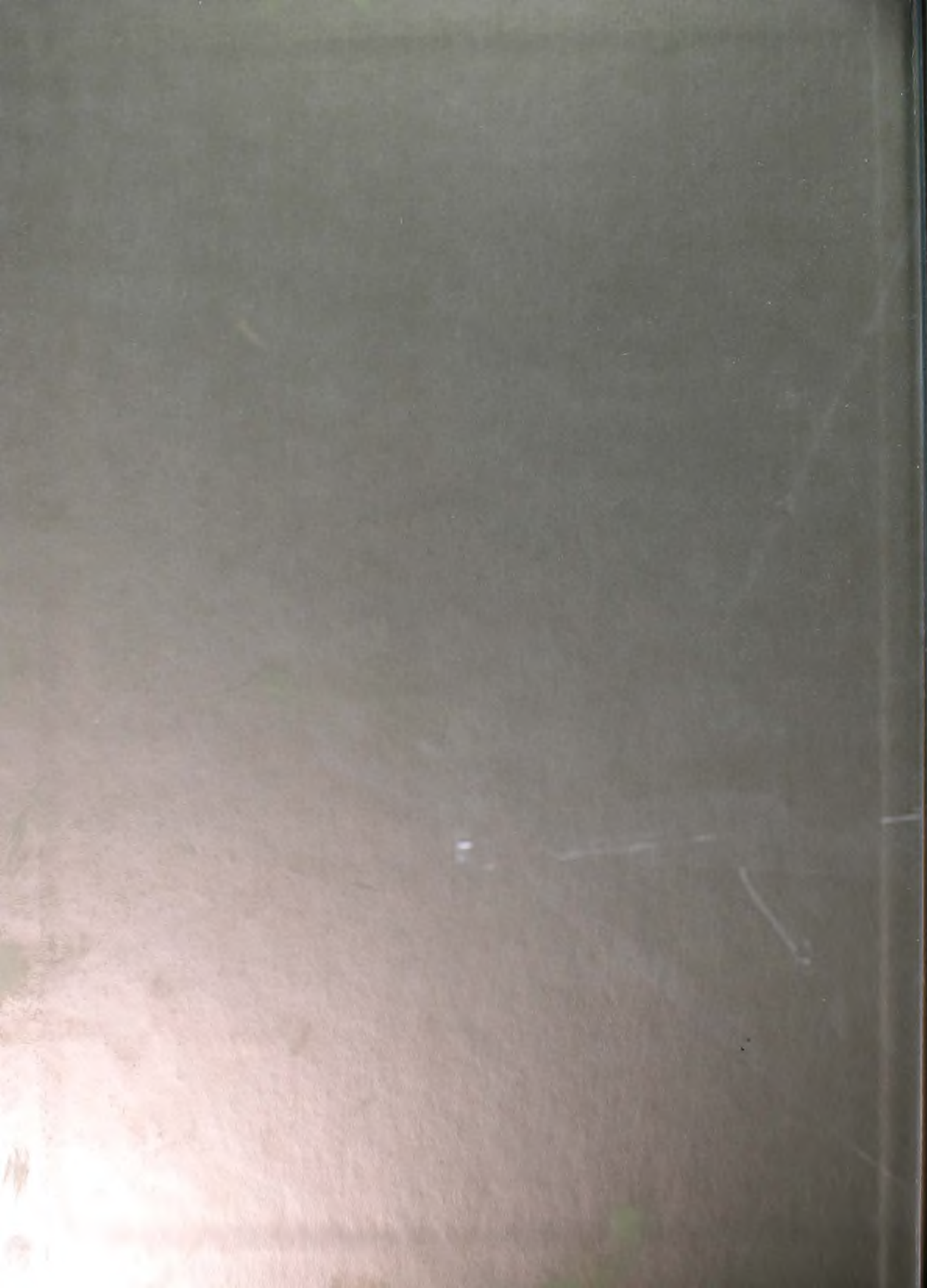

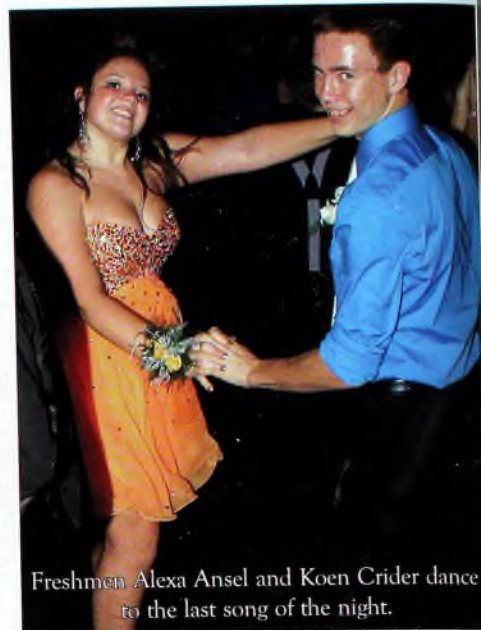
STANDING IN THE REIN

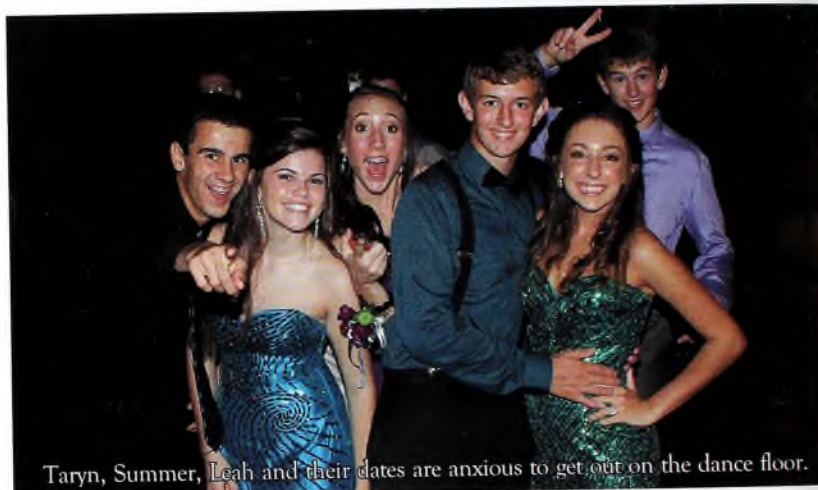

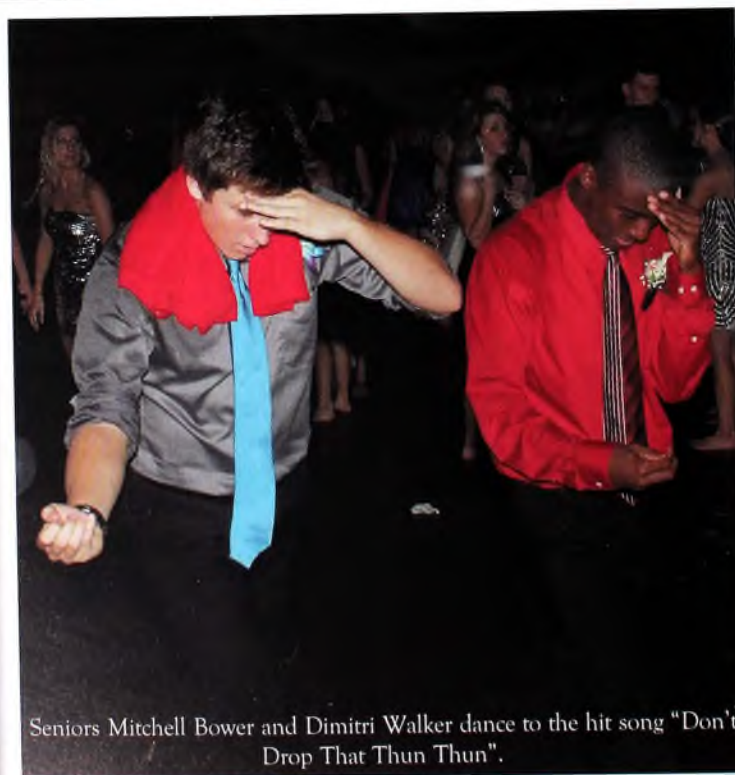

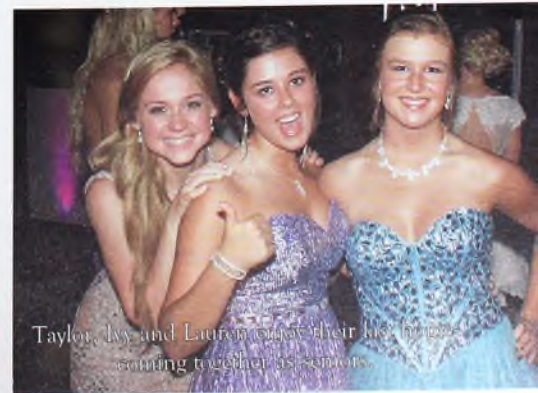

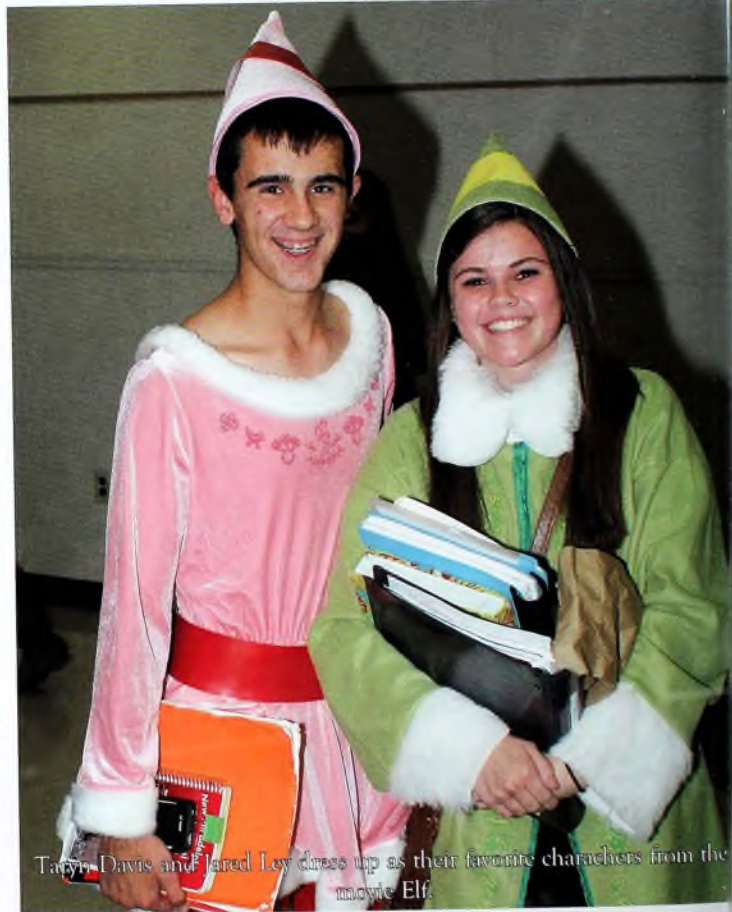

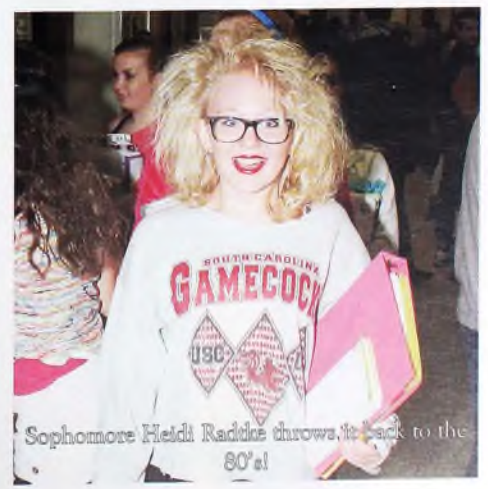

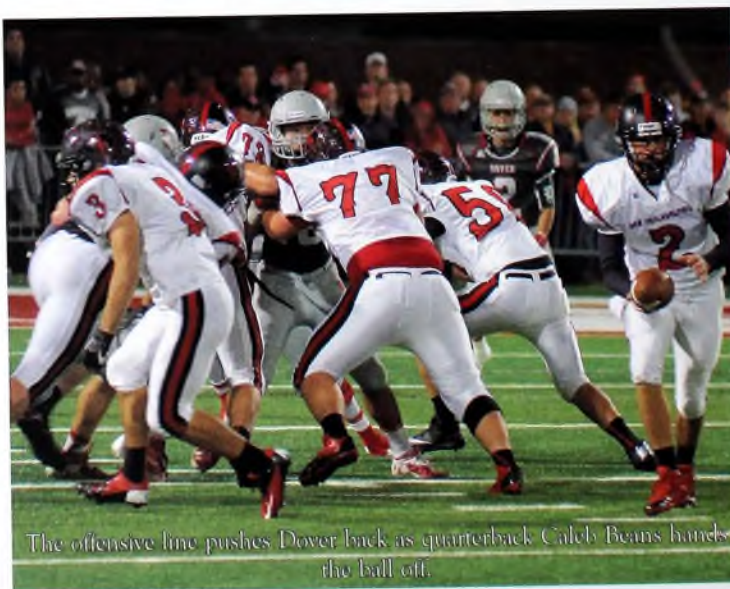

"Performing a play is not an easy thing to do, it takes a lot of effort," said Junior Josie Waugh. •IH

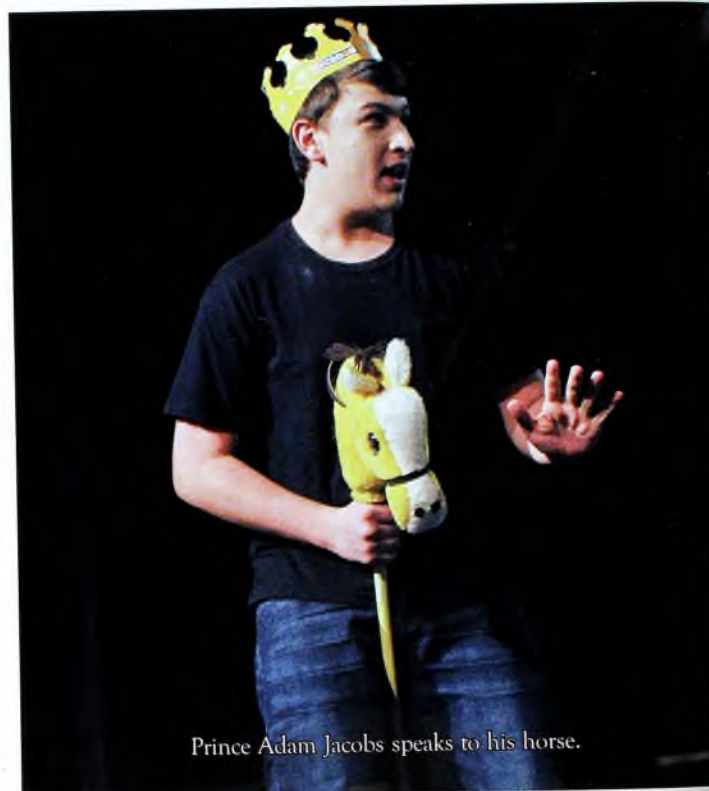

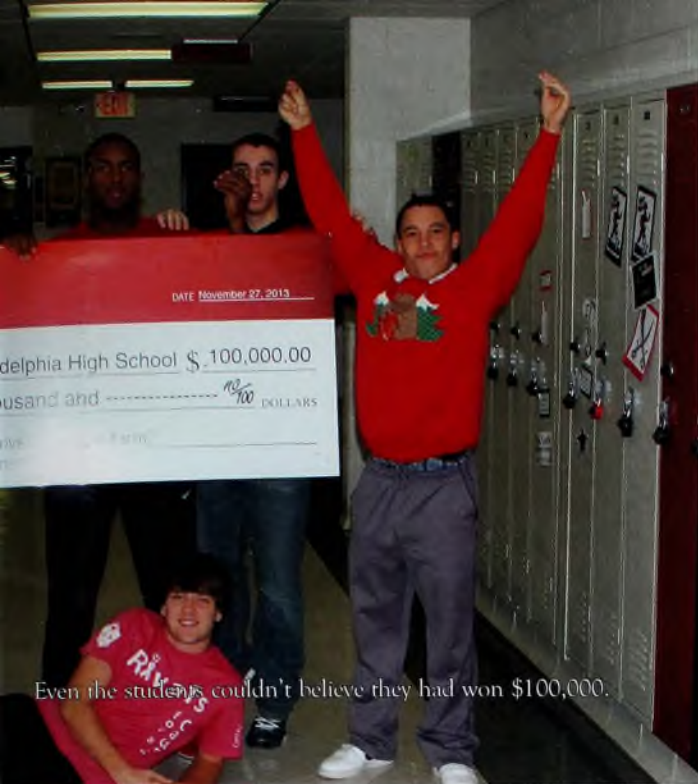

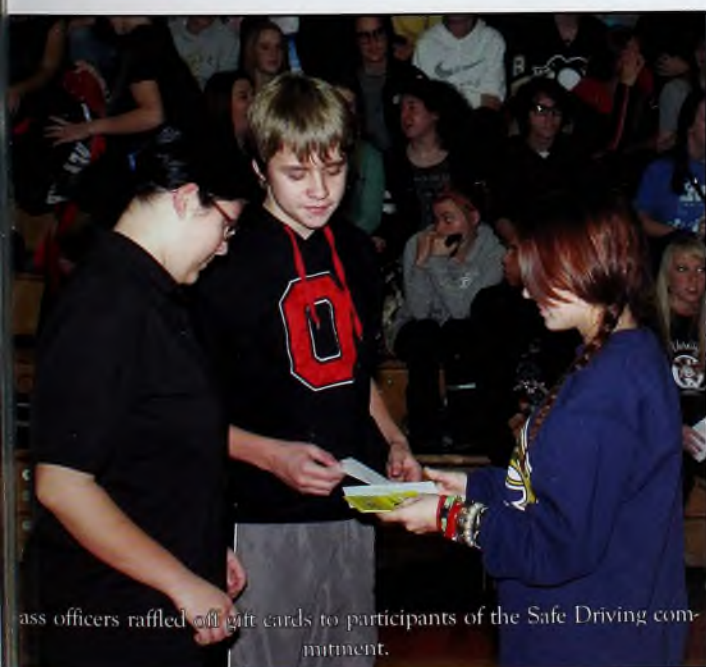

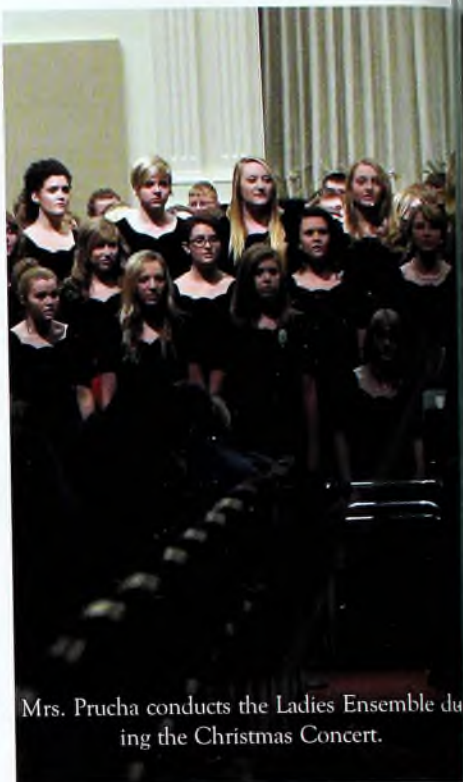

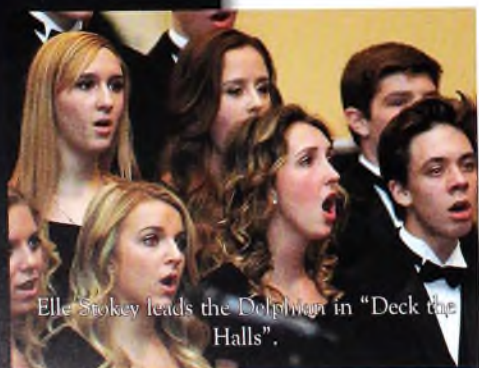

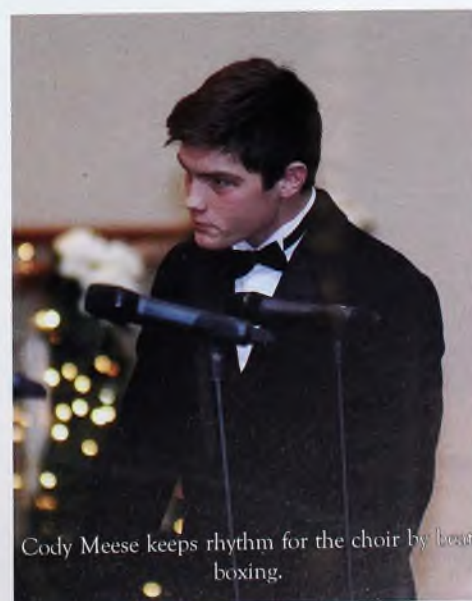

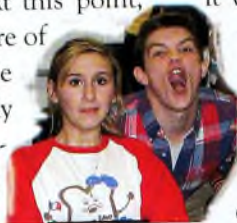

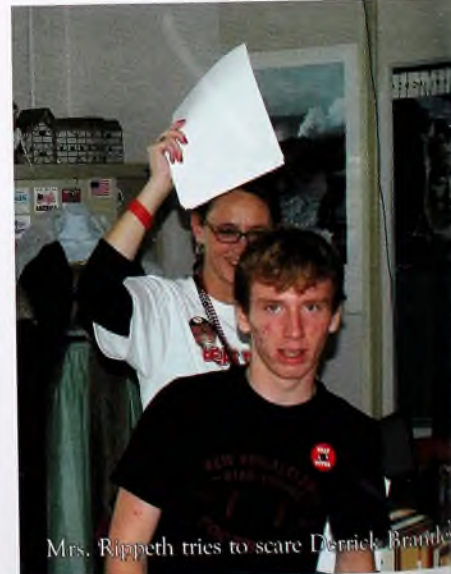

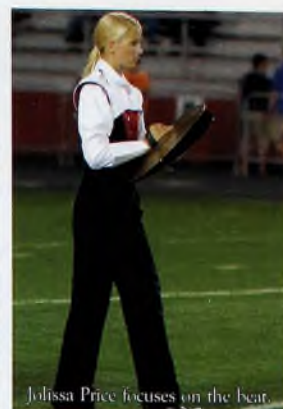

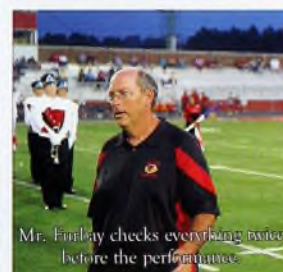

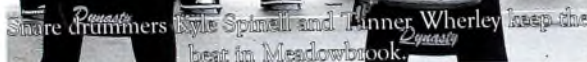

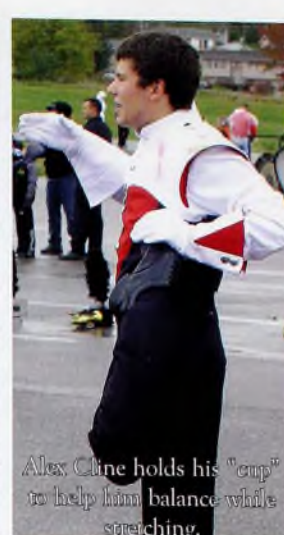

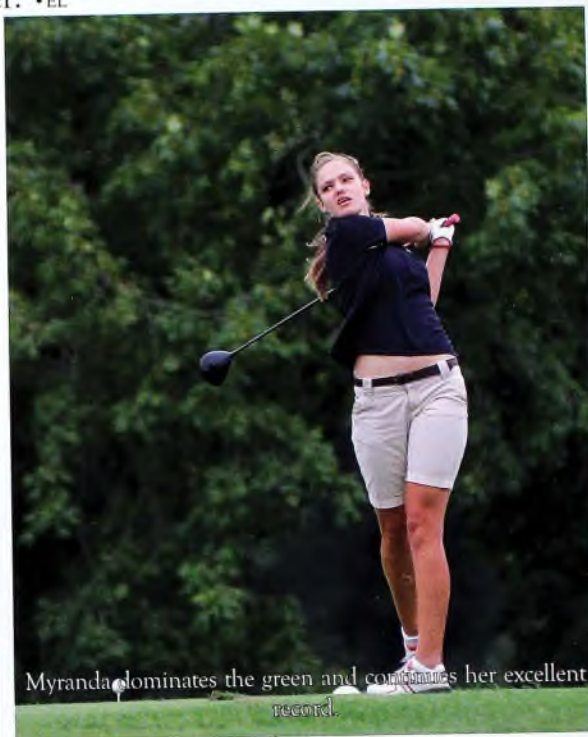

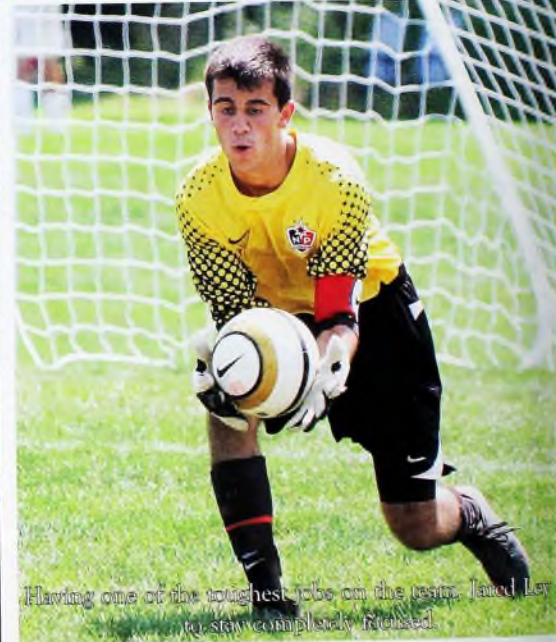

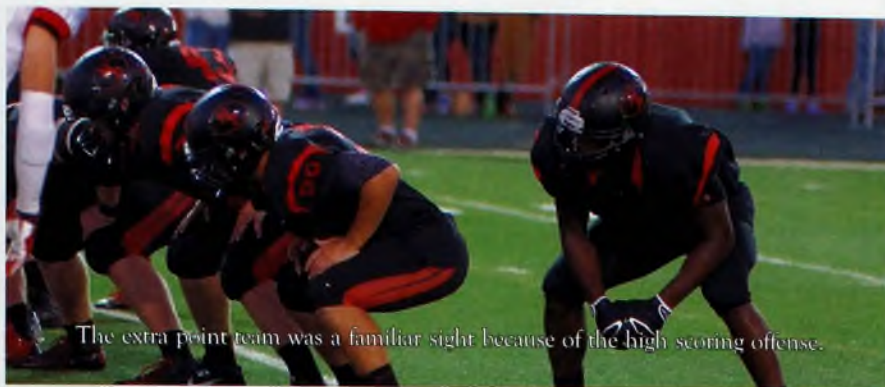

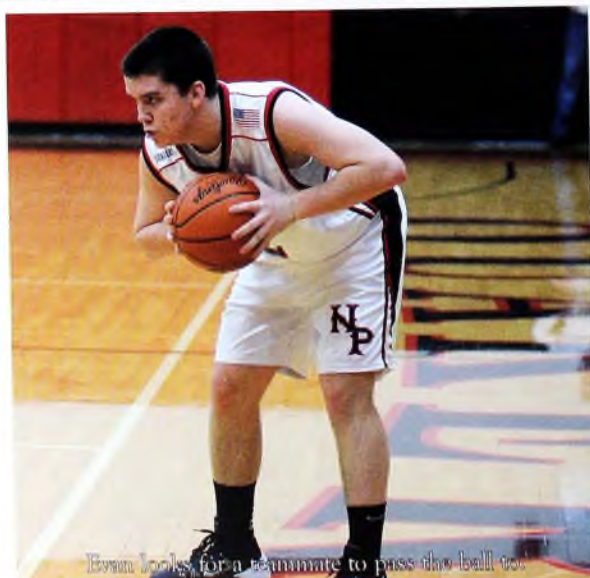

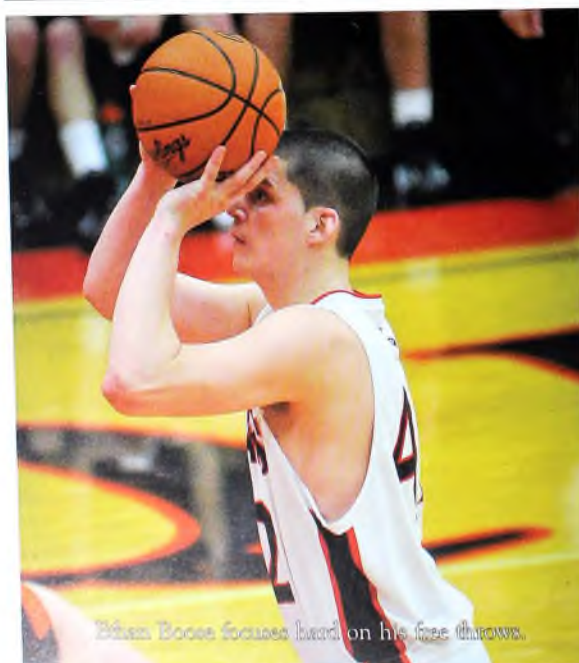

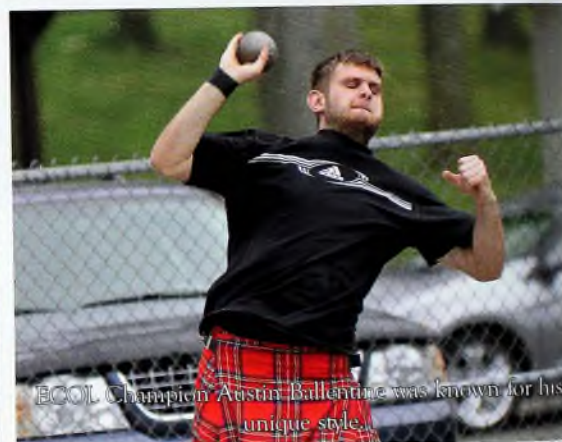

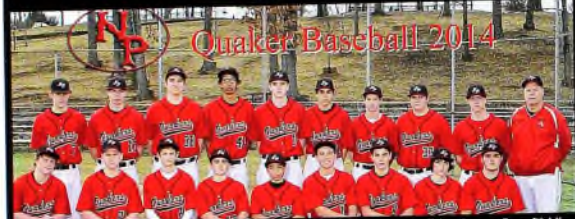

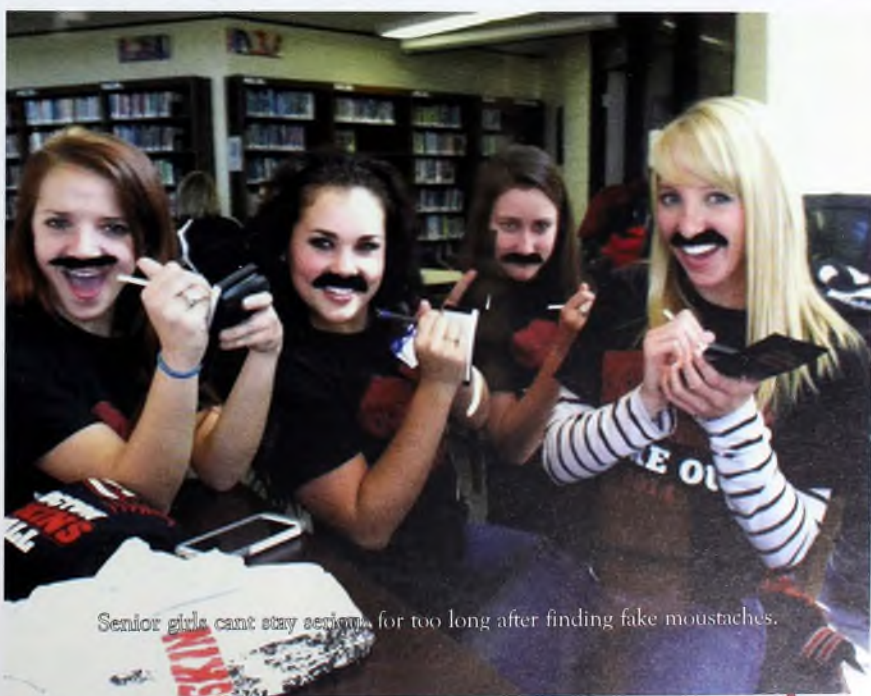

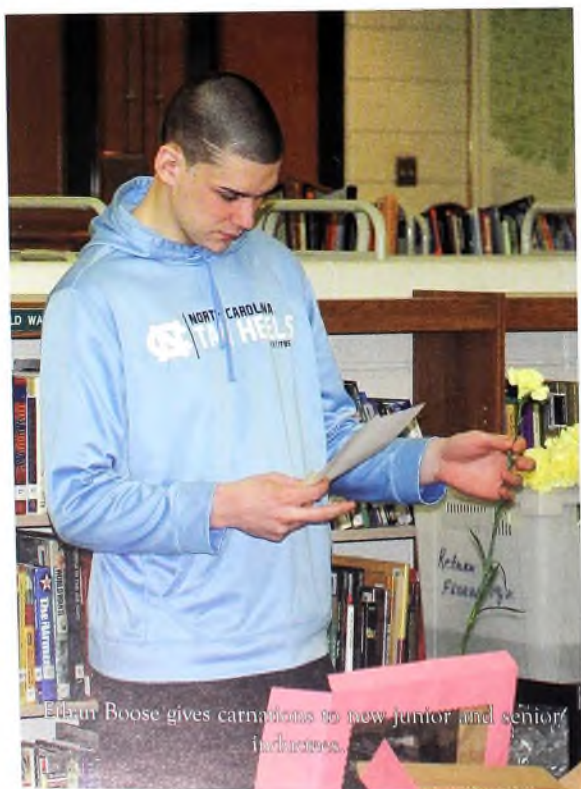

The props and background brings the whole musical together, and makes the scenes look realistic.



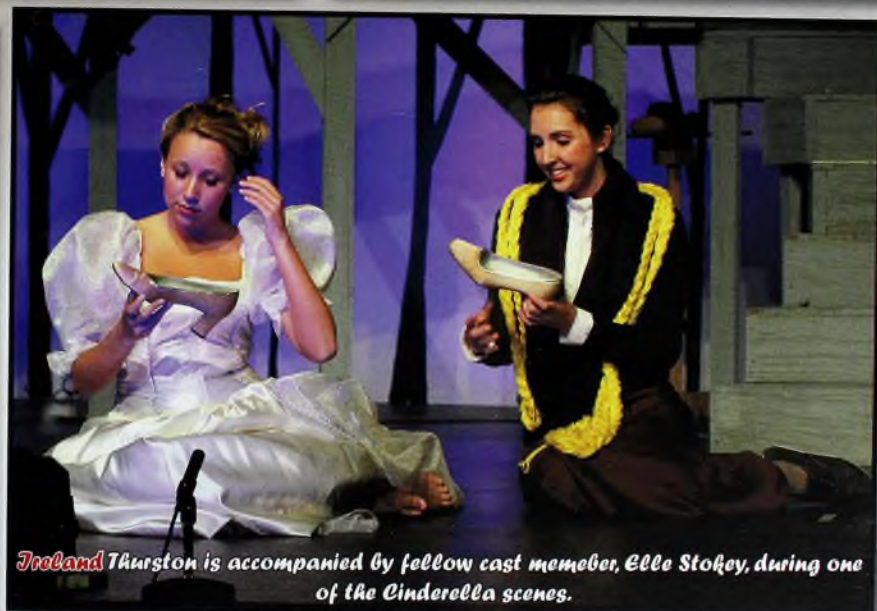

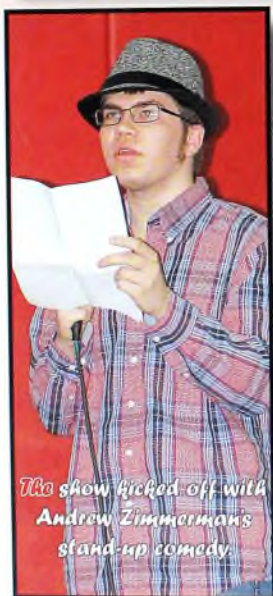

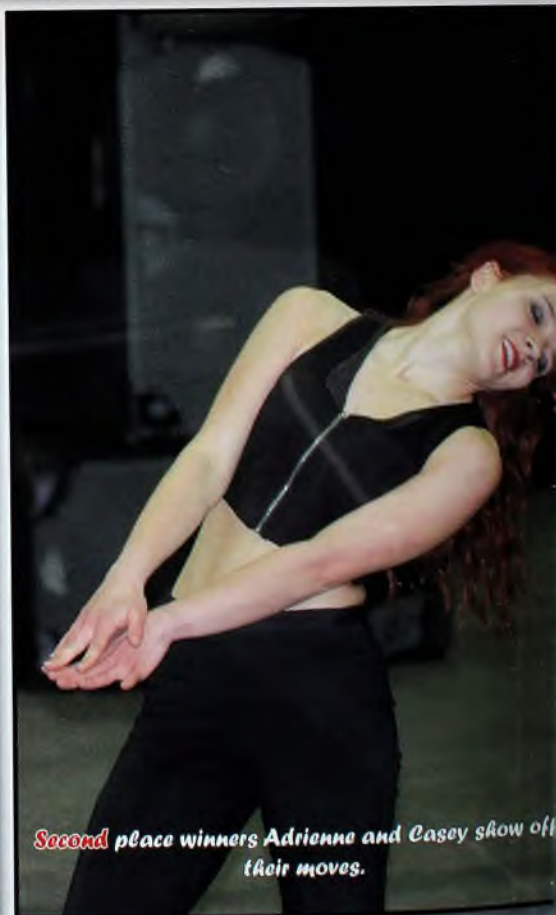

Phila's Got Talent

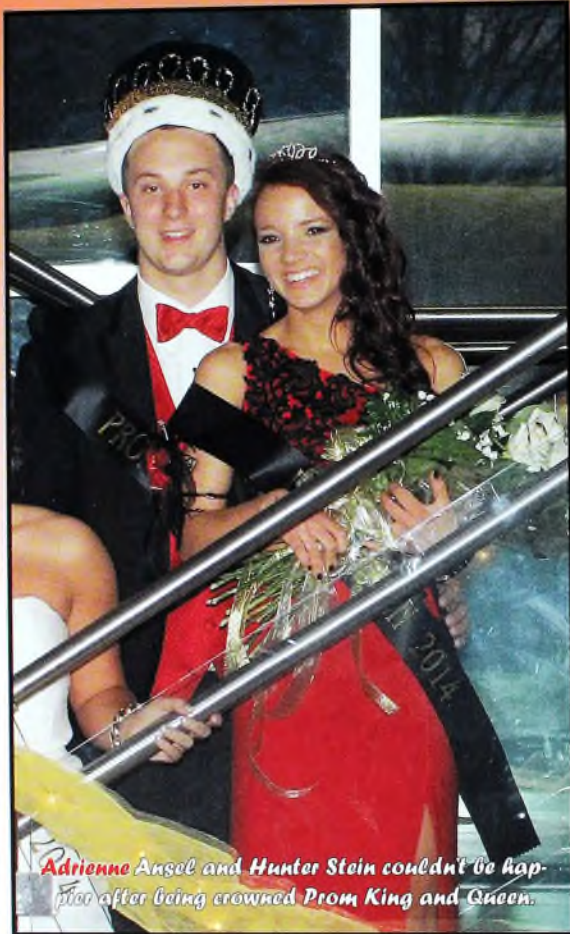

Instant Classic

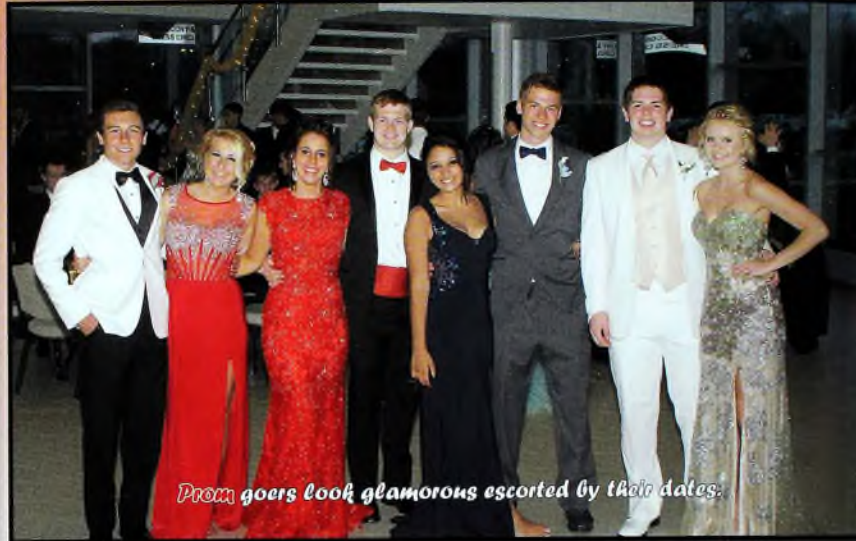

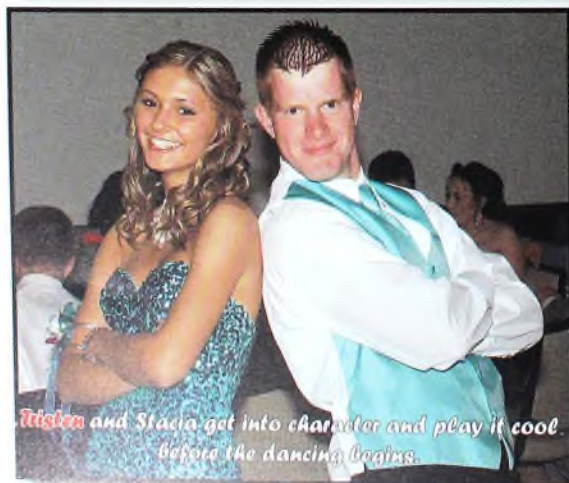

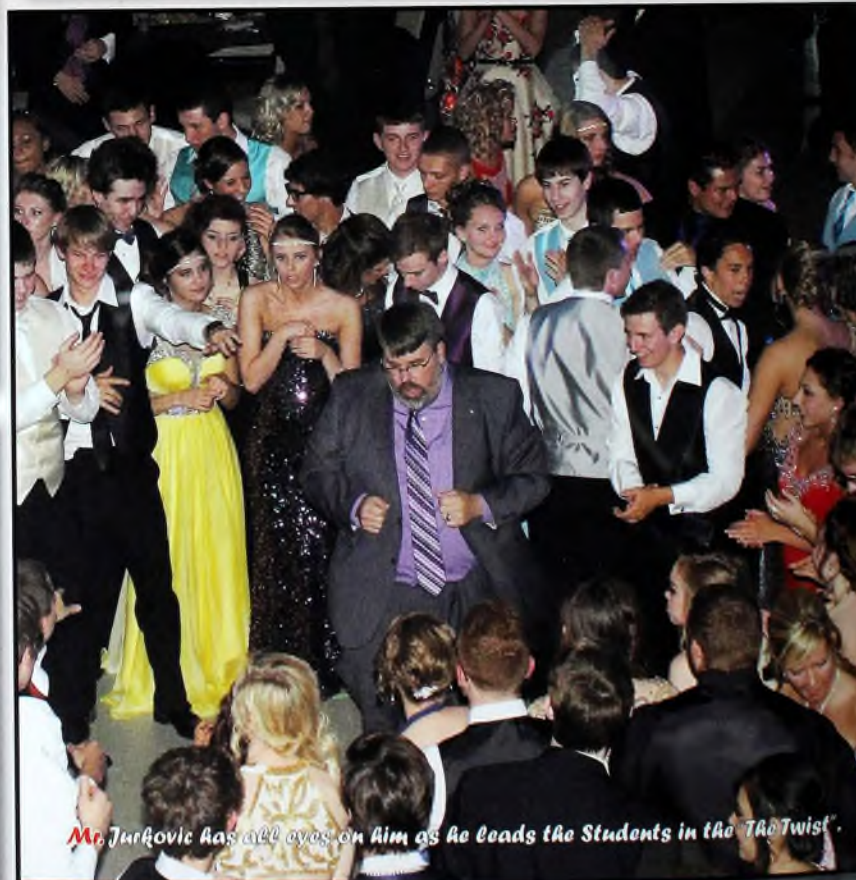

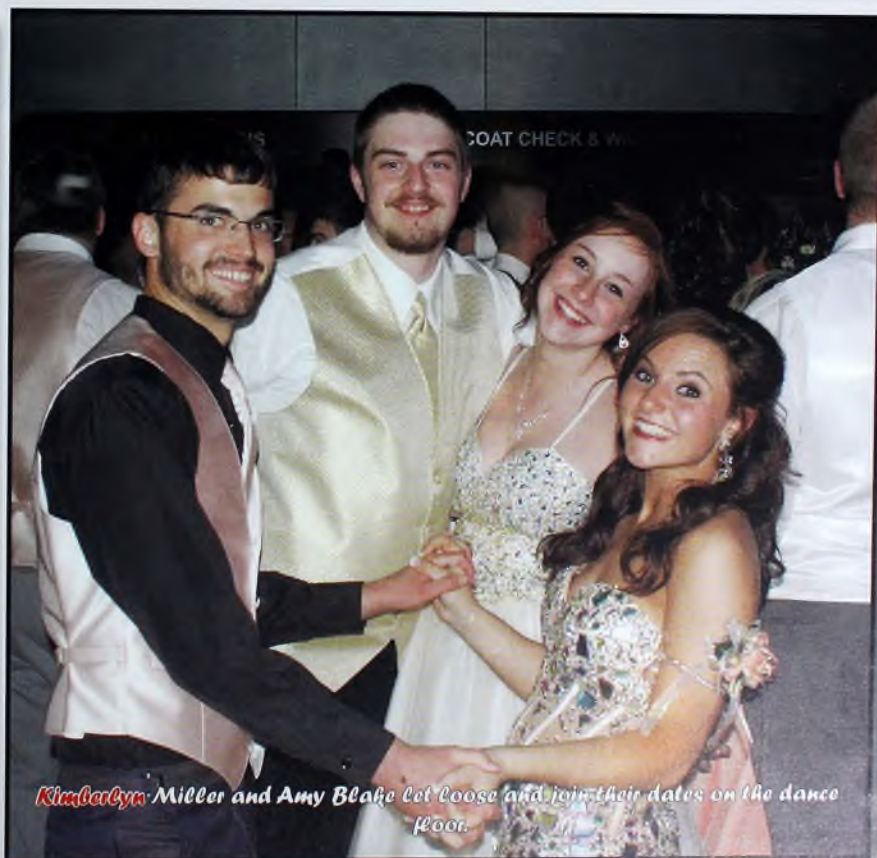

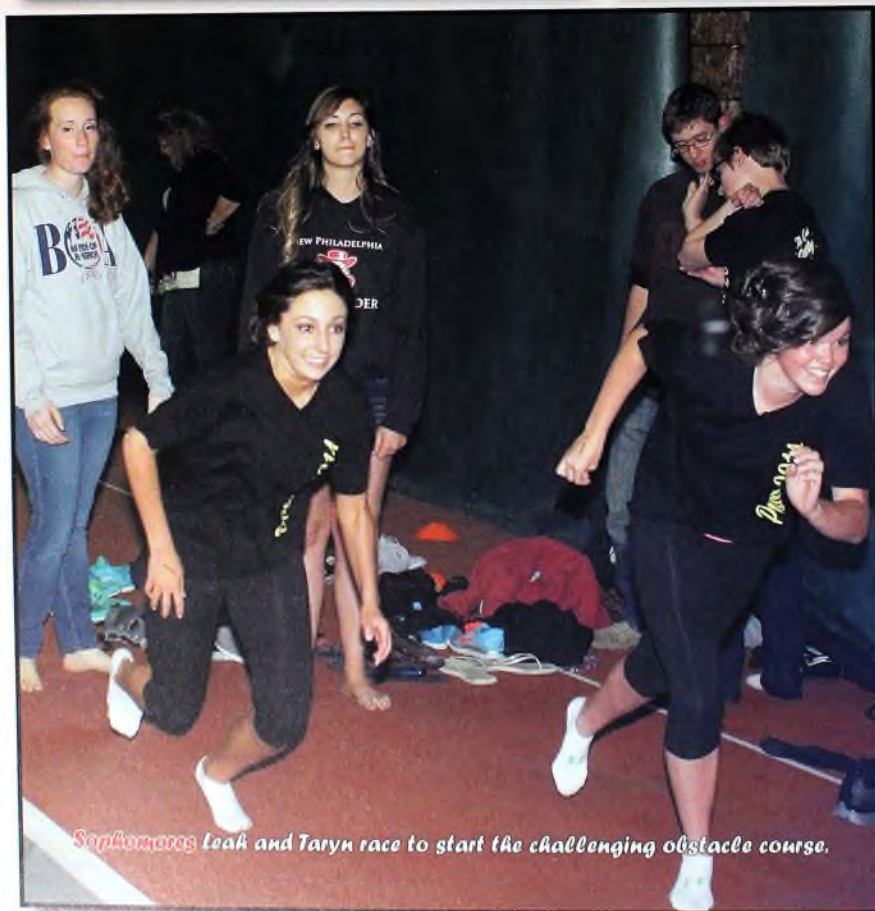

In-Between

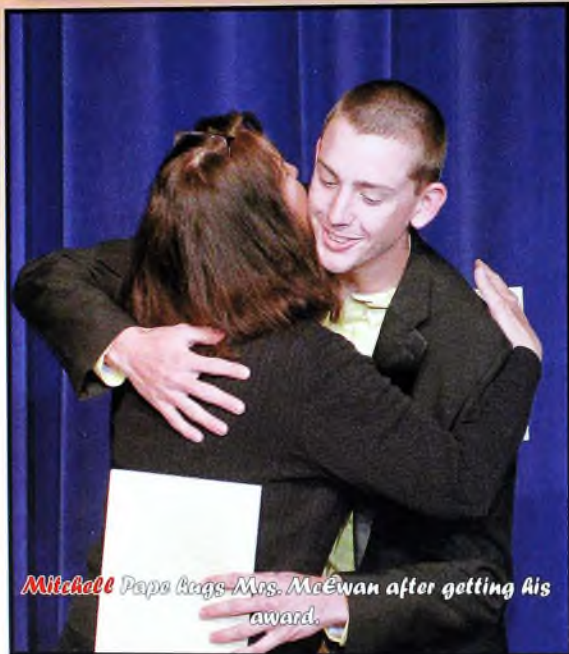

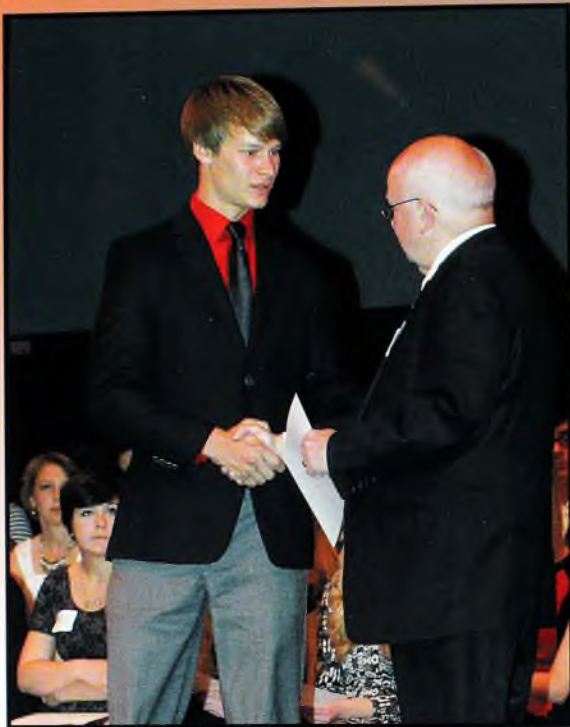
